Approval of September 28, 2021, Police Commission Meeting Minutes

Meeting minutes have been included for your review and approval.

September, October, November and December 2021 Activity Reports

Between January 1 and December 31, 2021, West Hennepin Public Safety (WHPS) handled 4,824 incident complaints: 1,471 in Maple Plain, 3,157 in Independence.

The Criminal Part I and Part II cases for both cities have been highlighted for your review in the attached documents. See attached September, October, November, and December 2021 Activity Reports/Director's News and Notes for highlighted cases. Director Kroells will highlight a few cases if requested.

Approval of September, October, November and December 2021 Claims

September, October, November, and December 2021 claims are attached for review and approval.

2021 YTD Budget & Cash Asset Report

In reviewing the 2021 Budget vs. Actual reports from January 1 to December 31, 2021, WHPS has received \$1,894,678 or 98.66% in income with expenses of \$1,863,027 or 97.01% This is a difference of \$31,651, subject to audit.

Balances of other accounts are listed for your review: Crime Prevention \$7,896; Reserves \$5,434; Capital Outlay \$57,907; Severance \$61,615, Military Leave PERA \$22,728, Federal Forfeiture \$31,352.

Highway 12 Updates

Construction at Highway 12 and County Road 92 has come to a halt as crews have shut down for the winter months. County Road 92 and Valley Road have both been closed North of Highway 12 at this time. Construction crews will be back onsite in late March or early April 2022 to complete the intersection improvements for Highway 12 at County Road 92 N. This intersection will be completely closed with a significant detour until construction is completed in October of 2022. WHPS will work closely with partners in MnDOT, Hennepin County, City of Independence and City of Maple Plain to coordinate a safe and hassle-free detour for 2022.

The design phase for Highway 12 from County Road 90 to Delano is still moving forward with KLJ and MnDOT leading the project. The open house data is currently being evaluated and a second open house will occur in March of 2022. MnDOT advised at the second open house they will present additional build options for the public to view to help narrow down the project design. WHPS will continue to attend these meetings along with Mark Kaltsas from City of Independence to provide input on the future design through Independence.

Brooklyn Center Mutual Aid Reimbursement/West Command Mobile Field Force

At the request of the police commission a letter was mailed to Brooklyn Center requesting mutual aid reimbursement for equipment and overtime spent by WHPS to protect their police department and city during the riots from April 11 to 24, 2021. I am proud to announce City of Brooklyn Center approved the request and reimbursed WHPS.

Additionally, our West Command Mobile Field Force Operations continue to develop, recruit, prepare and train for additional calls in the west metro area involving civil unrest. Mobile Field Force training was conducted in Minnetonka on November 14, 2021, in preparation for the Kim Potter trial. On December 21, 2021, our officers on West Command Mobile Field Force were placed on standby in Brooklyn Center for the Kim Potter verdict. They were not needed due to the lack of civil unrest and were released from service after a few hours.

Arbitrator Body Worn Camera Update

WHPS' body worn cameras finally arrived in late November and have been recently installed in every patrol vehicle. We are in the final steps of hardware and software updates along with final training for our officers. I expect the body worn cameras to be fully operational by the end of January 2022.

WHPS will follow the state guidelines and mandates set forth in Minnesota State Statute 13.385, Portable Recording Systems. Since we already have portable recording systems with our weapon mounted cameras, I do not anticipate any issues following policy and state law to implement our body worn cameras.

Military Deployment Update

Our deployed officer is close to returning to duty for WHPS. The return to duty exams and fit for duty testing have been scheduled. Once completed it is expected the officer will return to full duty on January 17, 2022. Due to the length of his deployment and time away from law enforcement he will be placed on a two-week field training or reintegration program at WHPS.

Use of Deadly Force Policy Change

As mentioned at our last police commission meeting, there are still major concerns among police chiefs and all Minnesota law enforcement agencies about the changes to the use-of-deadly-force statute that went into effect on March 1, 2021.

As a reminder on September 13, 2021, Ramsey County District Judge Leonardo Castro ruled in favor of law enforcement finding the new law passed in 2020 that requires officers to cite with specificity the reasons for using deadly force were suspended. In a sense, violating the officers' rights to not incriminate or testify against themselves. Effective immediately, the Use of Deadly Force Statute 609.066 that was in effect before March 1, 2021, is now in effect until this case is resolved. The judge has ordered the case be heard in court within the next 60 days. Due to this change a memo was sent to all WHPS officers that WHPS is reverting to our former policy before March 1, 2021.

On December 17, 2021, Ramsey County District Judge Castro rendered his final decision on the use of deadly force statute 609.066. He ruled the below line is unconstitutional:

(i) Can be articulated with specificity by the law enforcement officer;

What this means is this means is the officer will not be compelled to forfeit their 5th Amendment Constitutional right to remain silent.

The new statute will read:

(i) Can be articulated with specificity.

WHPS policy 300 Use of Deadly Force has been updated to follow the current law and ruling.

2021 Yearend Report for West Metro Drug Task Force

Hennepin County Sergeant Chris Nybeck is the supervising agent for all operations of the West Metro Drug Task Force. He provided the attached year end numbers for the West Metro Drug Task Force. As you can see, we have a very busy West Metro Drug Task Force agency. The distribution and use of methamphetamine and cocaine are significant areas of concern for our communities. See attached.

