


The attached clipping from the Victoria Daily Colonist of July 23rd, might, I think, be of some interest to you.

Old Copper Mine Reborn

One of Vancouver Island's older mining properties is being resurrected by Cellardor Mines Ltd.

The company owns 53 claims on the north side of the Koksilah River near the CNR railway track west of the west arm of Shawnigan Lake.

The claims include the old King Solomon mine from which over 50 tons of high grade copper ore were shipped over 50 years ago to the Tyee Copper Company's smelter at Ladysmith, as well as the Queen of Sheba, Bluebell and Wallace properties.

★ ★ ★

Cellardor proposes to do about 1,000 feet of diamond drilling but the major part of the efforts will be to win development ore which could be hauled to the Cowichan Copper Company mill at Cowichan Lake.

O. G. MacDonald, who is president of Cellardor as well as Cowichan, says that when Cowichan next month start hauling copper concentrates from its mill to the new wharf at Cherry Point (for shipment to Japan) he hopes the trucks will be able to pick up the Cellardor ore on their return journey to Cowichan.

J. S. H. Matson, former owner of The Daily Colonist, was a member of the syndicate which operated the King Solomon Mine in 1905.
