

Florida Statutory Parent Information

Qualifications of Classroom Teachers

In accordance with section 1002.421(1)(h), Florida Statutes, instructional personnel must meet at least ONE of the following qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree or higher in any subject (copy of diploma or completed transcript).
- Three or more years of K–12 grade teaching experience (written proof of contacting the previous employer).
- Special skills, knowledge, or expertise that qualifies the individual to provide instruction in K–12 grade subjects. Documentation may include certifications, professional development, curriculum training, or similar credentials. Pre-K experience and certifications alone do not satisfy this requirement.

Required Parent Disclosure

Pursuant to section 1002.421(1)(j), Florida Statutes, the school provides the following information to parents:

- Programs and services that the school offers.
- The qualifications of classroom teachers.
- A statement that: “A parentally placed private school student with a disability does not have an individual right to receive some or all of the special education and related services that the student would receive if enrolled in a public school under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.”