Squad Updates

At the August 3, 2021, police commission meeting it was approved for WHPS to find a slightly used or new vehicle for our investigator vehicle. After searching the used vehicle market for over four months it was determined it would be more cost affordable to purchase a new vehicle under the state contract vs. trying to find a used vehicle during these times of massive inflation with used vehicles. Waconia Dodge currently has state bid pricing, so a new 2022 Dodge Durango was ordered for the price of \$36,469. This vehicle should arrive at WHPS in about six to seven months at the earliest. Once it arrives it will be set up at Action Radio and the former investigator vehicle will be sold at auction.

Accept Resignation/Retirement for Administrative Assistant

On November 29, 2021, I was provided a letter of resignation from Administrative Assistant Lynda Franklin. It is with a heavy heart I accepted her resignation after her 22 years of outstanding work at WHPS. Administrative Assistant Franklin has been a strong advocate for community engagement with our public safety department and is committed to service before self. Franklin is now ending her career as a public servant and ready to enjoy her retirement. She will be deeply missed and will be hard to replace. See attached resignation letter.

Administrative Assistant Franklin has requested no open house or event be planned in her honor due to concerns over Covid-19. Her retirement announcement is being placed in the city newsletters allowing residents and staff to say their final goodbyes to Lynda at our lobby window.

Upon learning of Administrative Assistant Franklin's retirement, WHPS immediately began the job search for her replacement. A job posting was placed in numerous government postings with an application deadline of December 31, 2021. We received tremendous interest in the position with 47 applications received. After our internal scoring and evaluation 11 candidates were offered a first interview on January 5th and 6th, 2022. After the interviews were concluded six candidates were offered a second interview, which is scheduled for Wednesday, January 12, 2022. Those interviews will be conducted by Sergeant Rick Denneson and multiple administrative assistants from the Lakes Area. It is anticipated the top two candidates will have a final chief's interview and one applicant will be provided a conditional job offer pending a successful background and psychological exam.

Abdo will be conducting WHPS' 2021 audit on February 3rd and 4th 3, 2022. The results of the audit will be presented at our next police commission meeting.

WHPS is currently working on our 2021 annual report. It will be completed by our next police commission meeting in April.

WHPS will be hosting Citizens Police Academy this spring, February 17 - April 7, 2022. A few participants are already showing interest. I've included a brochure in your police commission packets. I recommend anyone who's never attended to register for this informative and fun class.

[Liability Coverage Waiver Form](#)

The police commission has always elected to waive the monetary tort on liability coverage. Current law allows a person to only receive \$500,000 per event, even if the claim should be much higher. West Hennepin has waived the monetary tort to not cap its liability in the event a claim is filed. Doing so would save legal costs for a lawsuit over \$500,000. Official action is needed from the police commission documenting this action. Commissioner Maas-Kusske's signature is required as the Chairperson. I would ask that the police commission to approve waiving the monetary tort and Commissioner Maas-Kusske sign it.

[Animal Impounds](#)

Earlier in 2021 Crossroads Animal Shelter provided notice to all cities they are no longer accepting animal impounds from law enforcement agencies. This has been a huge struggle for all cities and law enforcement agencies in the west metro as there are very limited or no animal shelters willing to take animal impounds from law enforcement. The shelters that are willing to accept animal impounds are imposing a large contract from each city - more than \$500 per month per city. This is simply too expensive for both Maple Plain and Independence so I have been trying to find a suitable alternative without much success. I researched our animal impounds and learned WHPS was only bringing five or less dogs to Crossroads per year.

WHPS has partnered up with Medina, Orono, and Minnetrista to find an affordable solution for all cities. Orono Community Service Officer Mike Wocken has it taken upon himself to find a contract for

all four law enforcement agencies. Currently we are in the final stages of reviewing a short stay contract with Oak Ridge Kennels in Minnetrista. They are requesting \$1,200 per year from each agency with no boarding costs if the owners pick up their dogs within seven days. If the dogs are not picked up within seven days, they will request each agency to bring the impounded dog or dangerous dog to the Monticello Animal Shelter. Monticello Animal Shelter requires an annual contract from each city for \$250 dollars plus a \$21.48 daily boarding fee.

I would recommend WHPS handle the annual fees as one agency so as not to have Maple Plain and Independence have separate contracts that will cost more money. WHPS does not have these costs in our 2022 budget so I would ask both cities to reimburse WHPS the annual fees and each city would be responsible for the daily boarding fees at Monticello Animal Shelter for animals impounded at this facility.

WHPS will update each city on the final steps of this contract and will send separate invoices to each city as to cover fees associated with animal impounds.

MEETING MINUTES

1. Call to Order.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the West Hennepin Public Safety Board (WHPS) of Commissioners was called to order at 8 a.m. by Chairperson Marvin Johnson.

Present: Commissioner Mayor Marvin Johnson, Commissioner Mayor Julie Maas-Kusske, Commissioner Lynn Betts, Commissioner John DeLong, Director Gary Kroells, Recording Secretary Kim Curtis

Others Present: Maple Plain City Administrator Clarissa Hadler, Independence City Administrator Mark Kaltsas

Absent: None

Guests: Hennepin County Sheriff's Office Sergeant Chris Nybeck

2. Approval of the September 2, 2021, Commission Minutes

Motion by Maas-Kusske, seconded by Betts, to approve the September 2, 2021, commission minutes. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Guest speaker Hennepin County Sheriff's Office Sgt. Chris Nybeck was asked to address the police commission next.

