As the church and missionaries are being shut down in our culture; God is using it to swing doors wide open for the Gospel. The doors have opened for me too, because of on-line chapels, I have more time for ministry (very little travel) more bang for the buck! I am meeting with 5 teams weekly and the schedule seems to move every week from Sunday night to early Saturday mornings to midafternoon during the week. I'm learning to be very flexible. In addition, players from various teams have requested extra 1 on 1 meetings on-line. These have been incredibly fruitful times. One example is Jarod Blackowiak from Augsburg College who's testimony is included in this newsletter who has been meeting with me every week since August. Our 1 on 1 has expanded to include his fiancé, and his younger brother, and the week of Thanksgiving their dad joined in. This is a first for me, meeting with a whole family - WOW!!! Our chapel sometimes goes for 3 hours - no kidding. My chapel leader at Augsburg invited a friend from "back home" who plays Division I for the University of Maine, to join the Augsburg chapel group because they didn't have a chapel and they wanted one. The players are being so encouraged that they want their family and friends to get on the "Good News Gospel Train"! You are a huge part of this! Our University of Maine Chapel started Dec 3rd, 2020.

Other than Maine, Our Chapels started the end of August. The word adoption had been racing through my mind so we dove headlong into Galatians 4:1-7. God has adopted us as his own through the blood of Christ when we receive him as Savior and Lord! As we discussed this, God rolled out a program we called "Adopt a Teammate", in which each player chooses 1 player to pray for each day and for that player to start coming to chapel. I have been making a list of the chapel attender and the players they are choosing to pray for; Mariana and I are also praying for them. This past October Mariana and I attended the "Sexuality and the Bible

Conference" at the Ark Encounter in Williamstown, Kentucky. There were about 800 Pastors, Chaplains and Christian leaders in attendance. Three days of great bible teaching and edification. The conference was to help explain the many deviations. There seems to be as many as 112 genders in which one can identify; talk about confusion in our culture including in our Christian Universities of knowing God's plan for sexuality for men and women. The conference was teaching and equipping us how to minister to those who are confused and/or practicing such deviations. It's a sad fact we must have a conference in 2020 about this topic. But with the so-called list of gender identity, you can even identify as a cat if you so choose. No kidding! Sound insane; not to a culture that is godless. My players are constantly being bombarded with false ideas about God, Jesus, the Bible and choosing your identity. Satan's attack on Gender erodes the nuclear family and all God created it to be. I told my HMI teammate, Rob Globke in Chicago about the Benham's being willing to share with the college chapels and Rob is helping facilitate this opportunity to all the chapel teams across the country. When the lockdowns were at their peak, I thought about presenting a 28 day Bible challenge for all 5 teams. As athletes they loved the idea of a challenge, even a Bible reading challenge. The challenge was to read the Bible everyday for 28 days and share what you read with the chapel group text and encourage the guys on your team to make sure you and they read the Bible everyday. What came of this? My phone "BLEW UP!" With an average of 8 guys per team, 40 different Bible verses or sections of scripture everyday coming in via text, WOW! I have never been so encouraged in my life and I wish I had testimony to the Bible challenge but this has gotten long again, haha. Getting young men to read the Bible daily, priceless.

Personal Testimony: Jarod Blackowiak Augsburg College

I grew up in a family who always believed in God. I always knew He was there. I said the same prayer before bed for as long as I can remember.
