

Identity - Who I Am (10 weeks)- Supports women's self-discovery and the importance of each one"s place in family, community, and culture by examining "What Does it Mean to be Me?" and societal messages about identity. Women share values, influences, dreams and roles within the context of family and culture leading to sharing of self-expressions, acceptance and affirmations in a supportive community.

Relationships (10 weeks)- Addresses relationships in women's lives, including intimacy, sexuality, and personal standards. Explores working and professional relationships, family and friendships, as well as competition and community. Women journal, brainstorm, role-play, and discuss topics with an inclusive approach, fostering deep connections and exploration of the importance of healthy relationships to women's lives and well-being.

Being a well woman (10 weeks)- Focuses on holistic health and wellness using a variety of creative processes such as collage, games, surveys, case studies, and analysis along with guided visualization, stress relief and inspirational role models to explore self-care and how to support one another. Themes include physical, emotional, spiritual, occupational and financial wellness, as well as intimacy and sexual wellness in women's lives.



SUPPORTING AT-RISK YOUTH AND THEIR FAMILIES

- 2. If you are emailing, please put YOUTH COURT in the subject line
- 3. Parent/Guardian and teen are required to attend an IN-OFFICE intake appointment
- 4. After the intake is complete parent/guardian will be notified within 72 hours if their son/daughter has been accepted into our groups

Victim Awareness Class: (3) Session Class, 1.5 Hours Each

Students will learn: The meaning of victim awareness and the "real cost" of their actions. Additional topics include how their personal situation would have been different had the offense occurred when the student was 18 years of age or being charged as an adult. Teens will also learn how their actions have impacted others and they will form real life solutions to prevent future negative law enforcement involvement. These are just a few topics that are covered. Students are required to participate in all discussions/assignments to get the full benefit of the Victim Awareness curriculum.

Victim Awareness is offered 1-2 times a month.

Teen Anger Management Class: (4) Session Class, 2 Hours Each

Students will learn: Strategies for effective anger management. They will also understand the thoughts, feelings, and emotions that impact and influence aggressive behavior. Teens will learn techniques to successfully manage anger and conflict resolution. Teens will have homework and group discussions to facilitated learning. Students are required to participate in all discussions/assignments to get the full benefit of the Teen Anger Management curriculum. Additional topics involve identifying anger triggers, effective assertive communication, and future planning.

Teen Anger Management is offered approximately every other month or held 6 times a year.

Healthy Relationships: (4) Session Class, 2 Hours Each

Students will learn: How to develop healthy relationships and prevent teen dating violence. They will evaluate relationships, understand abuse, identify social influences, learn how to build healthy relationships, and make positive decisions. Students are required to participate in all discussions/assignments to get the full benefit of the Teen Relationship Boundaries curriculum.

Teen Relationship Boundaries is offered a few times a year reflecting demand for class.

Substance Abuse Education Class: (4) Session Class, 1.5 Hours Each

Students will learn: Information surrounding drug and alcohol misuse, strategies for healthy decision making, and tools for living healthy lives. Topics include learning about the effects of tobacco and vaping, alcohol, illegal substances, and prescription drugs. Additional topics covered include, resistance strategies, and decision making. Students are required to participate in all discussions/assignments to get the full benefit of the curriculum.

Substance Abuse Education is offered approximately every other month or held 6 times a year.

Temecula/Murrieta Police Activities League Program: Year long program for youth ages (5-18)

<u>Police Activities League (P.A.L.):</u> P.A.L is our youth violence prevention and intervention program for kids ages 5 to 18. We partner with Temecula/ Murrieta Police Department to provide safe, quality programming for youth in the community.

- Young PAL: A program for ages 5-12 where they learn all about respect, teamwork, leadership, and community safety. We incorporate art and fun activities to help our Young PAL members to engage with their peers and community helpers.
- <u>Girls Circle:</u> A program for middle school girls focusing on friendships, body image, conflict resolution and diversity. We incorporate art, music, and guided discussion to help girls develop positive peer relationships. We offer year-round groups with 8-week sessions throughout the year.
- <u>Teen Leadership:</u> A program for teen boys and girls that are interested in earning community service hours while also developing leadership skills and helping the community.
