
Meet Shaundale Johnson | Certified Technical Writer & Freelance Editor


We had the good fortune of connecting with Shaundale Johnson and we've shared our conversation below.


Hi Shaundale, can you walk us through the thought-process of starting your business?

I started editing for a small group of friends and family in 2013 and decided to get certified in 2017 when my former boss started "leaning heavily" on my writing skills at work. After completing my certification at the University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), my clientele doubled, and I now stay booked months in advance.


Because of my love for writing, getting started was fairly easy. Editing was a natural transition; all I need is my laptop and WiFi, and I can literally work from anywhere. Editing affords me the opportunity to meet

people, to write, and to travel—three things I thoroughly enjoy. Balancing my schedule is definitely my biggest challenge because if I could wake, eat, write/edit, sleep, and do it all again daily, I would be in literary heaven.

What I've learned along the way is to make "good" connections. I researched several professional organizations but found Black Editors & Proofreaders to be the most beneficial. Before joining their platform, I didn't consider people actually Google "Black editors." Most of my clients have found me that way. In fact, many of them have decided to work with me because of the transparency of my website (www.ShaundaleRena.com). I used to wonder whether to change the content, but clients would say they could relate to my story. So, if I could pass on one



lesson, it would be #DontCommit2Crazy. That is my mantra. Life throws many curves, but if we lean into them, we might not crash so hard. Deal with whatever is dealing with you, so to speak, and move on... unapologetically.
