

ASIA FOOTBALL SHOWCASE

This is the official conduct of behaviour for AFS and associated third parties for: Training, Assessments, Trials and Coaching arranged or provided by Asia Football Showcase ('AFS' and "FAN"). Accordingly, what you do and how you behave reflects not only upon you and your family, but also upon AFS and the facilities, hotel and Thailand at which you are a guest.

Be Punctual: always arrive and be ready at least 20 minutes before the time you are due to report.

Be Polite: respect your trial-mates, coaches, club officials, agents and staff. Shake hands at the end each game.

Be Considerate: keep your room tidy; if you stay in a hotel be considerate of the other guests and staff.

Do Not: cheat, complain, feign injury, waste-time or be guilty of simulation.

Never: use insulting, threatening or abusive language or behaviour, or engage in bullying or intimidation.

Always: play to the best of your ability; play for the team not for yourself; play by the rules and abide by the referee's decisions without argument.

Not under any condition: Speak of or gossip of any AFS, POI, and Ryan Reece business, past or present. Do not comment, mention, review,



remark or give any opinion about AFS dealings in regards to business to any third party which can defame, smear, discredit Ryan Reece or the AFS reputation.

For breaches of the Code of Conduct AFS reserves the right to take full action of the law in which the Terms and Conditions and Signed Waiver can and will be used. The role of you the "Client" of "AFS" accepts and agrees that if you fail to abide by the expected standards of conduct and behaviour, AFS has the right to terminate my programme forthwith without notice or compensation.

If the clients participation is terminated, it is the clients responsibility to organize and pay for any travel, accommodation or other expenses incurred because of such termination.

Further, such breach of the expected standards of conduct and behaviour may result in me being reported to my club and or any national Association for any further disciplinary action that AFS may deem appropriate.

Additionally, you may be required to apologize; you may be given a formal warning as to your future behaviour; you may be substituted or dropped from the program; you may be suspended or you may be dismissed from the program and sent home. You may also face disciplinary proceedings from the governing authorities, including your own Football Association.
