Can I be Youth President?

- Q. Who can be a Youth President?
- Any Métis Youth Citizen, 18 years of age and not more that 26 years of age as of July 19, 2025 is eligible to run for the position of President.
- How do I get involved?
- A. The youth must be nominated by 5 Eligible MN-S Youth Citizens in order to run for the position and submit their nomination package to the Chief Electoral Officer between July 19 and July 24, 2025.

Note: You will be well supported while you take on the role of Youth President once elected.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Youth President?

- What are the roles and Responsibilities of the Youth President?
- Report to the Provincial Métis Council (PMC) on provincial, national and international youth initiatives and advocacy efforts and bring forward appropriate resolutions in relation to those matters.
 - Provide reports and updates to the MN-S Legislative Assembly.
 - Relay information on behalf of the PMYC to the Provincial Métis Council and to the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) when requested, and vice versa.
 - Work to achieve the effective governance of the PMYC and for carrying out the strategic direction, mission and vision statements adopted by the PMYC,
 - Liaise with other stakeholders and organizations surrounding PMYC Initiatives, in the best interest of the Métis Youth; and
 - Work to increase the participation and engagement of Métis youth in the affairs of the MN-S.
 - Be responsive to the needs of MN-S and the youth demographic. Travel may be required in some instances.

- How much time commitment is required?
- This is a full time, paid position, and can not be done while focusing on another job or attending school full time.
 - You are required to attend regularly scheduled PMC meetings, PMC Technical Briefings and Training, the MNLA, and any other requested meetings identified either in advance or on short notice.
 - This position requires the candidate to be flexible, and they will work various hours including evenings and weekends for a 4 year term.

Can I be Youth Regional Representative?

We are electing 2 Regional Representatives in each region, for a 4 year term.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Regional Representative?

- Who can be a Youth Regional Representative?
- Any Métis Youth Citizen 16 years of age and not more than 26 years of age as of July 19, 2025 is eligible to run for the position of Regional Representative.
- How do I get Involved?
- The youth must be nominated by 3 Eligible Métis Youth Citizen who live in the same region as the Youth Regional Representative, and submit their nomination package to the Chief Electoral Officer between July 19 and July 24, 2025.
- What are the roles and responsibilities of the Youth Representative?
- To attend meetings called by the youth president either in person or virtually.
 - To provide feedback and updates on youth initiatives
 - Work to increase the participation and engagement of Métis Youth in the affairs of the MN-S.
- How much time commitment is required?
- This is a four-year term, and requires approximately 2-3 volunteer hours a month. Time commitments may change depending on projects and initiatives taken on within the PMYC.
