My name is Trevor Paradise and I have been attending Chapel almost every week for 2 years. When I was a freshman, I was a curious mind who wanted to learn more about God, with little to any Christian background or upbringing. I didn't want to go to Chapel every week but there was something strange inside me that made me feel so much better about all aspects of life after leaving chapel each and every week. That is what kept me going back.

Christmas 2018, Max took the chapel group out for dinner and it was then, when he did a strange exercise called the "Great Exchange". He asked if anyone had 1 dollar and surprisingly I was the only one of the boys to have a dollar at the table.



Max asked me if I trusted him and I responded yes. Then Max took my dollar and gave me 20 dollars in return. I did not want his 20, I felt awkward and undeserving. Max then said to me, It is a gift and you cannot take it back. It would be almost a year later until I realized what this "Great Exchange" really meant.

Jake Hagstrom has been my mentor throughout my freshman year in the locker room, in the classroom, and in the Word of God as I came to him with new challenging questions about topics we discussed in Chapel every week. Jake would spend time with me and be patient with me as I knew little about Jesus and what it truly meant to be a Christian. I am forever grateful for Jake and what he has done for me. If it were not for Jake and the Holy Spirit within him then I would not be saved today.

October 24, 2019 I surrendered my life to God. My walk with Christ is just the beginning and the more I learn the more I understand how undeserving I am of His grace. But it is a gift, just like the 20 dollar bill Max gave to me. It is the Greatest Exchange. (2 Corinthians 5:11-21)

My experience coming to chapel with Max in the last two and a half years has been better than I could imagine. Growing up going to church and spending time in the Word with my family was always something that helped me stay strong in my faith, but since I've been away from home, I've had to find other areas in growing deeper in my faith. Having chapel with Max at Saint Mary's is exactly what I needed to stay in the Word and grow in my faith. Last year when I was a sophomore, God put Trevor on my team to mentor. I was able to mentor him on and off the ice, in the classroom, and most importantly, in the Word. Trevor and I attend chapel together along with a handful of our teammates each week to ask questions about the Bible and other things we have going on in our life.

On one occasion, it was just Max, Trevor and I at the chapel, and we had a pretty serious conversation that day. Trevor had

so many questions about my faith in Christ and what it takes to be a Christian. Trevor knew if he decided to follow Christ as his Lord and Savior, it would change his life forever (and that it would). Less than a year later, Trevor approached me on his own one day after practice asking if we could have a talk the next morning. We met on campus before lunch and he asked me a question I had been waiting to hear ever since chapel we had that one day with Max; Trevor asked how to become a Christian and asked if I would lead him to Christ. I had no hesitation when Trevor asked me to pray with him, so I immediately said yes; leading Trevor to Jesus was exciting and scary all at the same time. A good scary though. I had no time to doubt if I was helping him pray the right or wrong thing, we just prayed. Soon after we prayed, I texted Max and shared with him the good news. The greatest news. Jesus had finally found His new home in Trevor's heart!

Trevor and I have since met almost every week to talk about the decision he made and

the life he is willing to live. Before Trevor gave his life to Christ, he was a bit hesitant about taking the leap of faith because of the unknown. Trevor knew that if he gave his life to Jesus, he would be fully committed and not half-committed. For Trevor, it was all or nothing. Max and I were proud of Trevor for coming to that decision on his own because we knew that many give their lives to Christ for the wrong reason. Meeting with Trevor on our own has been great for me as well. I have been saved since I was 8, but I need Christ daily just like anybody else. Trevor comes with questions for me about his new faith and I try to answer them the best I can. I don't always have the answers at first but talking to Trevor has helped me learn how to answer a question even more so than before. I look forward to the months and years to come being brothers in Christ with Trevor. I look forward to learning and growing with him in our faith and living our lives for Christ.

As you can see, Christ is impacting the lives of these players. You, my teammates and partners in the Gospel are making an impact on my life in supporting and sending me to these players which allows the Lord to use me for His glory. Because of your partnership, testimonies like Trevor and Jake continue. There are other players coming to Christ and seeing their need to have that Great Exchange.
