2025 YTD Budget & Cash Asset Reports

In reviewing the 2025 Budget vs. Actual reports from January 1 to June 30, 2025, WHPS has received \$1,468,302 or 54.73% in income with expenses of \$1,573,547 or 57.53%. The budget currently shows a net income of -\$75,245.

As a reminder, WHPS received \$190,088 in 2024 as income for Public Safety Aid from both cities. The current balance of the Public Safety Aid is \$166,916. There is \$120,000 of that aid included in the Projected Income for the 2025 budget. This projected income was designated to offset the cost of the 11th officer. If the \$120,000 is credited to the budget, the budget will show a balance of \$44,755.

Balances of other accounts: Crime Prevention \$14,077, Federal Forfeiture \$203,464, Reserves \$1,849, Capital Outlay \$44,213, Military Leave PERA \$0.00, Severance \$41,081, and Public Safety Aid \$166,916.

Update on LMAC Records Management System Data Transfer with CentralSquare

The LMAC group is currently waiting for Hennepin County to sign-on to the agreement in order for us to retrieve our data from CentralSquare. Once this occurs, we can have the data migrated to the server at South Lake Minnetonka Police Department. There have been several meetings and communications with Hennepin County that are now bringing us closer to resolving this matter.

MN POST Board Compliance Review

A MN POST Board Standards Coordinator came to WHPS on April 29 for the rescheduled POST Board Audit. The audit is a training compliance review of all officers at WHPS. This includes all training records involving use of force, emergency vehicle operations, defensive tactics, and firearms qualification. Also included is the review of required policies through state law. WHPS passed the audit with no suggested changes.

Discussion of Lift Assists at Care Facilities

WHPS Sgt Ebeling and MPFD Chief Denneson met with Haven Homes staff on June 16 to discuss call response for both agencies to the facility. There has been a noticeable increase in non-emergency lift assists to the facility, which can be taxing on our first response services. The calls are primarily handled by WHPS Officers, with occasional assistance from MPFD. The meeting went well with attention being called to the volume and types of calls that are being handled. Haven Homes has purchased equipment that will aid their staff in handling issues that may not need first response. Haven Homes will also be reviewing internal policies and procedures to ensure that the appropriate level of care is being provided to residents prior to calling for first response assistance. A follow-up meeting to discuss the current status is being scheduled.

Staffing Update

Officer Dan Lueth was certified for solo patrol after completing his field training. Officer Avery Freeman continues to progress through his training and is expected to be on solo patrol sometime in August. Part-time Officer Matt Peterson has completed several field training shifts to prepare for solo patrol, when needed.

Investigator Cody Thompson submitted a letter of resignation from WHPS with his last day being August 1, 2025. Investigator Thompson and his family have an opportunity that will take them away from the area. DTF Investigator Lilles will split his time between general investigations and his DTF cases as Investigator Thompson transitions out of accepting cases. The investigator spot will be filled on a more permanent basis once we have a better understanding of filling the vacancy created by Inv. Thompson's departure.

Officer Vorderbruggen has become a firearms support officer and will assist Officer Raskin during firearms training.

Full-time Police Officer Hiring Process

A process to fill a vacancy has been initiated. Information has been posted to our website, social media, the POST Board website, and several others. The plan is to hold interviews on Wednesdays as applications come in. The first round of interviews will be handled by WHPS staff, including a Sergeant. Quality candidates will be passed along to a panel of interviewers, including Police Commission members, City Administrators, and WHPS Command Staff. Chief DuRose will likely meet with each candidate along the way. Dates for panel interviews will be determined with as much notice as possible.

Outside Employment Request

Officer Raskin made a formal request seeking approval for outside employment with SWATMOD out of St. Cloud to become an assistant instructor for their MRAP driving course. Dates will not conflict with Officer Raskin's schedule and there will be no negative impact on staffing. Officer Raskin will gain additional knowledge and skills in this position that can be brought back to WHPS staff and Lakes Area SWAT Team members

10. Updated Terms of Duration in the Joint Powers Agreement for West Hennepin Public Safety Department

An update to the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) revising the duration of the agreement to five years upon its execution and automatically renewing for a three-year period thereafter was presented at the December 16, 2024, commission meeting for signatures. After both cities signed the updated JPA Director Kroells was asked to update outdated language in it, which he did. Changes included updating Chairman to Chair, Vice Chairman to Vice Chair, Clerk to City Administrator and removing both city administrators as authorized check signors in section 9c. If the commission agrees to the current updates, it will be forwarded to both cities for final approval. Motion by DeLuca, seconded by McCoy, to accept the changes and forward to the cities for signatures.

