

Environment Committee Update

The Tri-Cities Clean Energy team continues to work on conversations with the City Council.

The City of St Charles and IMEA:

The City is still planning to fast-track the early renewal of their electric energy contract with IMEA (Illinois Municipal Energy Association). In the age of Climate Crisis, this will leave tied to coal fired power plants until 2055 for 90% of their electricity need. The 20 year contract extension is a proposal from IMEA, not from the City. IMEA has given the City 14 months to discuss the contract. But the City has decided to settle the matter in 3 months.

The current contract does not end until 2035 at the earliest and could run to 2040 if desired. It is a serious question to ask -what is the rush? There have been Tri City members speaking during the Public Comment section of the last few City Council meetings asking the Council to not vote for an early renewal of the contract now and to hold open meetings with public engagement.

<u>The City of Geneva</u> has agreed to spend almost \$140,000 on a study to understand the options available for utility scale solar, battery storage and carbon offsets. The Report is due soon.


The City of Batavia: no update at this time.
