THE WEEK

Execution becomes visible

THE MONTH

Variance becomes manageable

THE QUARTER

Capital gets reallocated

THE YEAR

Capability gets built

Most companies run *one* clock — and wonder why effort never becomes results.

Short loops catch drift. Long loops give it direction.

The week corrects the day. The quarter corrects the week. Each horizon checks the one beneath it — so small wins point somewhere, and effort stops leaking.