3. 2021 Case Review for West Metro Drug Task Force – HCSO Sgt. Chris Nybeck

Sgt. Nybeck distributed a 2nd quarter 2021 summary of West Metro Drug Task Force cases. It detailed previous and current cases and drug statistics. He reviewed the cases with the police commissioners and answered questions.

4. Review of July 2021 Activity Reports

From January 1 through August 31, 2021, West Hennepin Public Safety (WHPS) has handled 3,269 incident complaints: 981 in Maple Plain, 2,156 in Independence. Criminal Part I and Part II cases were highlighted in the Activity Report. Maas-Kusske noted that there were a lot of theft cases at Gateway. Director Kroells explained that employee theft was suspected but no one had been caught yet. After employees were interviewed the thefts stopped but it's not known if the employee who committed the thefts still works there or not.

5. Review of August 2021 Claims

There were no questions regarding the claims. Motion by Betts, seconded by DeLong, to approve the August 2021 claims, subject to audit. All voted aye. Motion carried.

6. Review of 2021 YTD Budget and Cash Asset Report

In reviewing the 2021 Budget vs. Actual reports from January 1 to August 31, 2021, WHPS has received \$1,281,045 or 66.71% in income and has spent \$1,253,792 or 65.29%. This is a difference of \$27,252. Paid overtime is currently at \$30,000.

Balances of other accounts are: Crime Prevention \$29,261; Reserves \$7,187; Capital Outlay \$78,235; Severance \$61,615; Military Leave PERA \$16,761; Federal Forfeiture \$31,352.

Motion by Betts, seconded by Johnson, to approve the 2021 YTD Budget and Cash Asset Report. All voted aye. Motion carried.

7. Review of Accrued Vacation/Vacation/Comp/Sick Time

The accrued vacation, compensation and sick time reports were reviewed. There were no questions of the reports. Motion by Maas-Kusske, seconded by DeLong, to approve the 2021 YTD Accrued Vacation/Comp and Sick Time reports. All voted aye. Motion carried.

8. Items of Interest-Community Events

The following items of interest were reviewed:

Old Business

10. 2022 Budget

Director Kroells said the 2022 budget proposal has not changed since the Police Commission meeting on September 2, 2021. There is a 7.3% overall increase with 11% increase to the Cities of Independence and Maple Plain. WHPS has elected a \$3,000 individual/\$6,000 family high deductible health plan for employees in 2022.

Police commissioners discussed the proposal with their city councils after the September 2, 2021, Police Commission meeting. Maple Plain does not see any issues with the 2022 budget proposal but it won't be official until their city council meeting in

October. Motion by DeLong, seconded by Betts, to accept the budget presented. All voted aye. Motion carried.

DeLong noted he will not be on the police commission next year but feels both cities will need to meet to discuss future visions for WHPS. Johnson suggested scheduling a meeting after the fall elections. All agreed to meet at the beginning of 2022. Director Kroells suggested the meeting between the two cities be held in the spring of 2022 when WHPS hosts the swearing in ceremony for the newest officer Scott Isaacson.

11. Highway 12 Updates

The two Highway 12 projects at County Road 90 and from Baker Park Road to County Road 6 were completed on September 16, 2021. That same afternoon a ribbon cutting ceremony was held at the roundabout on Highway 12 at County Road 90. The roundabout was designed for future growth. There have been no crashes yet. Photos and news coverage can be seen at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=sfoY-5BXRbl>.

The next phase of construction will be on Highway 12 with County Road 92. Hennepin County is leading this project with Hoffman Construction. It officially began on Tuesday, September 22, 2021, at County Road 92 South. On Monday, September 27, 2021, County Road 92 South was closed and will remain closed for 30 days. Excavating will be done at various locations on the south side of Highway 12. Highway 12 will be widened at the south leg of the County Road 92 intersection and trees will be cleared where the bridge foundations will be installed.

When that is done, County Road 92 South will be opened and County Road 92 North will be closed from Highway 12 to Lake Sarah Road to prepare for the bridge construction. This section of County Road 92 North will remain closed until the project is completed in October 2022. Highway 12 will remain open during both construction phases but will close in April 2022 and remain closed until the project is completed in October 2022. Director Kroells emailed Hennepin County to put a temporary controlled intersection at County Roads 11 and 90.

The next phase will begin April 2022. It will be the design and development of a newly designed Highway 12 from County Road 90 to Delano. Director Kroells and Independence City Administrator Kaltsas continue to attend meetings to provide input into the future design. MnDOT will host a virtual open house later in the fall or winter and have three or four designs available for the public to review.

12. Mutual Aid Reimbursement Request to the City of Brooklyn Center

At the August 3, 2021, Police Commission meeting, Director Kroells was directed to draft a letter to City of Brooklyn Center requesting reimbursement for the mutual aid WHPS' officers provided through the West Command Mobile Field Force (WCMFF) due to the civil unrest that occurred in Brooklyn Center April 11-24, 2021. The reimbursement would cover the officers' overtime and WHPS' equipment that was used. Commissioners approved the draft letter for Director Kroells to sign and mail.

