10.15 a.m.—Landing.

Salute of 21 guns from Castle Cornet as Their Majesties leave the Royal Yacht.

The Royal Party will land at the Connaught Slip and will be received with a Royal Salute by the Guard of Honour (1st Battn. Royal Irish Regiment), the Band of Ex-Service men playing the National Anthem.

At the Quay the following will meet Their Majesties.

The Lieut.-Governor will hand the key of Fort George to His Majesty.

Their Majesties will then be received by the Lieut.-Governor, Lady and Miss Capper.

The Lieutenant-Governor will present the Bailiff, Mrs. and Miss Ozanne, and the Government Secretary.

Bouquets will be presented to Her Majesty by Miss Capper and to Her Royal Highness by Miss Ozanne.

The Staff and Departmental Officers and the Crown Officers will be drawn up in line.

Their Majesties and the Princess will walk down the line, the Military Officers being presented by the Lieut.-Governor, and the Crown Officers by the Bailiff.

His Majesty will then inspect the Guard of Honour.

Inspection of Ex-Service Men and Women.

His Majesty the King, accompanied by the Queen and Princess Mary, will inspect the ex-service men and women, who will be formed up along the West and South sides of the Albert Dock, as far as possible in the Units in which they served, disabled men nearest the landing point.

The Royal Party will walk between the lines. On reaching the end of the lines near the pool, the Royal Party will enter their motor cars and drive slowly back between the lines of ex-service men and women, who will kindly keep their places and so guard the route.

A special enclosure near the landing place will be provided for the parents, widows and children of those who gave their lives for their Country.

The Band of ex-service men will play selections of airs during the inspection.

11.0 a.m.—Visit to St. Peter-Port Church.

The Royal Party will visit the Town Church, being received by The Very Rev. J. B. V. Penfold, Dean of Guernsey, and the Revs. E. F. P. Colman, M.A., and P. S. Mesny, M.A., Vice-Deans. They will enter by the West door and leave by the North door.

The St. Peter-Port Cadet Company will line the approach to the Church. Cars will be drawn up at the North door. There will be a peal of bells as the Royal Party leaves the church.

11.10 a.m.—Visit to St. George's Hall.

The Royal Party will proceed to St. George's Hall via High Street, Smith Street, Ann's Place, St. Julian's Avenue and the Esplanade.

11.20 a.m.

At the street entrance to St. George's Hall, the Royal Party will be received by His Majesty's Sheriff, Mr. H. J. Blampied (the Court Ushers being in attendance).

The Sheriff will conduct Their Majesties to the entrance of the Hall, where the States of Guernsey, together with the representatives of the States of Alderney and the Chief Pleas of Sark, will be assembled to receive the Royal Party.

At the entrance to the Hall, His Majesty's Sheriff will announce Their Majesties and Her Royal Highness, The Princess, in French.

After the Announcement the National Anthem will be sung by the Guille-Allès Choir.

Their Majesties, preceded by His Majesty's Sheriff, and followed by the Suite, will proceed to the Dais. Their Majesties and the Princess will mount the centre steps, the Suite proceeding to their places by the side steps.

Addresses and Replies.

His Majesty will be asked by the Lieut.-Governor if he will be pleased to receive addresses from His Loyal Subjects of Guernsey, Alderney and Sark, and from the numerous French Colony dwelling in the Bailiwick, and will give his assent.

The Lieut.-Governor will call on the following gentlemen to present addresses:—

E. Chepmell Ozanne, Esq., Bailiff of Guernsey, will read the address from the States and people of Guernsey and present it to His Majesty.

His Majesty will read his reply, which will be received by the Bailiff.

Major Robert Mellish, Judge of Alderney, will present an address from the States and people of Alderney, and will receive His Majesty's reply.

William Collings, Esq., Seigneur of Serk, will present an address from the Chief Pleas and people of Serk, and will receive His Majesty's reply.

Baron de Coudenhove, French Consular Agent, will present an address from the French Colony of the Bailiwick and will receive His Majesty's reply.

Fief Holders.

His Majesty will be asked by the Bailiff if he will be pleased to receive the homage and dues from those holders of Royal fiefs in the Bailiwick who owe him faith, homage and dues.

On His Majesty expressing assent, the following will be called in turn by the Greffier of the States of Guernsey to do faith and homage to His Majesty for their fiefs in accordance with ancient custom:—

Sir Havilland de Saumarez for the fief of Saumarez.

H. O. de Baugy, Esq., for the fief of Bruneaux, St. Martin's.

T. H. Henry, Esq., for the fief of Henri de Vaugravat.

Rev. H. G. de C. Stevens Guille for the fiefs of Cannery and Fantosme.

They will mount the Dais by the steps to the right of His Majesty.

Each fief holder will be conducted to the Royal Presence by the Lieut.-Governor and the Bailiff, and after doing homage in the prescribed form will retire by the steps on the right hand side.

William Collings, Esq., will be called by the Government Secretary to do homage for the fief of Serk.

Dues.

Dame Mary Rougier will be called by the Greffier and will present to His Majesty a pair of Gilt Spurs for the fief of Les Eperons.

HIS MAJESTY will present decorations awarded for Service during the GREAT WAR, to the following retired officers:—

Brigadier-General Sir ERIC J. E. SWAYNE, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.B.E.

The Insignia of a Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire.

Lieut.-Colonel M. F. HARDING, C.M.G., late 69th Punjabis.

The Insignia of a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George.

On the conclusion of these ceremonies the Royal Party will leave St. George's Hall, being conducted to the entrance of the Hall by the Bailiff and thence to the Royal cars by the Sheriff. The Suite will follow the Royal Party from the Hall. The Bailiff and Sheriff will here join the Party.

