FEAST OF TRUMPETS

Introduction

May we celebrate this feast of the Lord with hope of its future fulfillment. The Scriptures are clear that in this life we will have tribulation (John 16:33). Job described our lives in this way: Man, that is born of a woman is of few days, and full of trouble. He cometh forth like a flower, and is cut down: he fleeth also as a shadow, and continueth not (Job 14:1-2). In this life we have times of joy and sorrow. Solomon sought to understand life's difficulties. And I gave my heart to seek and search out by wisdom concerning all things that are done under heaven: this sore travail (adversity in employment/affairs) hath God given to the sons of man to be exercised therewith (Strong's Dictionary) (Ecclesiastes 6:12). There are some things we encounter in this life that we may never understand.

Memory Verse: I Corinthians 15:52 In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

Biblical Application

I Corinthians 15 proclaims the resurrection of Jesus Christ with surety. Paul looked to a future time when the corruption we experience in this body would be changed. This mortal body is subject to decline and disease as a result of the sin of the first Adam.

Heart disease, cancer, arthritis, pain, etc., are all a result of sin that caused corruption and mortality. However, the last Adam, Jesus Christ, overcame death and the grave in his resurrection from the dead. We are all fading away as a flower and will one day encounter death (unless Jesus returns while we are alive). As you navigate the troubles and sore travail of this life, do not lose hope! One day, this mortal must put on immortality; this corruption will be raised in incorruption. This natural body will go away, and we shall be raised a spiritual body. As we have borne the image of the earthly, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly. Rest assured, you will receive a new body; flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; neither doth corruption inherit incorruption (I Corinthians 15:49-50). Job asked a rhetorical question If a man die, shall he live again? May we reach the same conclusion as Job did. All the days of my appointed time will I wait, till my change come (Job 14:14). Be diligent to stay focused on the hope of the last trump and return of Jesus Christ!

- Till my change comes. Job 14:1-15; 19:25-27
- The last trump will sound. I Corinthians 15:1-58
- Comfort one another with the Word. I Thessalonians 4:13-18

Everyday Life Application

I Corinthians 15 concludes with an exhortation to action because we possess the victory in Christ. How are you fulfilling this call to action?

THE DAY OF ATONEMENT

Introduction

The House of God churches have various traditions during the observance of this feast. Some congregations stay in the temple most or all of the night, praying, offering praise unto the Lord, and afflicting their souls. The fasting requirement makes it dreaded by some and loved by many. As beneficiaries of the new covenant, our observance of this day is very different from the period before the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Offerings that required the shedding of blood are no longer required. This fact causes many believers to miss out on the blessing of this feast due to a misunderstanding of the Scriptures. Most view the observance of this feast as fulfilled and no longer applicable. Christ fulfilled the sacrificial aspect of this feast. However, much of the statute remains. We keep this feast with recognition that Jesus Christ has made the atonement once and for all through the shedding of his blood (Hebrews 10:10).

Memory Verse: Hebrews 9:26 For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

Biblical Application

Jesus Christ came to this earth with a specific mission that was foreordained before the foundation of the world (I Peter 1:19). Many of the prophets who wrote of him over

thousands of years looked for his appearing. They inquired and searched diligently for the grace that was to come (I Peter 1:10-11). An angel made his mission known to Joseph in a dream (Matthew 1:20). The Bible uses the words appeared and manifested (to render apparent, reveal) to describe the coming of Christ (Hebrews 9:26; I Timothy 3:16, Strong's Dictionary). The invisible God manifested himself in flesh for the specific purpose of saving his people from their sins and to put away sin (Matthew 1:21). The putting away of sin (setting aside, annulment, rejection, cancellation) and saving from sin includes deliverance from the penalty and power of sin (Strong's Dictionary). Grace and truth came by Jesus Christ (John 1:17). This grace gives us power to obey the law of God. Sin does not have dominion over us, for we are not under the law but under grace (Romans 6:14). Biblically, the grace of God that is given to us through Jesus Christ offers deliverance from and power over sin. Unfortunately, theologians have fostered an incorrect definition of grace as a license to sin. By God's grace, we do not have to let sin reign in our bodies, but instead we can yield our members as instruments of righteousness unto God.