The UASI Committee made a recommendation to Hennepin County Emergency Management (HCEM) that Hennepin County police agencies who assisted Brooklyn Center should be reimbursed for less lethal munitions used during the civil unrest. This announcement was recently made by Hennepin County Chiefs of Police Association (HCCPA). Director Kroells completed the documentation and sent an invoice requesting reimbursement but it is unknown how much, if any, WHPS will be reimbursed. It is also anticipated that funding requests will exceed the grant allocations.

The WCMFF continues to develop, recruit, prepare and train for civil unrest call outs in the west metro area. They conducted a training exercise on August 11, 2021 at the Minneapolis Airport and have another one scheduled on November 14, 2021, in Minnetonka.

13. Body Camera Update

Body worn cameras have been ordered. Once received, the install in squad cars will begin and cameras will be issued to the officers. The system and cameras are expected to be up and running by the end of this year. State guidelines and mandates set forth in MSS 13.385, Portable Recording Systems, will be followed. WHPS already has portable weapon mounted cameras so Director Kroells does not anticipate any issues following police and state law in implementing the body worn cameras. WHPS will next be testing a rifle mounted camera.

14. Military Leave Update

Officer Raskin is currently on a 90-day military order. It is unknown when he will be released from duty and return to work at WHPS.

15. Use of Force Policy Change

Police chiefs are concerned on the ability to train all police officers regarding the new law and interpretation of the new statute. MN Chiefs of Police Association (MCPA) and MN Sheriffs' Association (MSA) asked legislators to change the effective date from March 1, 2021, to September 1, 2021. Their request was denied. Both of those organizations, along with MN Police and Peace Officers Association (MPPOA) and Law Enforcement Labor Services (LELS) filed a lawsuit against the State of Minnesota as they believe the new use of deadly force law is unconstitutional.

September 13, 2021, Ramsey County District Judge Leonardo Castro ruled in favor of law enforcement. He found that the new law passed in 2020 required officers to cite with specificity the reasons for using deadly force, which in a sense violates their rights to not incriminate or testify against themselves and is unconstitutional. The Use of Deadly Force Statute 609.066 that was in effect before March 1, 2021, is again in effect immediately until the case is resolved. Judge Castro ordered that the case be heard in court within the next 60 days. Director Kroells sent a memo to all WHPS officers that WHPS is reverting back to its former policy before March 1, 2021.

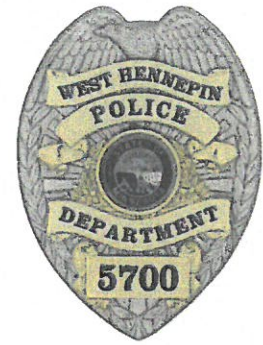

SUBJECT: September 2021 ACTIVITY REPORT

The purpose of this report is to give the reader a quick overview of the activities of the Public Safety Department each month. It also compares monthly and year-to-date information to the reader.

The report is broken down into five categories, as defined by the Criminal Justice Reporting System.

CRIMINAL-- Criminal is broken down into Part I and Part II crimes.

Part I includes crimes against persons versus crimes against property; criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery assault, aggravated assault, burglary -breaking or entering, larceny-theft, larceny analysis, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Part II includes other assaults, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, buying, receiving, possession; vandalism, weapons, carrying, possessing, etc.; prostitution and commercialized vice, sex offenses; drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family and children, driving under the influence, liquor laws, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, all other offenses, suspicion, curfew and loitering laws - persons under 18; and runaways - persons under 18.

TRAFFIC-- Includes violations of the road and driving laws.

PART III-- Lost and Found: Includes lost and found persons, animals, and property, and stalled and abandoned vehicles.

PART IV-- Casualties: Includes all motor vehicle accidents, boating, and snowmobile; public home occupational accidents, fires, suicides, sudden deaths, burning permits, and burning violations.

PART V-- Miscellaneous Public: Includes open doors, gun permit applications, suspicious activities, animal complaints, motorist assists, alarm calls, parking complaints, house checks, driving complaints, civil matters, family disputes, department assists.

The balance of the report shows the total number of incidents handled, miles driven and how the Public Safety Department received calls. If anyone should desire more detailed statistical data, please contact my office.