11. Corporate Authorization Resolution 2025-0408-01

Corporate Authorization Resolution 2025-0408-01 replaces Gary Kroells with Matt DuRose and Andrew Burak with Mike DeLuca and Brad Spencer for Marvin Johnson. Line 7 will be added to state that both city administrators are being removed as signors on all of WHPS bank accounts. Once signed by Director Kroells and Chair Spencer a copy will be forwarded to Bank of Maple Plain along with a copy of these minutes. They will then update bank signature cards. The commissioners and Director DuRose will be notified when the updated cards are ready to be signed at the bank. Motion by McCoy, seconded by DeLuca, to approve Corporate Authorization Resolution 2025-0408-01 with the addition of line 7 stating the city administrators will no longer have authority to sign checks on WHPS' bank accounts. All voted aye. Motion carried.

SUBJECT: APRIL 2025 ACTIVITY REPORT

The purpose of this report is to give the reader a quick overview of the activities of the Public Safety Department each month. It also compares monthly and year-to-date information to the reader.

The report is broken down into five categories, as defined by the Criminal Justice Reporting System.

CRIMINAL-- Criminal is broken down into Part I and Part II crimes.

Part I includes crimes against persons versus crimes against property; criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery assault, aggravated assault, burglary -breaking or entering, larceny-theft, larceny analysis, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Part II includes other assaults, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, buying, receiving, possession; vandalism, weapons, carrying, possessing, etc.; prostitution and commercialized vice, sex offenses; drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family and children, driving under the influence, liquor laws, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, all other offenses, suspicion, curfew and loitering laws - persons under 18; and runaways - persons under 18.

TRAFFIC-- Includes violations of the road and driving laws.

PART III-- Lost and Found: Includes lost and found persons, animals, and property, and stalled and abandoned vehicles.

PART IV-- Casualties: Includes all motor vehicle crashes, boating, and snowmobile; public home occupational accidents, fires, suicides, sudden deaths, burning permits, and burning violations.

PART V-- Miscellaneous Public: Includes open doors, gun permit applications, suspicious activities, animal complaints, motorist assists, alarm calls, parking complaints, house checks, driving complaints, civil matters, family disputes, department assists.

The balance of the report shows the total number of incidents handled, miles driven and how the Public Safety Department received calls. If anyone should desire more detailed statistical data, please contact my office.



April 2025 Activity Report

Year to Date Activity Report

At the end of April 2025, West Hennepin Public Safety (WHPS) handled year-to-date a total of 1,574 incident complaints. For the month of April; 218 incidents occurred in the City of Independence and 121 in the City of Maple Plain.

The Criminal Part I and Part II cases for both cities have been highlighted for your review on the attached documents.

Vehicle in Ditch April 1

3700 block CR 92, Independence. Rec'd call of a vehicle in the ditch, driver still in the vehicle. Officer arrived on scene and found front end of the vehicle in the ditch but the back tires still on the roadway. Driver was given a ride home where she worked on calling for a tow.

Burn Violation-Warning April 3

1500 Prairieland Ave, Maple Plain. While on patrol, officer observed a fire taller than the parties standing around it. Two Individuals were located near the fire, one heavily intoxicated. Both parties were identified, warned about the current burn restriction in place, and advised not to let the fire grow to that size again.

Scam April 4

1800 block Howard Ave, Maple Plain. Caller reported a person on the phone asking for personal financial information and telling him to go to his bank and withdraw funds. Caller realized it was a scam and did not send money to the caller. Caller's adult daughter on scene assisted with cancelling all credit cards. They were advised on further actions to take to protect caller's information.

Welfare Check April 5

4400 block Lake Sarah Rd, Independence. Request received for a welfare check on a female who had been in an auto accident several months ago, has been bedridden since the accident and was not healing properly. North Ambulance arrived on scene and transported her. Unknown what hospital she was transported to.

Wire Down April 5

1800 block Baker Park Rd, Maple Plain. Rec'd call of wire down. Officer responded and found a telephone line hanging down from the pole. There was no danger to the public. Frontier was called to respond.

