A Message From Our Exalted Ruler

Azalea Snowmassara is our Bright Shining Star for Tacoma Elks #174. She is a 13-year-old, 8th grade student in our local School District (Tacoma). She is the Student Body President and attends Hilltop Heritage Middle School. Why is she OUR shining STAR? Because she took the time and interest to enter our annual Elks Americanism Essay competition, and not only took 1st place for our Lodge, and 1st place for all Washington State Elks; (LOUD drum role) she also captured FIRST PLACE, as her essay worked its way up through the Elks Grand Lodge competition. Yes, She Is our National Champion!

Every Year Grand Lodge provides a “prompt,” to which students may write an essay for judging at the local, (and if successful) state, (and if more successful) national levels. This year’s prompt was “What Does Patriotism Mean To Me?” At the National level there were 41 states that participated and over 40,000 essays submitted for all grade level divisions.

It is fitting we have and acknowledge our Champion, Azalea, immediately after celebrating Memorial Day, and the many men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice to preserve our way of life here in America, and those who served in the armed forces as patriots of our great country. There is more. From the hearts, and minds, and expressions of our youth come the words to which we must harken and pay close attention. Azalea’s essay follows:

William McKinley once said, “Strong hearts and helpful hands are needed, and, fortunately, we have them in every part of our beloved country.” Despite the fact this was stated over 100 years ago, I believe it to be true today. Our Kids

Washington Elks Therapy Program for Children, Inc. Our State Major Project

Meet Bryce, who has been receiving services from the Elk's Therapy Program since April of 2024. Bryce is on the autism spectrum and has global development delays. His insurance only covered a limited amount of outpatient occupational therapy sessions; hence he was referred to our program for in-home therapy services.

Bryce's parents share, "We are both very pleased with the progress Bryce has made over the past 9 months since starting to work with our Elks therapist. Bryce has made considerable progress in terms of his social skills and ability to form bonds with individuals outside of us (his parents). "

"Bryce has also shown substantial improvement in his tolerance for different sensory experiences. He enjoys putting his hands on various textures and has transitioned from being mostly sensory avoidant to finding sensory experiences very pleasant. He loves listening to music and smelling candles. He now seeks out these diverse sensory experiences (Orbeez, Play-Doh, dirt, mud, etc.) instead of avoiding them. He still needs to work on tolerance for different vestibular sensory experiences but has made some progress with tolerance for sitting in the back seat of the car with less motion sickness".

"Bryce has also grown in his ability to perform some fine motor tasks and is showing more patience with attempting to complete fine motor challenges. He can now string beads on a pipe-cleaner, turn a sink faucet on and off, open most door handles, pull up his pants, do some of the steps of brushing his teeth and hold a small crayon with a more appropriate grasp some of the time. He does continue to need to work on self-care skills but has the ability to complete some of the components of these essential tasks. We are so pleased to see him developing in this realm".

"We are very appreciative of the Elks Organization for providing us with this opportunity to work with a wonderful occupational therapist in our home. This assistance has been so important for allowing our son to work towards his full developmental potential".








