FEAST OF TABERNACLES LAST GREAT DAY

Introduction

Biblical Application

Isaiah 64 begins with an intense longing for the Lord to rend the heavens and come down. The context of the situation is revealed by Isaiah 63:18 and 64:10-11. The adversaries of the Lord had trodden down the sanctuary, and God's house was burnt with fire. Zion was a wilderness and Jerusalem a desolation. In the midst of difficult times and oppression from their adversaries, Isaiah desired for the Lord to appear and show his power. His confession and repentance were combined with a hope for the future. By faith, he knew that the Lord had a plan for the future that was greater than he could imagine. The Apostle Paul also experienced persecution and adversity; he made a similar groan with an earnest desire to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven (II Corinthians 5:4). This eighth day points to the future new heavens and new earth which the Lord promised. As we encounter adversity and hardship in this life, may the Holy Ghost reveal the future hope that God has prepared for us. This world is not our home. We are strangers and pilgrims passing through. He that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.
