



# Disabled American Veterans

NOTE: Currently the Federal Government is in a shutdown. This shutdown has closed the VA Regional Office in Louisville and consequently has our DAV NSO Officers staying at home unable to file any of our claims through VA. I will notify all our service officers with any changes to the current government status.

At the Service Officer training this year we had over 80+ in attendance. It was a comprehensive course this year with several new things to learn. The CMS system is all digital and requires service officers to do a lot of keyboarding. Just take your time in adjusting to the system. Know your VA forms and the rest will just take adjusting to. Your NSO's and I are here for you. **Hello, my fellow veterans,**

We've all felt the frustration when trying to recruit our younger veterans—typically those aged 18 to 40. I firmly believe they won't come into our ranks until we align with them.

How many times have you asked a younger veteran to join, only to hear, "*I'm not disabled*"? That response says a lot.

As veterans, many of us are resistant to labels that suggest weakness or dependency. The younger generation simply doesn't identify themselves as "disabled." And truthfully, they don't see the DAV as representing who they are.

We need to take a step back and ask: **What does a Disabled American Veteran look like today?**

Today's younger veterans are often highly engaged with their families, careers, and hobbies. They were raised differently than we were. They grew up with cell phones in their hands and do 90% of their work on computers—not pen and paper.

So, how do we reach them?

Think about this: our communities are filled with all kinds of organizations—clubs, associations, churches, and societies. I'm a proud member of the Green River Archaeological Society, the B&K Bass Club, and most importantly, the Disabled American Veterans.

If I asked you to join the Archaeological Society, chances are you wouldn't—because it doesn't reflect your interests or identity.

**This is exactly how younger veterans view the DAV.**

That's why we need to change the way we're perceived. Let's host events that interest *them*. It doesn't have to be complicated. One of the easiest ways to connect is through something we all love: **food**.

Winter is coming—how about a chili cook-off? Or a simple meal at our meetings? Breaking bread builds bonds. Let's create an Activities Committee focused solely on planning things that are *fun*. We're not just holding meetings—we're building a community.

**We are shifting the narrative.**

This is your DAV.

We are evolving.

And **you belong here.**





Dear Department of Kentucky,

Thank you for submitting resolutions for consideration at the 2025 DAV and Auxiliary National Convention in Las Vegas. Resolutions adopted at the convention determine our national legislative agenda and are in effect until the next national convention. These resolutions reflect the collective will of DAV members and serve as a guide for policy decisions and advocacy efforts on behalf of our nation’s ill and injured veterans, their families and their caregivers.

For resolutions received from your department, below describes their final disposition, of which there are three possibilities:

- Adopted
- Rejected as duplicate
- Rejected

Only one resolution is adopted on a specific issue; therefore, duplicate or similar resolutions received from other departments would necessarily be rejected as a duplicate. Nonetheless, the fact that we often receive multiple resolutions on a particular subject reflects its importance among DAV members. If you have a question about the disposition of any resolution, please call the National Legislative Department at 202-554-3501.

If you submitted resolutions in support of an individual for national office, that resolution was considered by the Committee on the Nomination of National Officers but not adopted or rejected, as is the case for other resolutions. A resolution can be rejected for a number of reasons, but the most common is that the issue or action is outside the scope of the DAV Statement of Policy or the requested action is a local matter or related to a state-specific issue such as state property tax exemption for service-connected disabled veterans. Resolutions pertaining to the administration of the national organization are referred to the attention of the appropriate department head for consideration.

We greatly appreciate your department’s participation in the resolution process, as it is integral to DAV’s legislative program and our ability to take action or a formal position on specific issues on behalf of DAV members.
