What a busy January we had! By now I am sure that you have heard in the news about the impending split of the United Methodist Church. I would like to take a moment to discuss this with you so that you may understand a little better why we have come to this point.

For the last four decades, the General Conference of the UMC, our denominations lawmaking body, has been in an argument over human sexuality as it pertains to the ordination of ministers and the celebration of same sex marriage unions in our buildings. The conference has always voted to remain traditional in these regards. There was a Special Called General Conference in 2019 that chose to remain traditional also. There are bishops and jurisdictions in the United States that have openly stated that they will not abide by the church law. These bishops and clergy that are violating our Discipline are not going to be held accountable. This leaves the United Methodist Church ungovernable.

This years General Conference is in May from the 5th to the 15th. We will be monitoring the conference here in the office, and I will be watching from home as much as I can so that we can provide the best honest information that we possibly can. One thing is certain in all of this, God is moving in our local church. Our community needs us to continue what we do regardless of what happens during General Conference. We do know that our congregation is going to have to make a choice about how we want to affiliate ourselves in the future. But right now, we will be waiting to see what happens in May and praying to God to be with us as we make decisions for our own future.

We will begin having a Sunday Evening Prayer Service during

Lent. The time for this will be publicized as soon as we work out the logistics of it. I ask that you be in prayer for your local church as well as the General and our Annual Conference in the months ahead. We haven't asked for these issues, but they have been forced upon us.