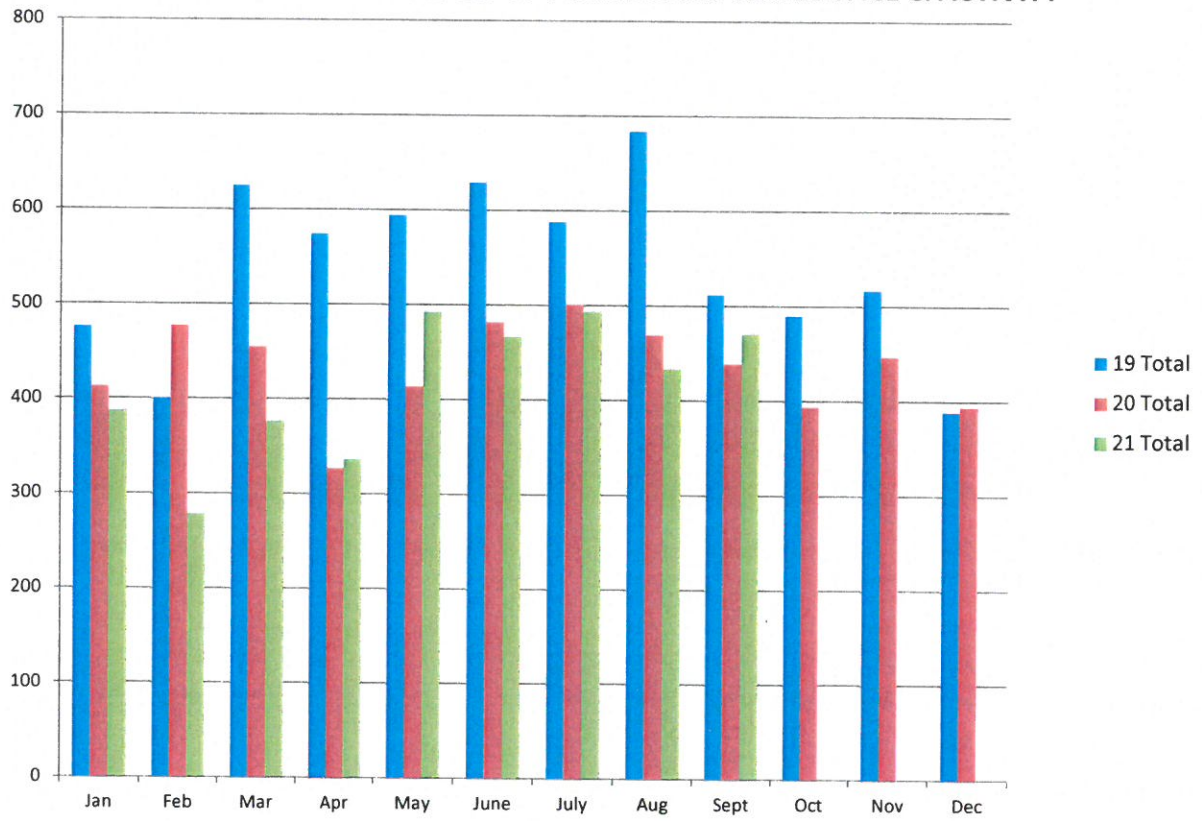

Year to Date Activity Report

At the end September 30, 2021, West Hennepin Public Safety (WHPS) handled year-to-date a total 3,740 incident complaints: For the month of September; 324 occurred in the City of Independence and 116 in the City of Maple Plain.

The Criminal Part I and Part II cases for both cities have been highlighted for your review on the attached documents.

Recent Highlighted Cases:

Gas Odor

Fatal Crash

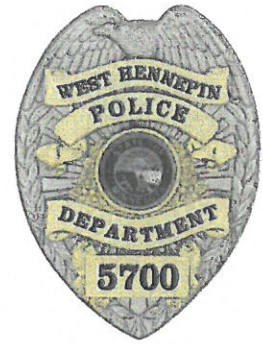

The purpose of this report is to give the reader a quick overview of the activities of the Public Safety Department each month. It also compares monthly and year-to-date information to the reader.

The report is broken down into five categories, as defined by the Criminal Justice Reporting System.

CRIMINAL-- Criminal is broken down into Part I and Part II crimes.

Part I includes crimes against persons versus crimes against property; criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery assault, aggravated assault, burglary -breaking or entering, larceny-theft, larceny analysis, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Part II includes other assaults, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, buying, receiving, possession; vandalism, weapons, carrying, possessing, etc.; prostitution and commercialized vice, sex offenses; drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family and children, driving under the influence, liquor laws, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, all other offenses, suspicion, curfew and loitering laws - persons under 18; and runaways - persons under 18.

TRAFFIC-- Includes violations of the road and driving laws.

PART III-- Lost and Found: Includes lost and found persons, animals, and property, and stalled and abandoned vehicles.

PART IV-- Casualties: Includes all motor vehicle accidents, boating, and snowmobile; public home occupational accidents, fires, suicides, sudden deaths, burning permits, and burning violations.

PART V-- Miscellaneous Public: Includes open doors, gun permit applications, suspicious activities, animal complaints, motorist assists, alarm calls, parking complaints, house checks, driving complaints, civil matters, family disputes, department assists.

The balance of the report shows the total number of incidents handled, miles driven and how the Public Safety Department received calls. If anyone should desire more detailed statistical data, please contact my office.

