Unless otherwise provided herein, all capitalized terms in this Order shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Settlement Agreement.

1. The Court finds class certification for settlement purposes is proper. The proposed Settlement Class satisfies the requirements of CR 23(a) and CR 23(b)(3). The proposed class is composed of more than 130 people such that numerosity is satisfied. There are common questions of law and fact regarding the class claims, including whether Defendant's alleged common practices violated the law, which question would also predominate over individual questions, if any, such that commonality and predominance are satisfied. The claims of Plaintiff are typical of the claims of the proposed class. And Plaintiff and his counsel are adequate and qualified to protect the interests of the class. For these reasons, the Court certifies the following Settlement Class:

All current and former non-exempt employees who worked for Alta Pest in Washington at any time from May 7, 2021 through November 4, 2024, as already identified by Alta Pest.

- 2. The Court preliminarily approves the Settlement Agreement and the terms set forth therein—including the relief afforded the Settlement Class, the service award to the Plaintiff, the attorneys' fees and costs award to Class Counsel, and the Settlement Administration expenses award—as being fair, reasonable and adequate. The Settlement Agreement is the result of arm's length negotiations between experienced attorneys who are familiar with class action litigation in general and with the legal and factual issues of this case in particular.
- 3. The Court appoints CAC Services Group as Settlement Administrator. The Court approves the Settlement Administrator to perform the functions required by the terms of the Settlement Agreement. The Court also approves reasonable compensation and costs to the Settlement Administrator in accordance with the Settlement Agreement.
- 4. A final fairness hearing ("Final Fairness Hearing") for purposes of determining whether the Settlement should be finally approved, shall be held before the

Court on June 20, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. in the courtroom of the Honorable Kristin Ballinger at King County Superior Court, 401 4th Ave. N, Courtroom 3G, Kent, WA 98032. At the hearing, the Court will hear arguments concerning whether the proposed Settlement and the terms and conditions provided for in the Settlement Agreement should be granted final approval by the Court as fair, reasonable and adequate. The Court will also consider Class Counsel's request for attorneys' fees and costs and for a service payment to the Class Representative, and rule on any other matters that the Court deems appropriate.

- 5. The Court approves, as to form and content, the Notice of Settlement to be sent to the members of the Settlement Class, which is attached to the Settlement Agreement as Attachment A. In addition, the Court finds that distribution of the Notices in the manner set forth in Paragraph 6 of this Order and Section 6 of the Settlement Agreement will meet the requirements of due process and applicable law, will provide the best notice practicable under the circumstances, and will constitute due and sufficient notice to all individuals entitled thereto.
  - 6. The procedure for distributing notice shall be as follows:
- Within fifteen (15) business days of the date of this Order, Defendant a. shall provide the Settlement Administrator with the name, last known address, last known telephone number, last known non-work email address (if any), and social security number of each Class Member.
- b. No later than fourteen (14) days after receiving the Employee Data, the Settlement Administrator shall issue notice to all Settlement Class Members ("Class Notice") by regular mail, including notice by email, if applicable. The date on which Class Notices are sent shall be deemed the "Initial Mailing Date."
- Before mailing the Class Notices, the Settlement Administrator will c. perform normal and customary address updates and verifications as necessary.
  - d. The Class Notice shall provide that Class Members may exclude

- If a Class Notice is returned as undeliverable with a forwarding address provided by the United States Postal Service, the Settlement Administrator will promptly resend the Class Notice to that forwarding address. If a Class Notice is returned as undeliverable and without a forwarding address, the Settlement Administrator will perform a reasonable skip trace, and if it obtains a more recent address, will resend the Class Notice.
- f. The Settlement Administrator shall also mail a Class Notice to any Class Member who contacts the Settlement Administrator or one of the Parties and requests a Class Notice.
- 7. Class Counsel shall timely file a motion requesting that the Court grant final approval of the Settlement Agreement and enter final judgment as to Defendants in the Action.
- 8. The Court reserves the right to adjourn the date of the Final Fairness Hearing without further notice to the members of the Settlement Class and retains jurisdiction to consider all further applications arising out of or connected with the proposed Settlement Agreement.
- 9. If the Court does not enter an order finally approving the Settlement, or if the Settlement does not become final for any other reason, then the action shall proceed as if the Settlement Agreement had not been executed.
