A Message From Our Exalted Ruler

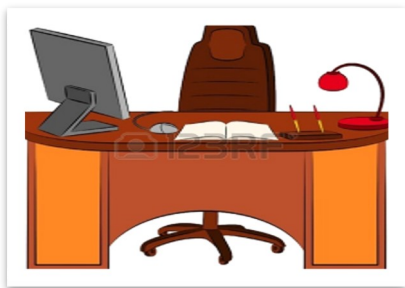

Changes in what was known as the “Sportsbar” – now “The Rack” – came from our member ranks. Stop downstairs and observe/experience the improved service and enjoyment to be had.

In this message I have attempted to outline one of our challenges (NEW MEMBERSHIP), beseech you for input, and offer strategy for our thinking in making positive change. In my message next month, I will offer some considerations for us as individuals, to help us grow, and remain healthy.

For now, we ask that you contribute to our organizational thinking and posturing, as a great American told us we might. We should remember his words and try to live by them - as he did.

Washington Elks Therapy Program for Children, Inc.
Our State Major Project



Caden was referred to the WA Elks Therapy Program when he was 9 months old. With an ear-to-ear smile and a charming, cheerful personality, Caden was quite content to just lie on his back and observe the world. However, at that age, babies are expected to be sitting, rolling, and beginning to crawl. Caden had been prescribed a helmet to help maintain his head shape due to flattening that can occur with prolonged time lying on his back, and the goal was to get him moving! Caden has low muscle tone, meaning his joints can be “floppy” or unstable, as well as having a larger sized head and some overall weakness. Moving around, lifting his larger head with a weaker, unstable body has been a journey—but he continues to make progress, and now at age 2 he is able to walk with help- which will come in handy as his family now also includes a little sister! Home therapy has been vital to Caden and his family, to integrate therapy into their daily lives through thoughtful positioning, specific play activities and equipment recommendations. Caden now also has several other therapies needed outside his home, including extensive speech therapy and physical therapy, in addition to frequent medical appointments and it is both financially draining and time consuming for his family. They are grateful that once per week, in the familiarity of their own home, they know that they will learn new ways of helping Caden learn new skills and get stronger and more independent.

Many thanks to all the members and friends who make this amazing program a reality.

There was news of a Stork Shower given by the Harvard Women on Waller Rd. The publication covered news from a broad area including Parkland, Elk Plain and Clover Creek.

There were ads covering many businesses. Any of the following names jog your memory?

Daniels Hardware for sporting goods and hardware. How about Spanaway Aircraft Co. on the Mountain Hwy at the Roy "Y"? Their ad was directed at GIs who could sign up for their flight instruction and take advantage of their Bill of Rights.

The Bungalow at Pacific Ave. and Sales Road advertised breakfasts, lunches and dinners including delicious hotcakes. Alice Gamache was the proprietor. Anyone remember Medosweet Kreamilk?

The Parkland Radio & Record Shop sold all popular records at a discounted price of 60 cents. What a buy!

Many of you may remember the Parkland Cleaners that started out on the Mountain Hwy between Sales Rd. & Airport. Later moving to Keller's Kort off Hwy 512 on Pacific Ave., and then moving to their last place of business in the shopping complex at 112th St.

There were ads for funeral homes, churches, lumber stores, and insurance agencies, and of course fuel and service stations. It was spring so a variety of chicks were advertised at Allison Rd. Hatchery and Feed Store located east of the Parkland Theater on Allison Rd.

Last, but not least, does anyone remember listening to Bob Lynd on the Parkland Hour? It broadcasted from KTBI (810 on your dial).

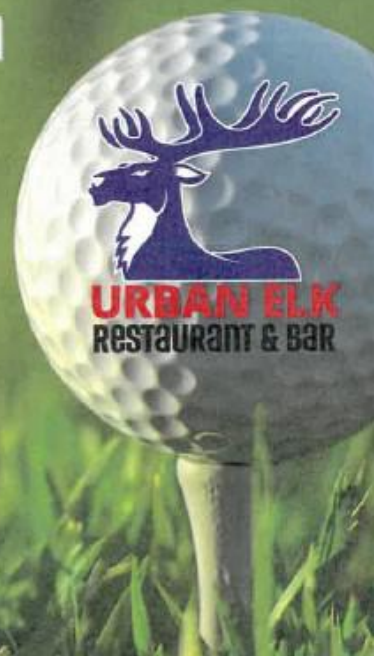
