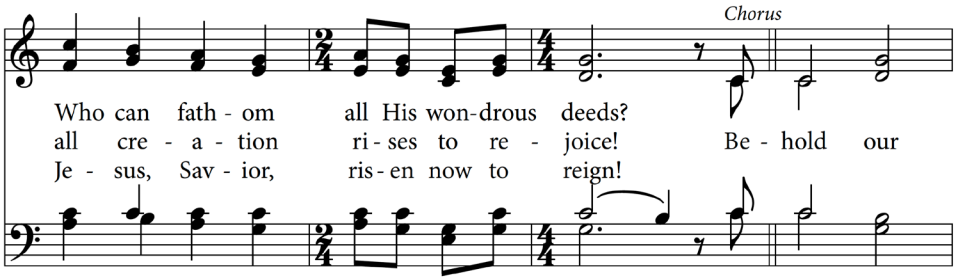

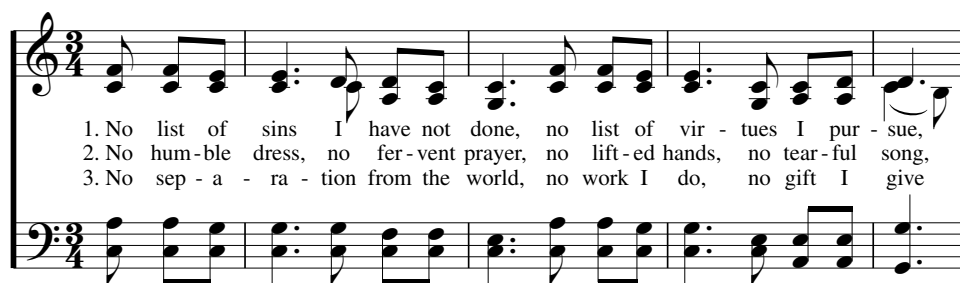
God Gives Grace to the Humble Through Christ

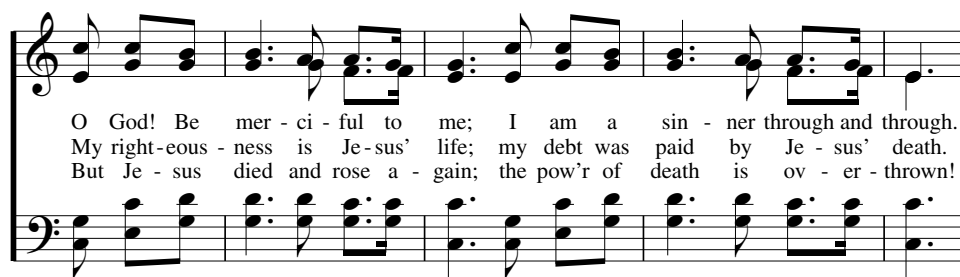

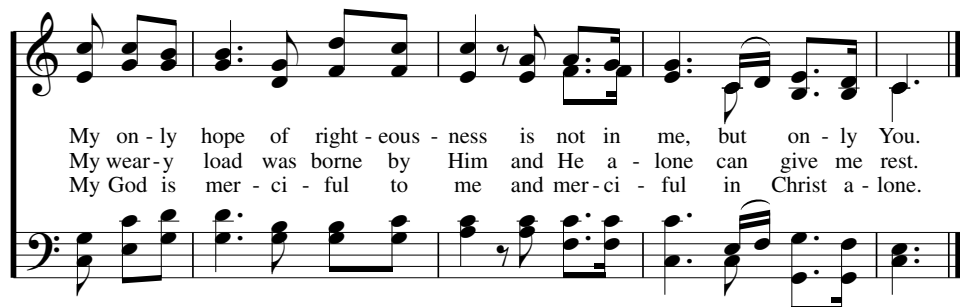
