FROM BREWS TO VIEWS, NEW REASONS TO LOVE AN OLD FAVORITE

urrounded by the highest peaks east of the Mississippi River, Asheville lies in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, an area first admired by the native Cherokee Indians who called it, "land of the blue mist." Home to cultural legacies including Biltmore Estate, built in the late 1800s for George Vanderbilt, the city has long been a popular mountain retreat. Asheville's crisp mountain air, thought to be therapeutic, attracted many health seekers around the turn of the century, as well as entrepreneurs including E.W. Grove, who built Grove Park Inn in 1913. It is one of the city's most distinctive landmarks (now an Omni resort hotel) that set the stage for an entrepreneurial spirit and genuine wellness culture that persist today.

In addition to outdoor recreation and spa retreats, Asheville visitors enjoy the blend of historic architecture with contemporary hotels, cozy restaurants and eclectic boutiques. Award-winning chefs have built a thriving culinary scene; with more breweries per capita than any U.S. city, Asheville embraces the moniker, "Beer City USA."



Eat, Sip, Shop, Chill

A variety of culinary adventures from Farm-to-Table Tours to the Asheville Brews Cruise make it easy to sample the city's food legacies and local craft beers. Or wander on your own in the South Slope neighborhood where you'll find a multitude of local flavors at Bhramari Brewing, Burial Beer, Catawba Brewing, Funkatorium and other brewpubs.



Choices abound for memorable dining in Asheville's walkable downtown, but don't miss Cúrate for Spanish tapas, led by superstar chef Katie Button who has also opened Button & Co. Bagels. Another hotspot is Benne on Eagle at The Foundry Hotel, which introduces a new era of Appalachian cuisine with dishes like onion-braised rabbit and fried catfish on waffles. Breakfast lovers should head for Early Girl Eatery downtown or the new West Asheville location (go early to avoid a wait).

Pop into Grove Arcade, an architectural gem with one-of-a-kind shops where you can lose yourself at the Book Exchange and Champagne Bar, or chill out at Wake Foot Sanctuary with a foot soak and massage. Then, walk over to Asheville Bee Charmer to sample honey and satisfy your sweet tooth.

Canines are welcome in Asheville! A new Dog City Tour begins with an urban walk from Asheville's Dog Welcome Center (the first of its kind in the country) and stops at breweries, eateries and shops that cater to man's best friend.



Art and architectural highlights

Enjoy bird's eye views of Asheville's historic buildings against the backdrop of the Blue Ridge with Asheville Rooftop Bar Tours. The new company offers van-chauffeured visits to rooftop venues such as The Montford at Hyatt Place, Capella on 9 at AC Hotel, and Hemingway's Cuba at Cambria Hotel. Tour creator Kaye Bentley shares tidbits of city history, with then-and-now photos of notable neighborhoods.

Asheville River Arts District is home to more than 220 artist studios and galleries in a former industrial area that once housed a meat packing plant, chicken hatchery, tannery and various warehouses. Browse on your own or take a guided tour with Asheville Art Studio Tours to meet artists in all genres. The neighborhood also holds Second Saturdays every month and a Fall Studio Stroll with demonstrations and special events.

Pottery lovers may want to visit the downtown boutique of East Fork, a pottery/lifestyle brand co-founded by the great-grandson of French artist Henri Matisse. His artisan ceramics studio began on a tobacco farm in Madison County and has since grown into a new facility in Biltmore Village.

Stay and Play

Asheville's "oldest" new hotel, The Foundry, blends luxury and history in renovated buildings of the former Asheville Supply & Foundry Co., which produced steel and other metal castings for Biltmore Estate. Part of the Hilton Curio Collection, the



boutique hotel features century-old brick walls, contemporary furnishings and vintage-inspired accessories in spacious guest rooms and suites. Located on South Market Street, The Foundry is just a short walk to downtown attractions. But the best hotel amenity is the Tesla Model X house car, available to chauffeur guests around town and on excursions.

At Biltmore Estate, one of the key attractions besides touring the mansion is exploring the grounds, conveniently done when you stay on property at The Inn or Village Hotel. You can enjoy hiking, biking, horseback and carriage rides, among other activities. Biltmore's newest offerings include falconry, fly-fishing from a kayak and the Outrider Tour via electric recumbent tricycle.

When to visit? Summer and fall need no coaxing - the warmer months are ideal for outdoor adventure and scenic Parkway drives. Winter is a well-kept secret and my favorite time for wandering city blocks and enjoying the urban vibe, minus the crowds. Regardless of the season, you'll find novel experiences and a friendly, welcoming atmosphere among locals and visitors, alike.


Coconnt Chicken with Cucumber Salad


- 1 egg white, lightly beaten
- 2 skinless chicken breasts
- 3 tbsp flaked coconut
- 1 tsp sunflower oil
- ½ cucumber, thinly sliced on the diagonal
- 1 small red onion, thinly sliced
- 2 tsp sugar
- 2 tbsp white wine vinegar salt/pepper to taste



Heat oven to 350°. Season the egg white. Dip the chicken in the egg, then in the coconut. Place on a lightly oiled baking sheet and bake for 20-25 mins, turning once until the chicken is cooked through.

Meanwhile, put the cucumber slices into a colander, sprinkle with a little salt and leave for 5 mins to drain. Pat the cucumber slices dry with kitchen paper. In a bowl, mix the onion with the sugar and vinegar, then add the cucumber and serve with the chicken