4th Degree DWI April 6

Cty Rd 11 and Cty Rd 92, Independence. While on patrol the officer observed vehicle violate several traffic violations and initiated a traffic stop. The driver performed poorly on SFST and was placed under arrest for DWI. He was transported to the police department where a search warrant was obtained. Driver gave a urine sample and was then transported to Rockford. 4th Degree DWI charges pending urine test results.

Animal Complaint April 7

2000 block Cty Rd 90, Independence. Caller reported being in a park and lost a small dog she was watching. She later called back and found the dog stuck in the creek and as able to rescue it.

Hit Deer April 9

Cty Rd 6 and Nelson Rd, Independence. Caller reported she was eastbound Cty Rd 6 when a deer ran out of the ditch and struck the driver's side of her vehicle. Officer responded and moved the dead deer to the shoulder of the roadway. Photos were taken of the driver's vehicle and officer assisted removing the sideview mirror as it was dangling from wires. Officer called a party on a deer kill list who agreed to take the deer and was issued a permit for it.

GM B-Card Violation April 10

Hwy 12 and Pioneer Ave, Maple Plain. Traffic stop initiated for speed. Officer smelled marijuana coming from within the vehicle. Driver admitted smoking marijuana before leaving work and having marijuana in the vehicle. Officer also observed an open bottle of vodka behind the passenger seat. Driver sat in the back of the squad while a vehicle search was performed. A marijuana joint, butts and a pipe with burnt residue and a half-consumed bottle of vodka were located and seized. Driver had a no use of alcohol or drugs restriction, was advised an investigation for the marijuana use regarding his license restriction would be performed and if it constitutes a violation he would be charged by complaint.

Damage to Property

April 11

700 block Cty Rd 92, Independence. Report taken of a mailbox that was struck while homeowner was out of town. There was no evidence left at the scene. Estimated \$100 damage. No suspects or leads.

Citation April 12

Hwy 12 and Maple Ave, Maple Plain. Officer observed driver of a vehicle holding a cell phone and looking down at it and up at the road. Vehicle pulled over for the squad, but suspect was slow to stop and seemed unaware he was being stopped. Driver did stop and admitted holding his phone to disconnect GPS coming from Apple Valley. Driver was cited for holding a wireless device.

Fall April 13

4400 block Cty Rd 92, Independence. An officer responded to a party who'd fallen off a horse and was complaining of severe lower leg pain. The officer observed a deformity in her leg and her ankle was offset but she did have feeling in her foot and toes. West Suburban Fire took over medical care and the officer was cleared to leave when paramedics arrived.

Heart April 14

1500 block Howard Ave, Maple Plain. Report received of a male not feeling right and had recently had a change in meds. Patient was stable and monitored until paramedics arrived on scene, took over treatment and transported to a hospital.

Abandoned Snowmobile April 15



May 2025 Activity Report

Year to Date Activity Report

At the end of May 2025, West Hennepin Public Safety (WHPS) handled year-to-date a total of 2,115 incident complaints, which represents a 16% increase in incident complaints compared to year-to-date 2024. For the month of May; 323 incidents occurred in the City of Independence and 143 in the City of Maple Plain.

The Criminal Part I and Part II cases for both cities have been highlighted for your review on the attached documents.

Lockout May 2



At the end of June 2025, West Hennepin Public Safety (WHPS) handled year-to-date a total of 2,601 incident complaints, which represents a 19% increase in incident complaints compared to year-to-date 2024. For the month of June; 284 incidents occurred in the City of Independence and 148 in the City of Maple Plain.

The Criminal Part I and Part II cases for both cities have been highlighted for your review on the attached documents.

Arrest June 1

Intersection of Highway 12 and County Road 92 N, Independence. Officers stopped a vehicle for driving violations. Driver denied drinking alcohol but showed signs of impairment. Due to her needing a walker for a medical condition, she was not asked to perform roadside field sobriety tests. Ultimately, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the police department where she provided an evidentiary breath sample of 0.20. Driver will be charged with 3rd Degree DWI pending formal complaint.

Vandalism June 4

Intersection of Highway 12 and Baker Park Road, Maple Plain. Officer was dispatched to take a report of vandalism at the railway underpass. Officer arrived and observed vulgar writing as well as many pieces of evidence. Further investigation found this involves an ongoing dispute between students. School and parents were made aware, and report forwarded to railroad company for restitution and clean up.

Fire June 5

5000 block of Perkinsville Road, Independence. Officers were dispatched to what was initially reported as a house fire but was a lawn mower on fire. Reporting party had advised the lawn mower exploded. Smoke was observed in the area. Officers and Maple Plain Fire arrived on scene and were able to extinguish the fire.

