Crab – most plentiful in warmer months in canals and the lake												
Redfish – all year long, big bull reds in the lake in the fall												
Trout – in our canals and on the trestles in cooler clear water												
Flounder – peak season at Chef Pass, Rigolets, trestles												
Bass – fun in our fresher canals and surrounding bayous												
White Shrimp – cast nets in the canals in late August												
Brown Shrimp – inshore in summer, offshore year around												
Oysters – best in winter, commercially available all year												
Crawfish – commercial wild caught best in spring												
Alligator – active in canals in spring, hunting in Sept., Oct.												
Duck – shotguns at first light in the wildlife reserve
