Symposium

Our annual Herb Symposium at the Woman's Club of Wisconsin is held in April. Attendees enjoy an herbal continental breakfast, followed by a presentation, and concludes with a marvelous herbal lunch prepared by the chef and staff. Guests may visit the herbal tasting room, shop vendor tables, and enjoy other fun things.

We study the HSA Herb of the Month, and one meeting is dedicated to the study of the International Herb Association's Herb of the YearTM – its culture, history, lore, culinary, and other uses.
