





Moira age 5 ½ says she "doesn't like having CP (cerebral palsy) because I can't stand by myself." But there are so many things she can do! Moira loves to pop wheelchair wheelies in the airport and to walk fast and then pick up her feet and glide in her walker. And she loves visiting the library!

The past year has been spent preparing for Moira to begin kindergarten this fall. Ready for kindergarten means a lot of different things. For many of the families the Therapy Program serves, it brings additional meanings beyond what most families experience.

Planning for some of this new adventure needs to start early. Moira was no exception. She typically walks using a walker, however the physical demands of navigating the classroom, and the school building, and the playground are too much without a wheelchair.

Moira was able to borrow and try several different chairs from the Elks equipment lending shed to determine what would be best to order for her. Ordering the right piece of equipment required input from many different professionals and the consideration of different perspectives. This team included her school OT and PT, her teacher, the School District transportation department, and the wheelchair vendor and of course her Elks therapist. Things to consider: Color - That was a given. It had to be Pink. Rigid or folding frame? Will it fit in the car? What is required so Moira can ride the school bus? (Hint: more than you might think!) Moira's family is so thankful that the Elks therapist was there to help them navigate their journey and help them determine what to order.

Asked recently if she is ready for school to start, Moira gives a glance that says it is not time YET and states matter-of-factly that school starts in the fall. She continues, "I'm kind of glad I have cerebral palsy. If I didn't, I couldn't do tricks in my walker! " Moira is ready for EVERYTHING kindergarten. The real question is -- Will kindergarten be ready for Moira?

#### **Blast from the Past**

#### The Big Yellow Bus!

Remember those days of youth when you rode a bright yellow school bus? Depending on your thoughts of school you may have loved or hated to see that bus coming down the road to pick you up.

As many of us probably rode one of the bright yellow Blue Bird buses, let's delve into a small part of its history. The first Blue Bird bus was created in 1925, with the Blue Bird Body Company being founded in 1932. The company was based in Fort Valley, Georgia. The factory still remains in Fort Valley today despite after almost six decades and many ownership changes.

Albert Luce, Sr. built his first bus by mounting a wood body to a Ford truck frame. The poor wood body did not do well on the Georgia roads, so Luce then applied a steel framework under the wood body and built the first Blue Bird bus on the frame of a 1927 Ford Model T. Blue Bird bus No. 1 is the oldest surviving school bus in the country. In 2008 No. 1 was donated to the Henry Ford Museum, marking the 100th anniversary of the Model T Ford and the 80th anniversary of the bus's construction.





After sales of several Blue Bird buses, and the decline of automobile sales during the depression, Luce sold his two Ford dealerships to concentrate on building buses.

During a 1939 conference, the engineers at Blue Bird contributed to the color choice of bright yellow for the school buses. The same yellow is used today. One certainly cannot miss a bright yellow bus coming down the road. By the 1940s the sight of Blue Bird buses were seen in other states across the southern U.S. Following the start of WWII school bus production stopped, and instead Blue Bird built buses for the Navy. They also built ambulance buses that had room for four stretchers. (One can sometimes still see the military Blue Bird buses on the road, but they are blue, not yellow!)

Following WWII, the one room schoolhouses began to be phased out and replaced with centralized schools. As walking to school was often no longer an option, buses were more in demand. The baby boom that occurred when solders returned home also meant more buses would be needed in the near future.

In 1950, Luce retired from the daily operations of Blue Bird and his three sons took over. Buses started to be exported to Central America and South America to ensure demand for the buses that keep the factory busy. In the late 1950s and early 1960s, the Luce brothers added several production facilities as they were now the fourth -largest builder of school buses in the U.S. They also introduced their company slogan "Your Children's Safety is Our Business" which appeared in ads and inside the buses into the 1990s. (I don't remember seeing this slogan, do you?)

During the 1970s, the design of small school buses brought about the Micro Bird that introduced key features used by van-based buses today. The "Handy Bus" option package was created that allowed a side door, a wheelchair lift, and onboard wheelchair accommodations.

Blue Bird became the highest-volume school bus manufacturer in the U.S. But, by the early 1980s, the baby boom generation was done with their secondary education, which leveled off the student population growth. Due to turmoil in the school bus manufacturing business, three of the six largest school bus manufacturers (Carpenter, Superior, and Ward) filed for bankruptcy.

In the 1990s Blue Bird looked into ways of reducing the environmental impact of buses. The first school bus powered by compressed natural gas was developed by Blue Bird in collaboration with John Deere. The company was the first school bus manufacturer to develop a battery powered bus in 1994 in collaboration with Westinghouse Electronic Systems.

Over the years, following sales of the whole company, large amounts of stock, consolidations, closing of factories, the BIG YELLOW BUS continues to grace our roads and transport children.



#### **Scholarship Committee Reports**

Tacoma Elks Lodge #174 has awarded to Tacoma area students forty-three (43) \$1000 scholarships.

Twenty-three (23) of these awards are scholarship renewals--after receiving an initial award, a student is eligible to renew for three consecutive years. Twenty (20) of the awards are for newly graduating seniors-these newly awarded recipients will also be eligible to renew for three consecutive years.

Tacoma Elks are proud and honored to contribute to the next generation of Tacoma community leaders.






