Herb & Artisan Fair

Our unit holds a free Herb & Artisan Fair at Boerner Botanical Gardens in May. Vendors sell plants, garden art, jewelry, crafts, and herbal and food products. Also offered is a Tea Room with fresh herbal, sweet and savory baked goods and lavender lemonade. Free herb-related lectures and a children's activity area.

Grants & Scholarship Program

The income from the Herb & Artisan Fair funds our Grants and Scholarship Program. A Culinary Arts Scholarship is open to MATC and WCTC students and provides grants to various entities, including the Boerner Botanical Herb Garden, Friends of Boerner Children's Educational Program, and herb gardens at Old World Wisconsin.

Herb Study

We study the HSA Herb of the Month, and one meeting is dedicated to the study of the International Herb Association's Herb of the Year™ – its culture, history, lore, culinary, and other uses.
