Legislative Interviews

On Friday, April 26 as part of the League annual Legislative Interview process, Sandy Kaptain from the Elgin Area League and Kelly Rotella, Bill Koehl, Ruth Kuzmanic and Patti Lackman (CKC) met with Senator Don DeWItte and his Chief of Staff, Becky Gillam, in his St. Charles office.



During the interview, there was discussion surrounding questions from the LWVIL Issues and Advocacy team. The discussion included the topics of Education Funding (child tax credit and guaranteed income), Gun Violence Prevention, and the environment (rural cooperatives and municipal power agency transparency).

The Legislative Interview process is a way for local Leagues to establish lines of communication and goodwill with our elected officials other than in a candidate forum setting.



Guest Speaker: Joe Zeman, Social Studies teacher at West Chicago High School currently teaching American History, Criminal Justice, and Sociology.



Mr. Zeman received a B.A. in History from Elmhurst College and recently earned an M.A. in History from Roosevelt University.

Mr. Zeman's presentation explores how the societal changes in the United States during the early twentieth-century influenced the origins of The League of Women Voters. By analyzing shifting ideologies regarding gender and citizenship, this lecture explains the nature of the organization's non-partisanship.

The history presented encourages us to reconsider the ways the League of Women Voters is relevant today as well as rethink its role as a conduit for suffragist political thought in American society.



During our January Program Planning event, we established a Migrant Committee who will host immigration attorney, Sarah Dady, for a presentation on Migrants. Details forthcoming.