Suspicious Activity

June 6

4900 block of Highway 12, Maple Plain. Officer was dispatched to a report of an individual tampering with a light pole. Officer arrived on scene and spoke to the individual who advised they were using the power outlet for charging.

Suspicious Activity June 7

3000 block of Independence Road, Independence. Officers were dispatched to a possible burglary. Reporting parties were kids home alone who advised they heard footsteps in the house. Officers responded and the interior of the house was cleared. Nothing out of the ordinary was located. Parents arrived home a short time later.

Welfare Check

1500 block of Rainbow Avenue, Maple Plain. Officer was dispatched to a report of a five-year-old in the middle of the road. While officers were responding, it was reported the child was reunited with parents. Officer verified with the father everything was okay.

Arrest June 9

Intersection of County Road 90 and Quass Cut-Off, Independence. Officer observed a vehicle back up in its lane while waiting for a stoplight. The vehicle then stopped in the lane after continuing through the stoplight. Multiple traffic infractions were observed, and a traffic stop was initiated. Officer spoke to the driver who admitted to consuming alcohol. Ultimately, the driver performed SFSTs and refused the preliminary breath test. Driver was arrested and booked where he provided an evidentiary breath sample of 0.14. He was released with a citation for 4th degree DWI.

Welfare Check June 10

4900 block of Highway 12, Maple Plain. Officer was dispatched to check the welfare of an individual lying in the grass and not moving. Officer arrived on scene and spoke to the individual who was severely intoxicated. The subject made suicidal comments and was ultimately placed on an emergency hold. He provided a breath sample which indicated 0.336. North Memorial Paramedics arrived and transported the patient to the hospital.

Civil Matter June 11

2000 block of South Lake Shore Drive, Independence. Officer was dispatched to a theft report where the reporting party advised her son took 10-15 guns from her safe. She advised all the guns in the safe were hers. Officers spoke to her son who advised the guns are his and provided text messages from his mother saying, "I don't own guns" and asked if he wants the moving company to move the safes. Officers determined no crime has been committed.

County Road 6 & County Road 110, Independence. Officer initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle for missing taillight lens. While speaking with the driver, signs of impairment were observed and admitted to recent meth and mushroom use. The vehicle then fled and a pursuit ensued and ended with a Pursuit Intervention Technique by assisting agencies in Minnetonka at 394/494. The driver was arrested for fleeing in a motor vehicle and transported to Hennepin County Jail. Charges pending toxicology.

A large amount of empty and open alcohol bottles and cans and marijuana were observed inside one of the vehicles. Driver was placed under arrest and transported to the police department where the driver provided an evidentiary breath sample of .16 BAC. The driver was transported to Hennepin County Jail, and booked for 2nd degree DWI, no insurance, DAR and unregistered motor vehicle.

Arrest July 18

5200 block of Main St, Maple Plain. Officers were called to a residence for a possible domestic. After speaking with both parties, one was placed under arrest and transported to Hennepin County Jail and booked for domestic assault.

Welfare Check June 20

Intersection of Highway 12 and County Road 90, Independence. Officer was dispatched to a welfare check of a male walking along Highway 12. Male was described as elderly and not wearing a shirt. Officer arrived in the area and spoke to the male who advised he was just out for a walk and enjoying the weather. Officer suggested a safer walking route.

Traffic Complaint June 20

Intersection of County Road 110 and County Road 6, Independence. Officer was dispatched to a traffic complaint where a vehicle was swerving all over the road. Officer located the suspect vehicle and initiated a traffic stop and spoke to the driver who advised he was eating pizza. Driver was warned about his driving conduct.

Welfare Check June 21

5300 block of Highway 12, Maple Plain. Officer was dispatched to check the welfare of a female who was walking in the middle of Highway 12. Officer arrived on scene and was familiar with the female who frequently walks the highway. Female was transported back to her residents where the officer confirmed her boyfriend was home.

1500 block of Howard Avenue, Maple Plain. Officer was dispatched to a loud music complaint. Officers arrived on scene and could hear music before approaching the residence. Officers knocked on the door, but no one answered. Officers noted there was another complaint two days prior for the same violation. Intersection of County Road 92 and Highway 12, Independence. Officer was dispatched to a property damage crash. It was reported Vehicle 1 was rearended by Vehicle 2. Driver 1 advised he wanted to slow down as he was driving over the posted speed limit, so he began braking and that's

when the crash occurred. Driver 2 alleged Driver 1 had passed him in the merge lane, made an offensive hand gesture, then braked aggressively causing the crash. Due to conflicting stories and no witnesses, no citations were issued.

