Meet Grace. She is a beautiful <u>17 year old</u> who enjoys songs and interesting sounds, her piano, baking with her Mom, going on road trips, being out in nature, therapeutic horseback riding and her family. Grace has a smile that can light up the room!

Grace has a mitochondrial disorder, autism, GRIN2B – related neurodevelopmental disorder, and seizures. She has had a spinal fusion. Grace has a cortical vision impairment which means that the structure of the eye is typical and the eye takes an effective picture of the object. That message is sent to the brain, but it is not processed properly in the brain due to differences in brain functioning. GRIN2B is a gene located on the 12th chromosome. It is involved in sending chemical messages to the brain. A variation of this gene may occur randomly leading to low muscle tone, gross and fine motor disabilities, intellectual disability, limited speech/non-speaking and seizures. In Mitochondrial disease, there isn't enough energy produced by the mitochondria (compartments in each cell that are like batteries) for a cell or organ to function properly. Mitochrondria are important in organs that demand high energy such as the brain, heart, liver and muscles. The disorder can cause fatigue, weakness, seizures, growth problems, irregular heartbeat, intellectual disabilities, etc.

Grace uses a wheelchair and a stander at home. She receives her nutrition through tube feeds. She is a multi-modal communicator – she uses sign language, points to choices presented to her, uses a tablet, and most recently has an Eye Gaze Communication system that she is learning to use.

Grace was fortunate to work with an Elks Therapists before their recent move. After the family's move, she was able to reconnect with the program. Therapy was initiated post move via Zoom due to the pandemic and now is transitioning back to home visits. Grace's family has provided her with many opportunities and materials for her development and enjoyment. They have a deep understanding of how to best work with her. Grace is a well-loved young woman.

In therapy, Grace is working on communicating her choices, using her hands, and self-regulation. She is working on becoming more independent by putting utensils away in a drawer, placing items she has used back on a table, pulling wipes from a container, wiping her hands and then throwing the wipe away, self-regulation, etc. Most recently, Grace has found that watching and/or blowing on a pinwheel helps her to regain a calm state when she is starting to become overly excited or upset. A video was made for her (and sent to her Mom's cell phone) of her Elks therapist blowing a pinwheel, so that Grace can watch it when needed to regain her sense of calm. Grace's Mom, Krista reported that, "Grace was being overexcited to go to the bothroom, a newer skill. Overexcited meaning she was on the edge of possible meltdown but she was hoppy, scream-hoppy and just a bit edgy. I showed her the video you made of blowing the pinwheel and she watched it over and over again for a couple of minutes and began blowing on her own. Her body calmed and she calmed and no big meltdown happened. So awesome!"

Thank you, Washington Elks, for supporting the therapy program so that Grace and others can gain the skills needed to interact with others, make choices, feel calm and comfortable, enjoy time with family and friends, become more independent, and reach their maximum potential.

Blast from the Past

Did you attend school at Parkland School (when it hosted 1st through 8th grade) or in the 1950s after it became Parkland Elementary School? If so, you may have memories of those chalk boards, or playing in the gym or outside during recess. Parkland School was built in 1908 and is one of three county designated historic landmarks in Parkland. In the 1930s, a WPA-built addition was added. Sometime during the 1950s, a single story wing was added to the south side of the building that housed first and second grade students. And a two story kindergarten building was moved to the south end of the new wing.

The Parkland School is the cornerstone of Parkland. It has a long history as a Parkland landmark with architectural significance. In 1946 the Parkland Library opened in space in the school and remained there until 1951, when it moved to a post-war surplus Quonset hut a block north. I remember that library with its pot-bellied stove in the middle. The Quonset hut is long gone, as is the Parkland theatre, and buildings on Garfield St. where Parkland residents did their business in early years. Anyone remember Dahl's Grocery? How about Piggy Wiggly?



In the 1990s, Franklin Pierce School District sold the Parkland School Campus to Pacific Lutheran University and it became their East Campus. In 2013, PLU demolished the south wing during the building of an apartment building on Garfield St.. After PLU stopped using the school for it's East Campus, the school was leased to Mount Rainier High School for several years. Then PLU decided to sell the school and field for development for six story apartment buildings.

When the Parkland community heard of the proposed demolition of the Parkland School, many took action and the Parkland Community Association was formed. As a 501(c)3 non-profit, money is being raised to purchase the school in the hopes it can become a community center. PLU has agreed to give the association a year to raise the purchase price.
