POLI 391 – THE FOUNDATIONS OF LAW AND GOVERNMENT STUDY ABROAD IN EUROPE APPLICATION UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA

The class, POLI 391, is a Summer course that will be given from June 2-14, 2026, in London, England and Edinburgh, Scotland. An email will be sent after receiving the necessary items of the completed application and deposit to notify the student that they have been accepted into the course. To apply you must have at least a 3.0 GPA (for freshmen your high school GPA is sufficient) and be in good standing with the University. This application does not mean you are enrolled in the class. You must sign up on MyUSC in order to attend the class and be eligible for the trip.

The total program fee is \$5,145, not including course tuition (3 credits). This application, all forms, and a \$350 application fee (which will be applied to the total program free if you are accepted into the course) must be submitted to Wende Miller, Business Manager for the Department of Political Science by November 21, 2025, at 4:00 pm in order to be considered for the course. Checks (made payable to the University of South Carolina) are preferred though cash is acceptable. The remainder may be paid in 2 installments (first payment of \$2,573 by January 16, 2026 and second payment of \$2,222 by February 20, 2026). Students can also pay the total amount at any time. Refunds for this trip will not be made after the January 16th deadline.