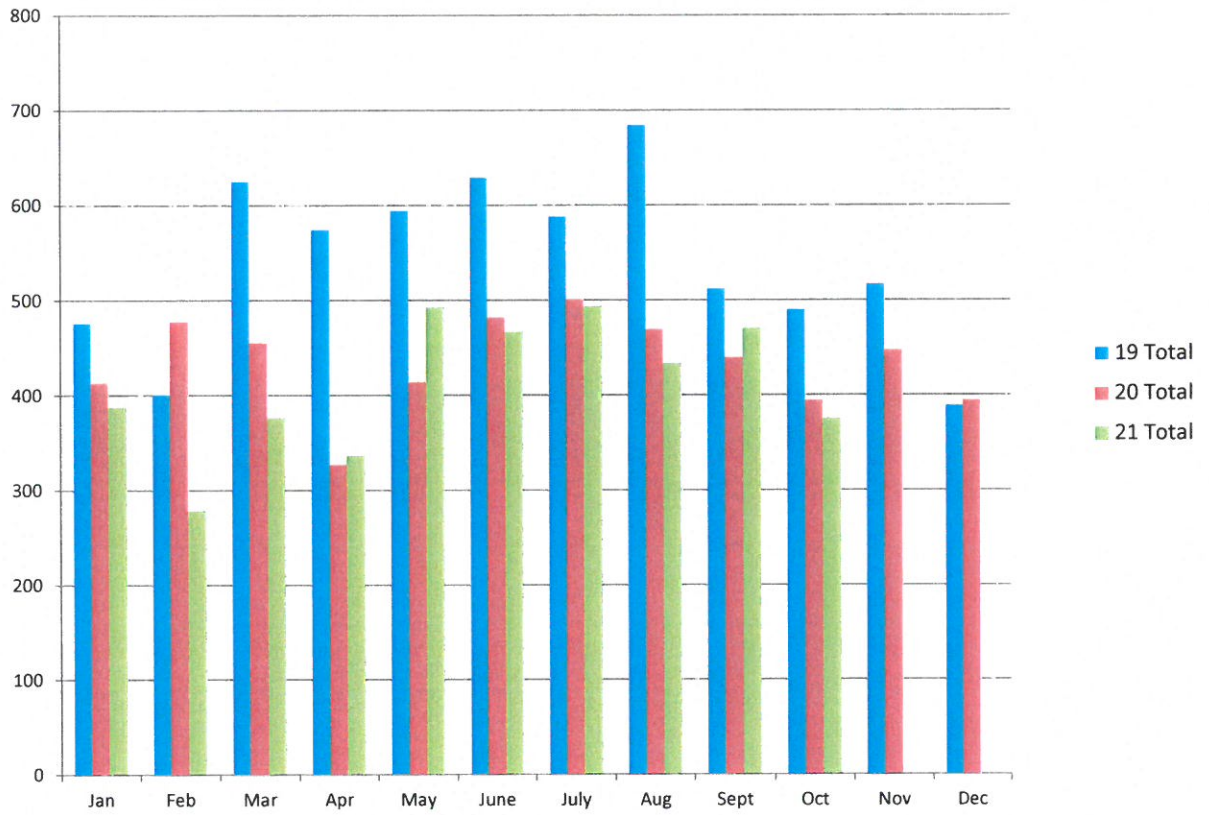

The purpose of this report is to give the reader a quick overview of the activities of the Public Safety Department each month. It also compares monthly and year-to-date information to the reader.

The report is broken down into five categories, as defined by the Criminal Justice Reporting System.

CRIMINAL-- Criminal is broken down into Part I and Part II crimes.

Part I includes crimes against persons versus crimes against property; criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery assault, aggravated assault, burglary -breaking or entering, larceny-theft, larceny analysis, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Part II includes other assaults, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, buying, receiving, possession; vandalism, weapons, carrying, possessing, etc.; prostitution and commercialized vice, sex offenses; drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family and children, driving under the influence, liquor laws, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, all other offenses, suspicion, curfew and loitering laws - persons under 18; and runaways - persons under 18.

TRAFFIC-- Includes violations of the road and driving laws.

PART III-- Lost and Found: Includes lost and found persons, animals, and property, and stalled and abandoned vehicles.

PART IV-- Casualties: Includes all motor vehicle accidents, boating, and snowmobile; public home occupational accidents, fires, suicides, sudden deaths, burning permits, and burning violations.

PART V-- Miscellaneous Public: Includes open doors, gun permit applications, suspicious activities, animal complaints, motorist assists, alarm calls, parking complaints, house checks, driving complaints, civil matters, family disputes, department assists.

The balance of the report shows the total number of incidents handled, miles driven and how the Public Safety Department received calls. If anyone should desire more detailed statistical data, please contact my office.

