"and my ways are far beyond anything you could imagine. For just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so my ways are higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts." Thank

you Lord and AMEN! This verse has brought much comfort knowing that we are not to question God but to trust His sovereign plan in our lives, <u>He knows best!</u> We take tremendous joy in knowing Mariana's parents are home with Jesus and free of pain and suffering.

On July 21 2015, Mariana received news from the Department of Homeland Security that she had been approved to work in the United States. Many of you know how long a wait this has been and is a big relief knowing this portion of the immigration paperwork is finally complete. All of her education and credentials from Romania have been accepted and she doesn't need any further schooling to be a Registered Nurse. She passed her CNA test in August and recently was hired as a Certified Nurses Assistant at Presbyterian Homes in Inver Grove Heights and plans on taking her Registered Nursing boards in the Spring. Since our wedding in April it has been a season of adapting to married life and making financial ends meet. I transitioned out of Fitness 19 and now work for Home Depot in Inver Grove Heights 20 hours a week 6am-10am Monday-Friday. It has been a welcome transition working close to home. God is good and he knows what we need. Other side jobs included working with my dad and Mariana on a 1939 Ford Coupe and a 1935 Indianapolis 500 Race Car. Learning the history of old cars parallels with studying the bible. The more you research and appreciate the old, the more you realize everything new is based on the old. How can we understand the cross if we don't know and understand the Old Testament sacrifice for sin and that the cross of Christ was the final sacrifice for sin? History is a great
