

## WHAT DOES THE POPE ASK OF US ON MODERN SLAVERY?

His Holiness Pope Francis urges us all to "do something about it". He urges us all to "do something about it".

He says it is "far more widespread than previously imagined - even, to our scandal and shame, within the most prosperous of our societies" "The voice of its victims...is the voice of Jesus crying out to us."

The Pope wants us to "find" people who are enslaved. **He wants them to be freed.** 

"How I wish that all of us would hear God's cry, 'Where is your brother?" (Gen 4:9)."

#### What does Jesus say about freedom?

"He has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free," (Luke 4: 17-20).

Jesus said this on his very first day of preaching. He chose that passage from Isaiah to read to everybody in the Temple in Nazareth.

Later, in his parable about our

division at the end of our lives, one from the other as sheep from goats, (Matthew 25:32.) Jesus asks us to tackle the problem of injustice, to help people without freedom,

He tells us in that parable, He was a prisoner and we came to him. "When you did it to one of the least of my brethren here you did it to me."

## SURELY THERE AREN'T ANY SLAVES TODAY NOT IN ENGLAND?

Modern Slavery (MS) is an umbrella term including Human Trafficking (HT). Many use the terms interchangeably.

17,004

In 2023 the number of souls in the UK actually found in slavery by front line services, and others and referred into the Home Office's scheme for helping them (the NRM). This is the known figure.

136,000

There is also a "dark" figure: those unknown but estimated. The last Global Slavery Index (UN) figure estimated this to be the number of people in the UK in Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking (MS/HT).

Are under 18 - "children". 41% of the total. British is the largest nationality group referred into the NRM over its 8-year history.

### THE PATRON SAINT OF ENSLAVED PEOPLE

St Josephine Bakhita: Feast Day 8th February



Josephine was given the name Bakhita or "Lucky" by the Arab slave traders who stole her.

She was aged 7, when she was taken near her village home in Darfur, Sudan and forced to walk barefoot about 600 miles to be sold at market.

She was sold and resold five times to "owners": who whipped and cut her and poured salt in the wounds.

Even while a slave, she became a modern, proud and independent woman, always looking out for the underdog.

### WHAT DOES OUR CARDINAL VINCENT NICHOLS SAY ON MODERN SLAVERY?

Cardinal Archbishop Vincent Nichols has said "consumers of cheap goods and services are part of the supply chain of Modern Slavery."

Talking of the victims of this abhorrent crime, Cardinal Nichols added: "In one way or another we are part of the chain of supply and demand that results in their enslavement.

We want cheaper goods, illegal or immoral pleasure, cheap services for our bodies or for our cars. We are part of the demand met by modern day slaves..."

#### **SEEING IS BELIEVING**

It's worth watching "Shady Chocolate" or "The Dark side of Chocolate" with your family, on YouTube and see the deception and broken promises; the avoidable suffering of the Ivory Coast child slaves who provide that free labour indirectly for Big Chocolate cocoa suppliers.

Apply this illustration of the chocolate industry to all the goods and services that are vulnerable to exploitation and you will see the scale of the problem;

but also, what consumers can do to stem the demand.

### HELP BY SPOTTING THE SIGNS AND REPORTING

Most crimes are reported to the police by the victim. In slavery the victim is (almost by definition) unable to report the crime against him or her.

He/she often doesn't speak the language, has no phone, is terrified of his/her enslaver and under their control.

So, if anyone is going to initiate that police investigation leading to his/her freedom it's us!

Identifying trafficking and slavery is the first step to stopping it.

Understanding the signs to look out for will help the most vulnerable people in your community. Become a Freedom Watcher.




# OK, I DO WANT TO HELP END SLAVERY HOW CAN I CONTRIBUTE?