Introduction

In Leviticus 23:41, the Lord said, Ye shall keep it a feast unto the LORD seven days in the year. It shall be a statute forever in your generations: ye shall celebrate it in the seventh month. The Hebrew word *(chagag) translated celebrate is a verb and means to move in a circle, i.e., specifically to march in a sacred procession, to observe a festival; by implication, to be giddy (Strong's Dictionary). The same word was used by Moses and Aaron in their first approach to Pharaoh when they said, thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Let my people go, that they may hold a feast unto me in the wilderness (Exodus 5:1). The phrase: that they may hold a feast is chagag. Exodus 5:1 marks the point at which the Lord began to implement his plan for the celebration of his feasts. At that time, there was a future application of the feasts. There remains a future application for us today. This feast points prophetically to the 1,000year reign of Jesus Christ when He returns to earth.

Memory Verse: James 5:8 Be ye also patient; stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

Biblical Application

James 5:7 exhorts us to be patient until the coming of the Lord. He compares the long patience (to be long-spirited, i.e., (objectively) forbearing) of a farmer as he waits (await, look for, expect) for the early and later rain to help produce fruit of the earth (Strong's Dictionary). Along with patience,

believers are encouraged to establish (to set fast, i.e., literally to turn resolutely in a certain direction, or to confirm) their hearts. There is urgency in the responsibility to establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh. The need for each individual to establish their heart occurs despite having received a new heart. James gives a practical application on establishing your hearts and points to the patience of the prophets and Job. We must endure, maintaining focus on what Scripture has already revealed about the Lord. Jesus taught about some of the signs that would occur in the sun, moon, stars, and the distress of nations before his return. One of the signs will be men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken (Luke 21:25-26). As we march in the sacred procession of the Lord's feasts, may we establish our hearts. For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise. For yet a little while, and he that shall come will come, and will not tarry (Hebrews 10:36-37).

- Stablish your hearts. James 5:7-19
- When shall these things be? Luke 21:5-38, Revelation 20:1-15
- Keep the feast. Leviticus 23:33-44

FEAST OF TABERNACLES LAST GREAT DAY

Introduction

Today we celebrate the eighth day, which Jesus Christ called the last, the great day of this feast of the Lord. We rejoice on the many manifold blessings of the Almighty! This day is a sabbath and holy convocation. Gathering in the fruit of the land has included the Lord providing for us in more ways than we can count. The Lord's provision has moved beyond our needs to include our desires, both physically and spiritually. May we celebrate this feast with excited anticipation at the hope for the future that is to come.

Memory Verse: Isaiah 64:4 For since the beginning of the world men have not heard, nor perceived by the ear, neither hath the eye seen, O God, beside thee, what he hath prepared for him that waiteth for him.

Biblical Application

Isaiah 64 begins with an intense longing for the Lord to rend the heavens and come down. The context of the situation is revealed by Isaiah 63:18 and 64:10-11. The adversaries of the Lord had trodden down the sanctuary, and God's house was burnt with fire. Zion was a wilderness and Jerusalem a desolation. In the midst of difficult times and oppression from their adversaries, Isaiah desired for the Lord to appear and show his power. His confession and repentance were combined with a hope for the future. By faith, he knew that the Lord had a plan for the future that

was greater than he could imagine. The Apostle Paul also experienced persecution and adversity; he made a similar groan with an earnest desire to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven (II Corinthians 5:4). This eighth day points to the future new heavens and new earth which the Lord promised. As we encounter adversity and hardship in this life, may the Holy Ghost reveal the future hope that God has prepared for us. This world is not our home. We are strangers and pilgrims passing through. He that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.
