The Holy Eucharist

There is a debate going on between church leaders regarding whether or not politicians who support abortion should receive Holy Communion. In light of this, I thought it would be good to share a quote from St. Paul.

St. Paul says:

Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself. (1 Corinthians 11: 27-29)

At the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, bread and wine consecrated truly becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The presence of Christ “Par Excellence” is what the Catholic Church believes is contained in the Holy Eucharist. It is no longer simply bread and wine. As St. Thomas Aquinas stated, the accidents remain, but a substantial change has occurred. The bread still tastes, looks, and feels like bread, but, after consecration, it has become the Body of Christ. Similarly, the wine still looks, smells, and tastes like wine, but, after the consecration, it has become the Blood of Christ.

The Consecrated Host must never be given to someone who is not properly disposed to receive. If a person is aware of serious sin, they should seek Confession before receiving Holy Communion. In the Latin Rite, a child who has not been instructed in the faith, or is under the age of reason (seven), must not be given the Host.

Personally, I believe that those who persist in serious sin (supporting abortion would be such a sin), are guilty of what St. Paul is saying in his letter to the Corinthians. Sin blocks grace. So, in essence, those who receive Holy Communion in serious sin are blocking the graces of God. A simple example of this would involve taking vitamins. If your body is not capable of processing vitamins, even though you swallow them, you will not receive the nutrients. The same could be said of Holy Communion. If your soul is not capable of receiving the graces (remember, sin blocks grace), taking Holy Communion will not truly benefit you. In fact, it may harm you spiritually since you are receiving unworthily. Our church leaders should be helping people who are immersed in sin. Fraternal correction is not condemnation. Fraternal correction is a loving response and concern for another’s soul. Let us pray that our church leaders will have the loving compassion to correct those in serious sin.

Lake County Illinois Catholic Charities assistance programs

If you need help in Lake County Illinois, then Catholic Charities is one of the leading organizations to contact. They provide direct emergency assistance, referrals, and partner with non-profits and companies such as North Shore Gas. Social workers from Catholic Charities will advocate on your behalf, provide case management, and offer direct financial assistance if it is available.

Heating bill assistance is offered from the **Heartship Program**. Catholic Charities may have funds that can help North Shore Gas customers whose heating service has been shut off. Various hardship conditions need to be met, as well as income guidelines are in place. Call the agency at 847-782-4100 in order to apply for Heartship.

Housing and shelter is offered by the Samaritan House. This location caters to homeless women and children in Lake County. So short term housing is offered, as well as support and case management to help people end the cycle of homelessness. Once someone is stable, Catholic Charities will help facilitate longer term housing placement assistance as well as provide skills training. The goal is to also help someone find a job so they can pay the rent on their own in the future.

Some of the case management services provided by Samaritan House include employment and budget counseling, skills education, life skills development, and much more. Referrals are provided for other community resources as well as state of Illinois and federal government public assistance programs. 847.782.4142

Rapid Re-housing Program, Housing Counseling and Case Management - This Catholic Charity program helps families locate and secure affordable, safe, and quality housing. Get assistance with developing workable budgets, communicating with prospective landlords, maintaining and paying for the housing, and get information on tenant's and homeowner rights and responsibilities. Foreclosure prevention and counseling may be provided too.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Sunday Lectionary, the first reading is usually chosen from anywhere in the Hebrew Bible to tie together with the Gospel. Currently, the second reading is from Saint Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. Often the second reading is not so closely related to the day's Gospel selection, because those books are read in a more continuous fashion from week to week. But today, all three of the scripture readings go together very well. Ezekiel struggles with the job he is given by the Lord, speaking to a rebellious people. Paul is dealing with a "thorn in his side," that is, the difficulties of his own personal weakness and foibles, and learning to rely on God's grace. Mark's Gospel introduces us to a Jesus who is struggling to be believed and accepted in his native country. In all three passages, the major figures are following the will of God and paying the price of rejection by the community for their efforts.

I DON'T GET NO RESPECT

Years ago there was a popular comedian named Rodney Dangerfield, and he would riff about his family life or his work and his catchphrase was "I don't get no respect!" You knew this refrain was coming, and was part of the punch line, so you waited to hear it and usually laughed or groaned with it. The idea of Jesus being disrespected is a much more foreign feeling. It is easy to forget that Jesus was both human and divine. We can easily romanticize his life and ministry and forget his struggles and the difficulty he had being heard, understood, and respected, especially in his own country. Placed in the larger context of Mark's story, this was very early in Jesus' ministry, and the message he was proclaiming was not what the people wanted to hear. Jesus was not speaking about the Messiah that the Jews were hoping for. Add that together with the fact that people are often hardest on their own. Somehow "local boy makes good" just didn't sit well with them, and they didn't want to have anything to do with Jesus or his message. Jesus was caught off guard by this.

A MESSAGE FOR OUR TIME

There are times when being Catholic, or even being Christian is very countercultural. It used to be you belonged to a parish, and that was your home, based on your geographic boundaries or ethnicity. But now people change parishes depending on pastors, styles of music, or the Mass schedule. In these days of Covid-19, many who stayed away because of social distancing have not yet found their way back. Many never recovered from their disillusionment over the abuse scandals. Others left Catholicism for non-denominational churches, or explored other paths such as Buddhism. Still others consider themselves "spiritual but not religious" or are labeled "nones." Frequently, families who once sat together every week in church are now scattered all over the spiritual spectrum. In the face of all this, let us pray for the strength of Ezekiel to continue to preach our faith by the lives we live, despite everything in our culture that rebels against religion. May we have the wisdom of Paul to persevere despite our weaknesses and the thorns in our side. And like Jesus, may we always find the faith we need to endure, even when those around us do not.