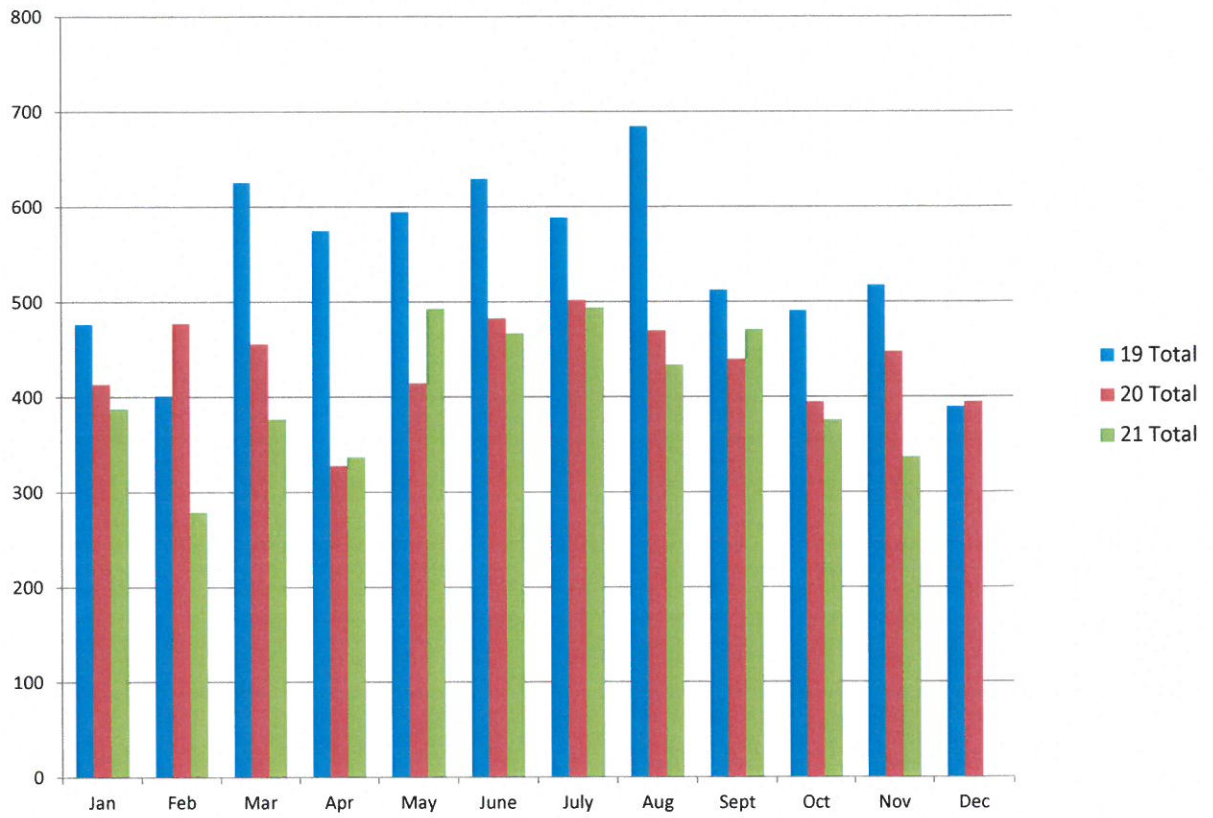

The report is broken down into five categories, as defined by the Criminal Justice Reporting System.

CRIMINAL-- Criminal is broken down into Part I and Part II crimes.

Part I includes crimes against persons versus crimes against property; criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery assault, aggravated assault, burglary -breaking or entering, larceny-theft, larceny analysis, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Part II includes other assaults, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, buying, receiving, possession; vandalism, weapons, carrying, possessing, etc.; prostitution and commercialized vice, sex offenses; drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family and children, driving under the influence, liquor laws, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, all other offenses, suspicion, curfew and loitering laws - persons under 18; and runaways - persons under 18.

TRAFFIC-- Includes violations of the road and driving laws.

PART III-- Lost and Found: Includes lost and found persons, animals, and property, and stalled and abandoned vehicles.

PART IV-- Casualties: Includes all motor vehicle accidents, boating, and snowmobile; public home occupational accidents, fires, suicides, sudden deaths, burning permits, and burning violations.

PART V-- Miscellaneous Public: Includes open doors, gun permit applications, suspicious activities, animal complaints, motorist assists, alarm calls, parking complaints, house checks, driving complaints, civil matters, family disputes, department assists.

The balance of the report shows the total number of incidents handled, miles driven and how the Public Safety Department received calls. If anyone should desire more detailed statistical data, please contact my office.

