True Forgiveness



Any parent can tell you that it is often in the best interest of a child to say, "No", or, "That is not good for you. The stove is hot! Don't touch it!" Sometimes it requires more love to say "no" than "yes" to a child's request. At the same time, giving someone what they want, or acceptance of a lifestyle contradictory to the faith, is neither compassionate nor merciful. True compassion must not leave a person in a sinful state. From Holy Scripture we see that

the Lord showed the woman who was caught in adultery compassion. He told her that he did not condemn her, but he then told her to go and sin no more. Jesus makes it clear that conversion must be a part of forgiveness. Jesus did not tell her that she was forgiven and that he would walk with her in her sin; no, he told her to go and sin no more, to change her lifestyle.

Fraternal correction is not easy, but it is something that we must do to help our brothers and sisters who are going down the wrong path. It is false compassion to say to someone that you love their sin. Love the sinner, yes, but not the sin. Allowing someone to remain in their ignorance (or sin) without correcting them is not compassion. It is true compassion to help a brother or sister see the sin and danger of their ways. It is not easy, it may appear harsh, but it is the right thing to do. If you yell at a child who is reaching out to touch a hot stove, you may frighten the child, but you have protected him / her. It is better to yell and protect the child. It is not good to let the child get burned because you did not want to yell out a warning.

It should also be noted that in the Sacrament of Confession, a penance is given before the words of absolution. The giving of a penance is a reminder that you have caused damage spiritually, and now you must make amends spiritually. Sometimes we forget that justice is a part of forgiveness. For example, if you have taken something (the sin of stealing), out of justice you must return the item, or, if this is not possible, give something to charity. True forgiveness includes a willingness to change (conversion) and an effort to correct the wrong that was done (justice).

Lake County Illinois Catholic Charities assistance programs

If you need help in Lake County Illinois, then Catholic Charities is one of the leading organizations to contact. They provide direct emergency assistance, referrals, and partner with non-profits and companies such as North Shore Gas. Social workers from Catholic Charities will advocate on your behalf, provide case management, and offer direct financial assistance if it is available.

Heating bill assistance is offered from the Heartship Program. Catholic Charities may have funds that can help North Shore Gas customers whose heating service has been shut off. Various hardship conditions need to be met, as well as income guidelines are in place. Call the agency at 847-782-4100 in order to apply for Heartship.

Housing and shelter is offered by the Samaritan House. This location caters to homeless women and children in Lake County. So short term housing is offered, as well as support and case management to help people end the cycle of homelessness. Once someone is stable. Catholic Charities will help facilitate longer term housing placement assistance as well as provide skills training. The goal is to also help someone find a job so they can pay the rent on their own in the future.

Some of the case management services provided by Samaritan House include employment and budget counseling, skills education, life skills development, and much more. Referrals are provided for other munity resources as well as state of Illinois and federal government public assistance programs. 847.782.4142

Rapid Re-housing Program, Housing Counseling and Case Management -This Catholic Charity program helps families locate and secure affordable, safe, and quality housing. Get assistance with developing workable budgets, communicating with prospective landlords, maintaining and paying for the housing, and get information on tenant's and homeowner rights and responsibilities. Foreclosure prevention and counseling may be provided too.

Sixth Sunday of Easter

The sixth Sunday of Easter moves us toward the feast of Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit to the early Church. Today's Gospel describes Jesus at the Last Supper, foretelling the coming of the Spirit to the community of Jesus. Jesus combines the promise of the Spirit with his gift of peace to his disciples. He foresees that the community must be grounded in his love, which provides peace, to face the tumult of the Crucifixion, and later, the trials of the early Church. Grounded in Jesus, the community can be then open to the Spirit who will continually guide, remind, and renew them in their life together. The gift of peace from Jesus is not a worldly peace through which the powerful crush opposition. It is not a complacent or private peace. The peace of Jesus instead seeks and works toward peace throughout the world, guided by the Spirit.

RESPONSIBLE LEADERSHIP

Today's passage from Acts captures the beginning and the conclusion of what became known as the Jerusalem Council. It is well worth studying all of Acts 15, meant to provide an example of responsible leadership for the wider Church. There was substantial conflict within the community over what is necessary for unity in the diverse community of Jews and Gentiles. We can notice some key characteristics of the actions of the leadership.

The leaders acknowledged the reality of a significant conflict without minimizing it. They received and fully honored the diverse experiences of persons of different backgrounds. They worked with an accepted authority structure and a process to move toward resolution. They were committed to discern the action and will of the Spirit, with a deep respect for testimony about how the Spirit was working. They avoided placing unneeded burdens on anyone. And afterward, they continued to observe the ongoing action of the Spirit as the decision was implemented.

WHAT IS ESSENTIAL?

The issues weighed by the Jerusalem Council in our passage from Acts were related to circumcision as a requirement, and to table fellowship. A strong theological tradition held that traditional practices were essential, and the community genuinely sought to maintain continuity with the roots of their faith. Peter's observation about how the Spirit was actively working in their midst pointed the leaders in a new direction. Then James reminded them that the scriptural tradition also pointed to fully welcoming the Gentiles into God's community.

It is a profound challenge for leaders in our own parishes when encountering issues that can fracture a community. What is essential and what is not? What are we called to embrace, or called to lay down? Acknowledging conflict and working toward resolution is an essential function for our parishes, because Christ calls us to live in unity. We are called to open our hearts, mine our tradition, and observe the activity of the Spirit.

How does the program work?

By request, Legion of Mary members will deliver the Our Lady of Fatima statue to your home on a given Saturday at 10am, and pray Welcoming Prayers with you. The statue remains in your home for an entire week and the family is encouraged to pray the Rosary each day. The following week, the same home is visited by the Legion of Mary members and pray Mary's Farewell prayers with you. Then on to the next home where the same program is repeated. We have prayer booklets in English and in Spanish.

Who can request the statue?

All parishioners in Our Lady of The Lakes Parish area are welcome to request the statue no matter which Parish you presently attend.


