


Volunteer of the Year

Heidi's Brooklyn Deli

Entrepreneurship has been ingrained in Heidi's life since the age of 5 when she watched her mom open a fabric shop. During college Heidi also worked in the restaurant industry. After graduating, she and her soon to be husband Steve, moved back to Bay Ridge, Brooklyn where they enjoyed the culture, people and of course the food. When they moved to Denver they chose the North Side because it reminded them of Bay Ridge. The only thing missing was good deli food. The merchant district at 32nd and Lowell was barely occupied, so in 1994, 'Heidi's Bagels and Ice Cream' was born. The restaurant was expanded to become Heidi's Brooklyn Deli in 1997. By 2004, Heidi and Steve had expanded to opening 5 Heidi's Brooklyn Deli locations and the idea for franchising took hold. Now, eighteen years later, Heidi's Brooklyn Deli has 13 stores spread across six states with two new stores in development for the Denver Metro area and a second location in Las Vegas. Still an entrepreneur, Heidi now works alongside her two daughters and looks forward to all that is to come for Naples Franchising Systems, Inc. and the Heidi's Brooklyn Deli brand.



FASTSIGNS

FASTSIGNS of Englewood was first opened in 1996, with Matt and Barb Metcalf taking over ownership in August 1997. Through their leadership, the Metcalfs grew the business from a small banner and vinyl decal shop to a trusted community resource for all things signs, graphics, and installation that consistently ranks in the top tiers of the FASTSIGNS franchise organization. In April of 2013, Matt's daughter, Larissa, and her husband, Daniel, joined the FASTSIGNS Englewood team. After learning the business from the ground up, Daniel and Larissa took over ownership in January of 2020. FASTSIGNS Englewood provides a wide range of sign and visual graphics; banners and decals, vehicle wraps, lobby signs, and channel letters. They enjoy the challenge of finding custom solutions for their customers. Larissa and Matt's Italian roots come through Matt's mother's family. Matt's grandmother, Clarina "Clara" Bianco, and his grandfather, Gaetano "Guy" Rocco, both immigrated to the United States with their families when they were children in the early 1900s.





Monster Tree Service

Mike and Renee Barnes own and operate Monster Tree Service of Southwest Denver. Mike retired from his 37 year corporate career focused on a business plan with an employee/client centric culture as the cornerstone. As of February 2023, Monster Tree Service of Southwest Denver has over Four Hundred 5-Star Reviews on Google, which is an anomaly in the industry. Mike and his employees believe it is the culture that drives this success. Renee always helped with the business, answering phones and performing various office functions, but it wasn't until 2022 that she retired from the Jeffco School system and became a full-time employee working alongside Mike. Monster Tree Service of Southwest Denver specializes in everything "trees and shrubs." The business has experienced 50%+ growth year over year since its 2019 inception. Mike was the first Denver area franchise, but three more franchises have been established since, including North Denver, Southeast Denver and Greater Boulder, Mike and Renee joined IABA shortly after establishing their business and value the connections they have made through IABA.

This was all Jerry and Karen needed to hear, and from here, Caruso Family Charities was started! Jerry is also the founder of Caruso Kitchens in Lakewood, CO, which he began in 1983. Jerry's oldest son, Jared, now owns Caruso Kitchens which allows Jerry more time to focus on Caruso Family Charities. Jerry's daughter Andrea plays a major role in helping CFC move forward to help as many families as possible. CFC has donated more than 3 million dollars to more than 1200 families since 2006. Jerry's service attitude was instilled in him at an early age from his parents who were always helping anyone who came to their door as well as being very active in the Italian community and Mt. Carmel Church. Jerry is also very active in his community and is a dedicated father and grandfather. Just like his parents, his greatest joy continues to come from helping families in need.



Dr. J. L. Gerardi, a native of Colorado, was born and raised in Trinidad. Dr. Jess Gerardi received his A. B. degree from the University of Northern Colorado, His M. A. degree from U C L A, and his Doctor of Philosophy in music education from the University of Colorado. Dr. Gerardi served as band and orchestra director for the Englewood Public Schools from 1963 to 1988. His famous "Pirate" marching band appeared nationwide, including two trips to the Portland Rose Festival where they won the sweepstakes trophy both times, and two unprecedented trips to march in the famed Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade. He taught for two years in Durango and was the assistant principal at Flood Middle School from 1990 to 1993. Dr. Gerardi also served as the Director of Entertainment for the Denver Broncos Football Club and Director of the Denver Broncos Band from 1968 to 1998. He served as a member of the CBA Board, and assisted with the state marching band contests for 22 years. He directed and played trombone in many professional bands in the Denver area. Dr. Gerardi has received numerous honors and awards in his career including the coveted "Citation of Excellence" award from the National Band Association.





Dr. John Giardino has served the Italian American community of Denver for the last thirty years. He became a member of the Dante Alighieri Society of Denver in 1992 and joined the Board of Directors in 2006 as Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, where he oversaw the judging and awarding of scholarships to university students wishing to study in Italy. John successfully increased the number of scholarships awarded and the money available through many fund-raising efforts. He became President of the Dante Alighieri Society of Denver in 2019 and is currently serving in that position. As President, he actively serves on all committees of the Society. Under his leadership, the Society has sponsored many activities to promote Italian Heritage Month during October 2019-2022. He has established a working relationship with the Italian Consulate of Chicago, the Italian Cultural Institute of Chicago, and the Denver office of the Honorary Vice-Consul of Italy. He is an active member of the Italian American Business Association and has promoted cooperation between the DAS and the IABA. John and all of his family members have made the promotion of Italian Culture in Colorado the centerpiece in their lives.



Lisa Lokken has been a member of Potenza Lodge since she turned eighteen, and has held many board positions and committee positions over the years. She is currently the Ladies Auxiliary President. Richie's ancestry can be traced back to the Calabria region of southern Italy, where his cousins still reside in a small town named Spezzano Piccolo. His grandparents Riccardo Cozzolino (Richie's namesake) and Antonietta immigrated via Ellis Island in the 1940's. Richie hails from St. Clair Shores, Michigan. He attended Michigan State University and graduated with a journalism degree in 2015. His passion for sports and desire to tell the community's stories landed him at CBS Denver as Sports Reporter, Producer, and Anchor. He has traveled across the country covering the Denver Broncos, as well as following playoff runs from the Nuggets and Rockies. He was a member of CBS Denver's live coverage of the Avalanche's Stanley Cup Championship and parade in 2022. His reporting earned him a Colorado Broadcasters Association award in 2019.



Chad (Molinaro) Povich found his love of baseball at age five. His baseball career blossomed in high school and upon graduation in 2004, he received a full ride baseball scholarship.
