GOD'S LAWS

Today's readings provide some interesting parallels and contrasts. The first reading is an account of Moses who, having delivered the Law to the Israelites, admonishes them to "observe them [its statutes] carefully." The author of the Letter of James likewise instructs fellow Christians to "welcome the word" they have received, that they may become "doconstruction of the Great that the control of the c and does justice" by listing a few examples of what is required for that - descriptions that apply equally to both Jewish and Christian traditions. On the other hand, when the scribes and Pharisees point out that the disciples have not properly washed their hands before eating (which is, as Mark explains, the usual Jewish practice) Jesus scolds them sharply for being too focused on human rules—even ritual ones—instead of God's laws.

MOSAIC LAW: WHAT GOD WANTS OF THE PEOPLE

Moses gives the Israelites their Law, which provided the structure for daily life. As recorded in the Bible, over half of the Law is about rituals for worship and sacrifice. A related concept is the concept of a person's ritual purity (or cleanliness), which is required for participation in both social and religious activities, since persons become unclean by physical contact with other unclean persons, animals, or objects. Other ways a person becomes unclean include the presence of skin lesions, bleeding, or a bodily discharge. Unclean persons are required to purify themselves to be again considered clean. Despite the Law's complexity, observant Jews considered it a privilege, not a burden, to observe its precepts, and they continue to do so today.

ON THE OTHER HAND . . .

The scribes and Pharisees are focusing on the disciples' failure to properly wash their hands prior to eating. But nowhere in the biblical texts of the Law are there regulations regarding the washing of hands before or after meals. These regulations, as described by Mark, are merely practices like those that arise in all societies; if they continue long enough, they can seem like sacred duties, sanctified as "the traditions of their elders."

This distinction is the source of the tension in these three readings. Moses and James both tell their people that they are recipients of a divine gift that requires special care, while Jesus is practically livid when the scribes and Pharisees react harshly to the disciples' failure to wash their hands according to Jewish practices.

Such a distinction between divine law and human practices is valuable for our own lives. When we hear of another's misdeeds, we should evaluate the seriousness of the offense

before forming our own impression. Is this truly a serious moral matter? Or something less weighty? Carefully discerning the seriousness of such matters might reveal that things are not as grave as they first appear. Such care is an exercise in Christian charity, one way of acting on the word we have received as members of the Body of Christ.

From Pastor Fr. George Koeune



Physical / Social / Emotional

During this health crisis, government agencies are very concerned with keeping people healthy and safe physically. This is good. However, human beings are more than just physical beings. I have had many conversations with people who are suffering emotionally, spiritually, and socially because of the isolation that has occurred during the pandemic. I am afraid that some people are becoming sick spiritually, and mentally. I believe that we must take steps to help those who are feeling isolated because of the pandemic.

I believe coming to the Holy Sacrifice of The Mass is a very good way to help a person. Being together with others, being nourished by the Holy Eucharist, is a great way to combat the sickness of loneliness and depression. Of course, we must be careful when we come to church. It is with that thought in mind that I want to reprint an article that I ran a while back.

The following has been adapted from material from Our Sunday Visitor:

First and foremost, if you're sick, stay home, even if it means missing Mass. While skipping Sunday Mass is never to be encouraged without cause, illness and risk of infecting others are good reasons to stay home. Even before the recent health issue, if you were impeded from attending Mass on a Sunday or holy day because of illness, you were excused. You do not have to go to confession because of sickness.

Of course, while I would love to see everyone at church, I realize that many parishioners may be more vulnerable and should not come out at this time. Although I believe our Church is safer than many other public places, there is always some risk whenever you leave your house. So, it is up to the individual to decide for him or herself when to come back to God's House.

Please know that I am praying for everyone during this pandemic. Let us take care of each other and trust in Our Lord to see us through these difficult times.

The Legion of Mary **Pilgrim Virgin Statue Home Visitation Program**



What is the Legion of Mary?

The Legion of Mary is the largest lay apostolic organization of faithful Catholics united under the banner and protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Influenced by the Holy Spirit, and Divine Grace, the members serve the Church and Their neighbors, for the Glory of God by prayer and active co-operation with our Blessed Mother's desire to bring Christ to Souls and Souls to Christ.

What is the Pilgrim Virgin Statue Home Visitation Program?

The Pilgrim Virgin Statue is a Blessed 20" tall replica of our Lady of Fatima. It is a traveling sacramental offered by the Legion of Mary, Our Lady of Grace Praesidium, for visitation in your residence to create a prayerful, sanctifying space where family and friends are encouraged to pray the Rosary and mediate on its mysteries.

How does the program work?

If you need help in Lake County Illinois, then Catholic Charities is one of the leading organizations to contact. They provide direct emergency assistance, referrals, and partner with non-profits and companies such as North Shore Gas. Social workers from Catholic Charities will advocate on your behalf, provide case management, and offer direct financial assistance if it is available.


Heating bill assistance is offered from the Heartship Program. Catholic Charities may have funds that can help North Shore Gas customers whose heating service has been shut off. Various hardship conditions need to be met, as well as income guidelines are in place. Call the agency at 847-782-4100 in order to apply for Heartship.

Housing and shelter is offered by the Samaritan House. This location caters to homeless women and children in Lake County. So short term housing is offered, as well as support and case management to help people end the cycle of homelessness. Once someone is stable, Catholic Charities will help facilitate longer term housing placement assistance as well as provide skills training. The goal is to also help someone find a job so they can pay the rent on their own in the future.

Some of the case management services provided by Samaritan House include employment and budget counseling, skills education, life skills development, and much more. Referrals are provided for other community resources as well as state of Illinois and federal government public assistance programs. 847.782.4142

Rapid Re-housing Program, Housing Counseling and Case

Management - This Catholic Charity program helps families locate and secure affordable, safe, and quality housing. Foreclosure prevention and counseling may be provided too.