11.45 a.m.

The Royal Party will leave St. George's Hall and proceed to Cambridge Park via Esplanade, St. Julian's Avenue, College Street, Grange, Doyle Road and Brock Road.

11.55 a.m.—Assembly of Town Children.

The Royal Party will arrive at Cambridge Park and will see an assembly of about 3,500 children of St. Peter-Port, including the pupils of the Ladies' College.

The entrance to Cambridge Park will be lined by the fatherless daughters of those who have fallen in the War.

Bouquets will be presented by two of them to Her Majesty the Queen and H.R.H. Princess Mary.

The children will sing the National Anthem as the Royal Party arrives at the end of the line of fatherless children, where Their Majesties will be met by the President and Members of the Education Committee.

The Rev. G. Whitley, President St. Peter-Port Education Committee, will be presented to their Majesties by the Bailiff.

The Royal Party will walk round the lines of children, leaving again by the same entrance.

12.10 a.m.

The Royal Party will leave Cambridge Park and drive via Candie Road, College Street to Elizabeth College.

12.15 p.m.—Visit to Elizabeth College.

The Royal Party will arrive at Elizabeth College, where the Directors, Principal, Masters and Students will be assembled.

The Very Rev. J. B. V. Penfold, B.D., Chairman of the Board of Directors, will receive Their Majesties, the Principal, Rev. Wm. C. Penney, M.A., being presented by the Bailiff.

Their Majesties the King and Queen will inspect the Guard of Honour, Officers' Training Corps, and will see the Students; meanwhile Her Royal Highness, Princess Mary, will inspect the Girl Guides in the College Grounds.

The President, Lady Carey, and the Island Commissioner, Mrs. A. W. Bell, will be presented to Her Royal Highness by Mrs. E. C. Ozanne.

12.25 p.m.

The Royal Party will leave Elizabeth College and proceed via the Grange, Queen's Road, Prince Albert Road, Colborne Road and Fort Road, to the Doyle Column.

12.35 p.m.—Island Scenery.

The Royal Party will arrive at the Doyle Column, where they will alight to see the view across Harbour to St. Sampson's and the Islands of the Bailiwick, then walk across to a point over Petit Port to see the beautiful view across the Bay of Moulin Huet.

1.0 p.m.

The Royal Party will leave Doyle Column for the Lieut.-Governor's Residence.

1.5 p.m.

The Royal Party will have luncheon with the Lieut.-Governor.

2.0 p.m.

Their Majesties will be present in the garden of the Lieut.-Governor's house, where a number of prominent citizens will be invited to assemble.

2.15 p.m.—Tour of the Island.

The Royal Party will leave the Lieut.-Governor's house and proceed to Petit Bot via La Villette, seeing St. Martin's children near Rectory, along Rue Maze.

2.30 p.m.—Island Scenery.

The Royal Party will arrive at Petit Bot and stay 10 minutes, to see the view of cliffs from the sea level.

2.40 p.m.

The Royal Party will leave Petit Bot and drive via Forest to Les Islets Arsenal, seeing Forest and St. Andrew's children near Milestone House, just past Forest Church; and St. Peter's and Torteval children near St. Peter's Church.

2.50 p.m.—Show of Cattle.

The Royal Party will arrive at Les Islets Arsenal, being received by the President and Committee of the Royal Guernsey Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

The President, Mr. O. Priaulx, will be presented to Their Majesties and Her Royal Highness by the Lieut.-Governor.

A selection of the best Cattle on the Island will be collected here for Their Majesties' inspection.

His Majesty will then present the King's Cups for 1921. (These Cups are awarded annually to the holders of the best cattle in Guernsey, Alderney and Sark).

His Majesty will then accept a Guernsey cow presented by the Royal Guernsey Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

3.10 p.m.

The Royal Party will leave Les Islets Arsenal and drive via St. Saviour's, seeing children near Parish Schools, to

3.25 p.m.

Perelle Bay, thence follow West Coast Road, seeing Castel children at Vazon Road, Albecq, to

3.50 p.m.

Vale Church, thence via Lancresse Common, seeing Vale children at Lancresse near Golf Club House, to

4.0. p.m.

Mr. Bichard's greenhouses, where the Royal Party will be received by the President and Committee of the Guernsey Growers' Association.

The President, Mr. E. T. Wheadon, and Messrs. A. N. and H. Bichard, will be presented to Their Majesties and Her Royal Highness by the Bailiff, and will be conducted by them through the Vineries and Tomato Houses.

The Royal Party will then have tea with the Bailiff.

The Hereditary 3rd Cup Bearer will provide Cups for the use of His Majesty the King and Her Majesty the Queen, and he and Dame Annie de Saumarez, G.B.E., will personally perform their duties of handing the Cups to Their Majesties.

4.25 p.m.

The Royal Party will leave the Vineries and drive via St. Sampson's harbour, thence through Delancey Park, where the children of St. Sampson's will be assembled.

4.50 p.m.—Return to Royal Yacht

The Royal Party will arrive at No. 3, Berth, White Rock, being received by the Guard of Honour (Royal Irish Regiment), who will give a Royal Salute, the Band of ex-service men playing the National Anthem as the Royal Party embarks.

There will be in attendance the Royal Court of Guernsey and Military Staff Officers.

The Royal Party will then return to the Royal Yacht, a salute of 21 guns being fired from Castle Cornet as the pinnace leaves the moorings.

NOTE.—The times given are approximate only, and the Royal Party may be either a little before or a little behind the scheduled time.
