4. Remember to take the following:

- a. Disaster Kits for family members and animals
- b. Financial Information – bring a copy of utility bill as additional proof of residence, if needed
- c. Family heirlooms that have been previously identified to be taken if this can be done without loss of significant time
- d. Pet Information, including pet-friendly motels and animal shelters

5. Who to call for help:

- a. For shelter for barn animals, bring animals to shelters set up by Large Animal Shelters & Emergency Readiness (LASER). For shelter location, see LASER website at [laser-shelter.org](http://laser-shelter.org) or LASER Facebook page at @LASERyourstablesolution
- b. For transportation for barn animals (e.g., horses, pigs, goats) to a predetermined location with friends or to the LASER shelter, call Equine Emergency Evacuation of Yavapai County (EEE) at 833-922-9333
- c. For shelter for household pets, bring animals to shelters set up by Animal Disaster Services (ADS). For their shelter locations, look on Facebook at Animal Disaster Services or their website at [www.animaldisasterservices.com](http://www.animaldisasterservices.com)
- d. For shelter for family – American Red Cross. For shelter locations, look on Facebook at Yavapai County Emergency Management
- e. Also, you can sign up through the American Red Cross for their “Safe and Well” program. This will give you access to their website to tell loved ones that you are well. Access that at <https://safeandwell.communityos.org/zf/safe/add>