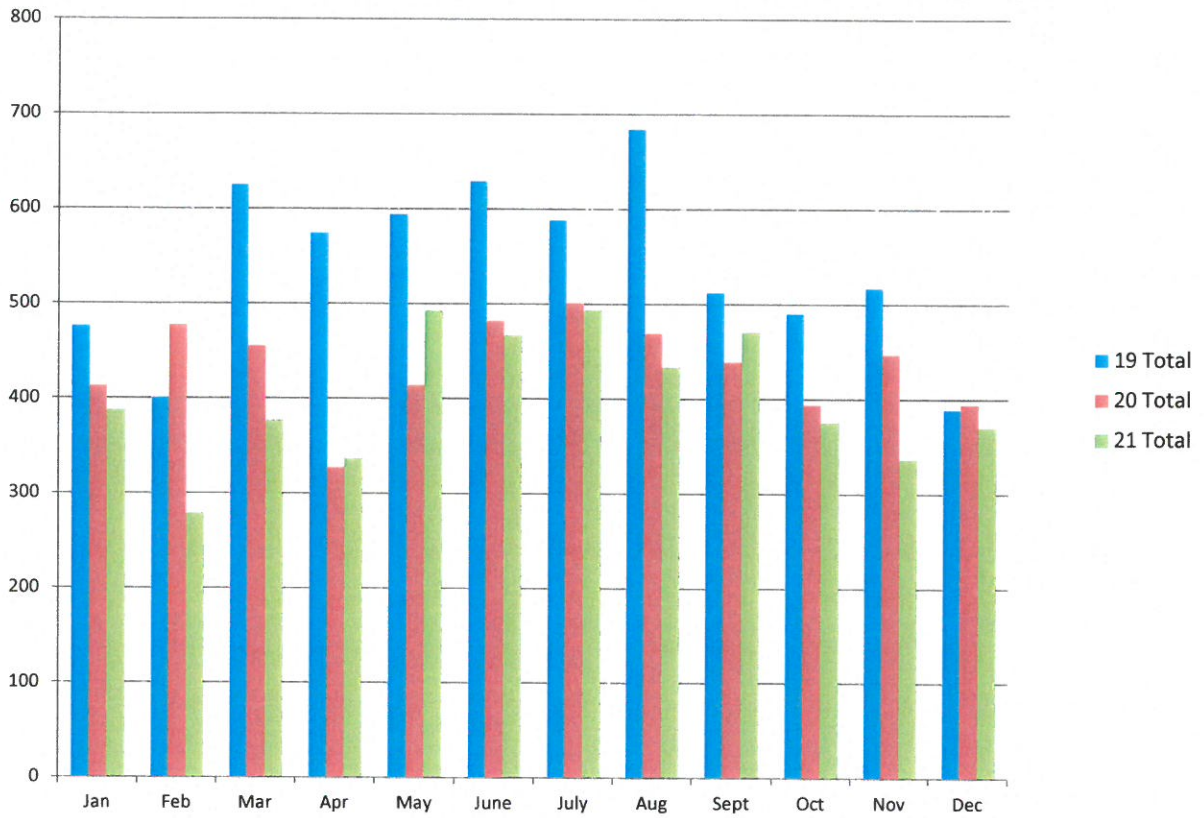

INVESTIGATIONS

CASE ONE

In May of 2021 a cocaine investigation in Minneapolis was initiated that resulted in the arrest of one individual, 13.5 kgs of cocaine and \$151,000. A follow up investigation resulted in the arrest and seizure of an additional 14 kgs of cocaine in Lakeville, MN

CASE TWO

In August of 2021 a cocaine investigation in St Paul and Minneapolis was initiated that resulted in the arrest of two individuals, 13.5 kgs of cocaine and \$140,000.

CASE THREE

Beginning in July of 2021 a methamphetamine investigation was initiated that spanned until current that has as of December 2021 resulted in the arrests of 4 individuals, 19 lbs of methamphetamine, 1lb of fentanyl and two handguns.

CASE FOUR

In July of 2021 two individuals were arrested for distributing heroin. As a result of this case 6 kgs of heroin was seized.

TASK FORCE OVERVIEW

The mission of the West Hennepin DTF is to provide a comprehensive and multi-jurisdictional effort to reduce drug trafficking and its harmful consequences and to provide effective drug awareness education through the coordination and resource sharing of its participating agencies. The WHDTF coordinates with Hennepin County, Medina, Minnetrista, Orono, and West Hennepin on narcotic, gang related activit and other violent crimes.

Some of the things that WHDTF can assist with are, vehicle trackers, cell phone extractions with a narcotic nexus, tracking and locating violent criminal suspects, over dose cases, narcotics related tips and community drug awareness education efforts.

West Hennepin Public Safety has announced the dates for the 2022 Citizens Police Academy. The Citizens Police Academy will start on February 17, 2022 and will end with graduation on April 7, 2022. The Academy runs for eight weeks, one day a week, Thursday nights, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 pm.

WHAT IS IT?

The Citizens Police Academy is a FREE 24-hour block of instruction designed to give citizens knowledge about how your police department operates, our policies, procedures, programs and challenges. In addition, you will be introduced to government officials and staff and learn about the responsibilities of their respective office. Participants in each session will commit to meeting 3 hours, one night a week for 8 weeks.

The Citizens Police Academy was designed to create a better understanding of law enforcement through education. The Citizens Police Academy participants are presented with realistic hands on information, which will help each participant better understand the police department functions. The classroom and hands on information covers: **DWI and Traffic Enforcement, home security, personal security, use of force, including deadly force which includes a demonstration of the Taser Gun and FATS training (firearms simulation), Hennepin County Dispatch Center, Court procedures including testifying before a Judge** and many other areas related to law enforcement. LIABILITY COVERAGE – WAIVER FORM

Members who obtain liability coverage through the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust (LMCIT) must complete and return this form to LMCIT before the member's effective date of coverage. Return completed form to your underwriter or email to pstech@lmc.org.

The decision to waive or not waive the statutory tort limits must be made annually by the member's governing body, in consultation with its attorney if necessary.

Members who obtain liability coverage from LMCIT must decide whether to waive the statutory tort liability limits to the extent of the coverage purchased. The decision has the following effects:

- *If the member does not waive the statutory tort limits, an individual claimant could recover no more than \$500,000 on any claim to which the statutory tort limits apply. The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would be limited to \$1,500,000. These statutory tort limits would apply regardless of whether the member purchases the optional LMCIT excess liability coverage.*
- *If the member waives the statutory tort limits and does not purchase excess liability coverage, a single claimant could recover up to \$2,000,000 for a single occurrence (under the waive option, the tort cap liability limits are only waived to the extent of the member's liability coverage limits, and the LMCIT per occurrence limit is \$2,000,000). The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would also be limited to \$2,000,000, regardless of the number of claimants.*
- *If the member waives the statutory tort limits and purchases excess liability coverage, a single claimant could potentially recover an amount up to the limit of the coverage purchased. The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would also be limited to the amount of coverage purchased, regardless of the number of claimants.*

Claims to which the statutory municipal tort limits do not apply are not affected by this decision.
