On Saturday, June 21, 2025, several members of CKC attended this year's LWVIL 2025 Convention. Most as delegates, some as observers, all as representative of our chapter, one of 42 in attendance.

The Congresswoman spoke to League members frankly, calling our current situation a full blown five-alarm fire and Constitutional Crisis.

She acknowledged the protests and the sheer number of people involved across America, but asked us to join her in: getting dark money out of politics; ethics reform in the courts; honest redistricting; and protecting voting rights as a start. Following the Congresswoman, we got down to the business we had gathered to do.

The morning session began with a review of changes to our LWVIL Bylaws which included the requisite Motions and Discussions.

We reviewed proposed adoption of "programs" based on local league input.

For those who participated in our January Program Planning, this is where the information we discussed; the State programs we agreed/disagreed with and/or set as priorities came into play. Interestingly, of the 40+ local leagues in Illinois, only 17 participated in this aspect. As such, the input of those 17 leagues drives the State programs.



Lunch break gave everyone a moment to refuel; visit with old friends and meet new ones. Without being a pep rally, the Convention renewed enthusiasm and refined our direction.

The afternoon session finalized the morning's work:

- Formalizing amendments to our State bylaws
- Electing our 2025-2027 Officers
- Confirming our Programs.
