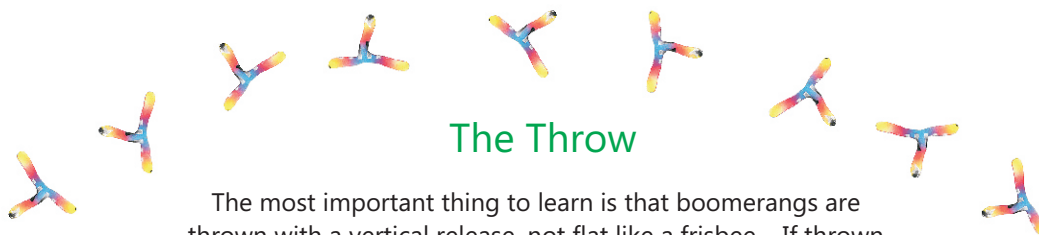
## Warning

Don't throw your boomerang near people, or try to catch it until you get consistent hovering returns.

Most of my boomerangs go out more than 30 yards so only throw at a football sized field.

## Winds

It is important to throw the boomerang with the wind on your left cheek. You want half of the flight path working against the wind and half the flight working with it



## The Throw

The most important thing to learn is that boomerangs are thrown with a vertical release, not flat like a frisbee. If thrown with a lot of layover the boomerang will climb dramatically and come crashing or swooping down. This is the most common mistake I see when people are learning. You must learn to release the boomerang above you're right ear with a target straight out in front of you with very little layover.

**Tip:** watch for a climb in the flight path: if it is dramatic then you are releasing with too much layover.

## The target

Throw the boomerang straight out in front of you toward the distant tree tops and put a little snap in your throw. --spin is good--
