City of Lansing Ordinances

Curfew – Section 650 – “No person twelve years old or under shall be upon or in any public street, highway, alley, park, vacant lot or other public place between 10:00pm and 6:00am” and “no person thirteen through sixteen years old shall be upon or in any public street, highway, alley, park, vacant lot or other public place between 12:00midnight and 6:00am”. There are certain exceptions but if you suspect a curfew violation, please notify the police.

Grass – All premises shall be free of weeds and grass eight inches or more in height. If you fail to do this, the city will hire someone to do it and you will be assessed an administrative fee.

Fireworks – Legally you may only disperse them between 8am and 11pm the day before, the day of and the day after a federal holiday.

Firework Safety Tips

- Only use fireworks from licensed outlets
- Adults should light most fireworks
- Adults should supervise older children using fireworks
- Young children should never handle fireworks
- Light them a safe distance from house and onlookers
- Do not light them in the street
- Do not relight any malfunctioning device
- Do not light in a container
- Never allow horseplay with fireworks
- Keep bucket of water or hose handy just in case of fire