Subject agreed to be transported to the hospital by North Memorial Paramedics.

The reporting party is elderly and was swindled by indications of a fake unauthorized transaction notification from PayPal. Eventually, the scammers convinced the victim there were unpaid charges and the victim had to withdraw cash to be deposited into cryptocurrency kiosks around the metro. The total loss was \$4,340. Forwarded to investigations.

Utility Problem June 29

4900 block of South Lake Shore Drive, Independence. Officer was dispatched to a tree on a powerline. It was confirmed there were no sparks or fire. Xcel Energy was notified and Independence Public Works requested we mark the area. Officers put cones and reflective signs up to warn drivers.

Intersection of Joyce Street and Prairieland Avenue, Maple Plain. Officers were dispatched to kids on ATV's and Minibikes racing up the street. Officers arrived on scene and were unable to locate them. The officer advised him to call back if it continues.





Budget Introduction

The following is West Hennepin Public Safety's (WHPS) 2026 proposed budget. Upon approval by the West Hennepin Public Safety Police Commission, the final 2026 budget will be forwarded to the cities of Maple Plain and Independence.

The 2026 budget proposal reflects the goals and objectives that have been given to WHPS to operate within. Our primary objectives are:

- 24 hour/7 days per week police coverage for the communities of Maple Plain and Independence
- Performing our own investigations of crimes that occur within the jurisdictions of Maple Plain and Independence
- Active participation in the West Metro Drug Task Force
- Traffic and narcotics enforcement
- Provide emergency management services and planning for both Maple Plain and Independence
- Work in coordination with Maple Plain and West Suburban Fire Departments, which provide fire coverage for our jurisdiction
- Operation of our volunteer Reserve Officer Program
- Community policing strategies and community engagement
- Members of the Lake Minnetonka SWAT Team
- Collaboration with local, state, and federal partners

The team's mission is: **To protect and serve the citizens of Maple Plain and Independence in a professional and compassionate manner**. We strive every day to achieve this mission with excellence.

Our core values serve as a foundation for WHPS' vision and form the basis of all functions of WHPS as we fulfill our mission:

Honor: We will conduct ourselves in a manner that brings honor to ourselves, the

department, and the community.

Courage: We will have the courage to do what is right and to stand against what is wrong.

Common Sense: We will apply common sense to the difficult decisions we must make.

Respect & Dignity: We will respect the individual rights, human dignity and the value of all members

of the community and the department.

Loyalty: We will provide the highest quality of law enforcement service to the community

with the goal of enhancing the quality of life.

Fairness: We will treat all individuals fairly and equally with compassion.

Trust: We will conduct ourselves professionally, serving as role models for the

community.

2026 Budget Proposal

The proposed budget being submitted to the Police Commission is \$2,954,640. This represents an increase of \$271,664, or 10% from the FY25 budget. After applying projected income of \$201,000, the cities' share of the budget is proposed at \$2,753,640, which represents 93.2% of the total budget. The funding formula for 2026 is 70.39% for the City of Independence and 29.61% for the City of Maple Plain. The City of Independence's cost share is \$1,938,245 and the City of Maple Plain's cost share is \$815,395.

The year-over-year increase can be attributed to:

- 1. Three percent salary increases for police officers and staff
- 2. Liability, worker's compensation, and health insurance cost increases
- 3. Scheduled technology and equipment replacement planning.
- 4. Reduced projected income related to one-time Public Safety Aid funding used to fund 11th officer
- 5. Increased estimated costs of needed goods and services


Additional expenses will be generated by mandated employer-related costs associated with the Paid Family Leave Act. These costs are not known at this time as we are still trying to understand the law and it's budgetary impacts. Cost projections should be available in the next couple of weeks.

PERSONNEL

As with any organization's budget, personnel related costs represent a significant portion of expense, and WHPS is no different. The proposed 2026 budget shows personnel related expenses to be approximately 77% of the overall expenses. This includes salary, health and dental benefits, overtime, fringe benefit contributions and any medical disability insurance that WHPS is required to pay. A portion of the health insurance expenses are reimbursable and are shown in the projected income section of the budget.

