

Homily

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sin and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen



but deliver us from evil.


The Priest alone continues, saying:

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.


