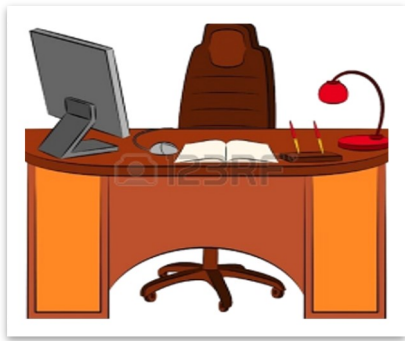
People who generate this inner sunshine make life more pleasant for those around them. Their impulses lead to correct action; their thoughts are usually true. They have their roots in some deep shining faith.

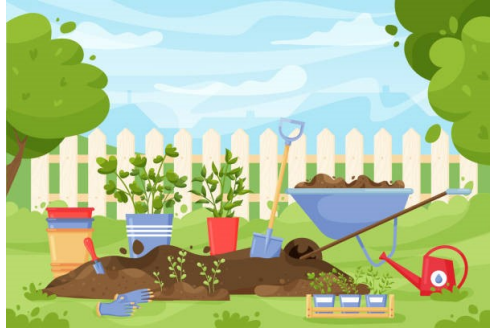


Join the Bingo Players on Monday Nights

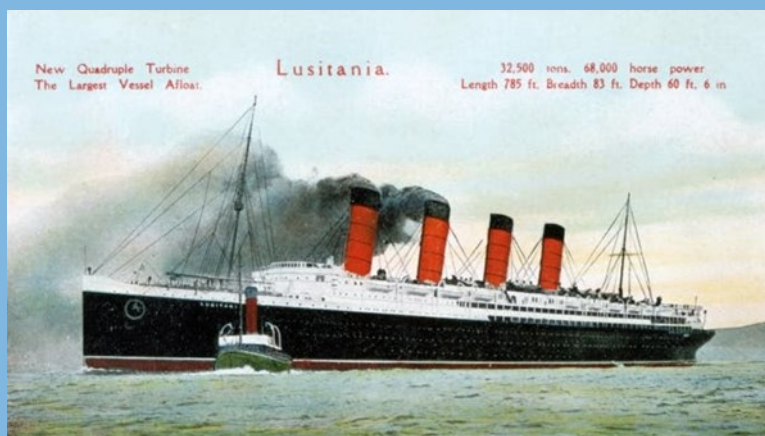


Blast from the Past

Most of us know about the fate of the Titanic either from history or from the 1997 movie. But why does it get more attention than the British registered “Lusitania” known as one of the “Greyhounds of the Seas?” Lusitania and its sister ship, Mauretania, were launched in 1906 and were the fastest passenger liners of their age, capable of crossing the Atlantic Ocean in less than five days. They were the world’s largest ocean liners until 1910 when the Olympic was launched, followed by the Titanic in 1911. The Lusitania was on its return leg of its 101st roundtrip voyage across the Atlantic when it was sunk by an Imperial German U Boat on May 7, 1915. There were over 1900 passengers and crew members on the ship. The ship carried many wealthy and prominent passengers including millionaire heir Alfred Vanderbilt, Broadway producer Charles Frohman and actress Rita Jolivet. An art collector named Hugh Lane was onboard and was rumored to be taking Rembrandt and Monet paintings with him. More than 1100 perished including 120 Americans when the ship went down in 18 minutes after being torpedoed.

When World War I erupted in 1914, President Woodrow Wilson pledged neutrality for the United States. But that would not last as tensions arose between the U. S. and Germany after Germany’s attempts to quarantine the British Isles. By German mines, U.S. ships were damaged or sunk while traveling to Britain. In February 1915, German naval commanders suspected British ships were being loaded not only with passengers, but weapons and supplies being sent from the U.S. to Europe. Thus, Germany declared unrestricted submarine warfare in the waters around Britain. It turned out after secret documents and evidence gathered at the wreck site were found, the Lusitania did have millions of rounds of rifle ammunition, shrapnel shells and non-explosive fuses hidden in the cargo hold.

The sinking of the Lusitania played a significant role in turning public opinion against Germany, both in the United States and abroad. But it was almost two years before the U.S. would enter the war.