The rising costs of insurance and other employee benefits, paired with a 3% salary increase for staff are the leading causes of increase to personnel spending in this budget. While making no changes to our medical benefits for 2026, other than a required increase to a \$3,300 deductible, our premiums increased by 13.9%.

Our employees are our most valued asset and we must continue to provide value and incentives to retain them. The costs of hiring and training new staff far outweigh what it should cost to keep employees engaged and motivated in their work.

SALARY

The salary portion of the budget includes 11 officers, 2 administrative personnel, and funding for part-time police officers to supplement staffing, where needed and appropriate. Staff will be receiving an agreed upon 3% salary increase in 2026. This increase and step increases for several staff members are the reason for the nearly \$96,000 increase in the salary expense category.

HEALTH BENEFITS

Healthcare representative Bill Singer from AT Group and I reviewed options available for WHPS employees. No changes were made in 2026 with the current medical plan. WHPS employees are currently covered with a HealthPartners Open Access 3200/6400 HSA plan. This will change to 3300/6600 HSA plan in 2026 to bring our plan into compliance according to Bill. WHPS' health care medical benefits will increase by \$73,459, which includes approximately \$28,000 in fully reimbursed COBRA expenses. Additionally, the disability insurance expense paid by WHPS is reimbursed through the State of MN.

While the year over year increase is typically seen in the 7-9% range, the higher increase can be attributed to 2023 legislation that added costs and coverage for health care plans. When removing the COBRA expense, WHPS health benefits expenses show a 14% increase from FY25.

PERA

PERA Employer contributions for the Police and Fire Fund in 2026 will remain at 17.7% for the employer and 11.8% contributions for the employees. The Coordinated Plan will remain at 7.5% for the employer and 6.5% contributions for the employees. Due to proposed payroll increases for our employees, PERA will increase by \$24,230 for 2026.

COMMODITIES

The commodities portion of the budget contains estimates for expenditures on the goods and services needed to accomplish the goals and objectives of the organization while exceeding community standards and expectations.

The office budget is seeing a proposed \$17,125 (22.2%) increase due to adjustments made to office supplies, cleaning, and utilities based on historical spending and 2026 cost estimates. The increase in Dues/Subscriptions can be attributed to several things, including:

- Field Training Officer documentation software was added in 2025
- The Flock camera subscription (\$6000) was previously paid with the Crime Prevention Fund
- Professional association dues for Command and Administrative staff
- Lexipol policy manual subscription (\$6000) was moved here from training

Additional increases include:

- The telephone budget plans for the installation of fiber internet in 2026
- Weekly cleaning cost increase

The services budget is seeing a proposed \$39,550 (10.4%) increase primarily due to increased costs in our technology. This includes a cost increase for IT Support through Element and planned network hardware and software replacements.

WHPS currently contracts with a cooperative in Cologne for fuel, but we will seek out competitive fleet pricing from the new Maple Plain KwikTrip in 2026.

Worker's compensation and liability insurance costs have not been determined for 2026.


FORMULA PROJECTION FOR 2026

In 2026, the shared services formula for the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) with WHPS is set at 29.61% for Maple Plain and 70.39% for Independence. This year shows an increase of 0.42% for Independence and a reduction of this same amount for Maple Plain.

The table below shows the history of the formula breakdown over the past ten years. It shows a consistent pattern with Maple Plain around 31% and Independence around 69%.

CONSIDERATIONS

In compiling this budget, there is recognition of the impact of decreased projected income while increasing spending. There are a number of considerations that may reasonably limit the impact that include:

- There may be salary savings if the soon to be made full-time police hire is not an experienced lateral candidate
- There are additional miscellaneous reimbursable revenues that will be sought, but are not guaranteed so they are not factored into the projected income
- We are actively seeking out alternative revenue sources to aid in the purchase of safety equipment that will need to be replaced in the near future. The current inventory of equipment is reaching end of life status and should be replaced on a regular basis.

There are challenges that have been identified in the coming years that will need to be addressed as well. These challenges include adequately funding the Separation Allowance account to accommodate potential separations from WHPS over the next 3-7 years. Additionally, the Capital Improvement Fund shows a significant deficiency beginning in 2028. Although there is time to plan and mitigate both of these challenges, both will come with substantial costs.

CONCLUSION

I would ask the Police Commission to review and provide feedback on the proposed 2026 budget. This budget will meet our primary objectives of providing public safety services to the citizens of Maple Plain and Independence.
