Fruit of the Spirit? Indeed!

"Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth" Mt. 5:5

Have you ever noticed how frequently the concept of "meekness" is mentioned or insinuated in the Bible? Numbers 12:3 tells us that Moses was "very meek," if you can believe that. You also get the idea that Jeremiah wasn't particularly pushy when he was dealing with "all the officials" (Jer. 26:12–14). Simon Peter, years later, recalled the meekness of Christ and could hardly believe it (I Peter 2:23). Even St. Paul, instructing Timothy in the skills of ministry, calls for it (2 Timothy 2:25, KJV).

Meekness is always a positive thing when you come across it in the Bible. In fact, Jesus says the meek "shall inherit the earth" (Mt.5:5). And yet, have you noticed how little of it there is, even in the church? Meekness is seen by many as weakness. We are often more apt to applaud boldness. We excuse the overbearing and self-important in admiration of the way in which they seem to get things done.

The dictionary says meekness is patience and mildness, disinclination to anger or resentment, gentleness, kindness. You won't find many words like that, or related notions, in secular leadership and management books. But you do find them in the Bible's catalog of fruits of the Spirit: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law" (Gal. 5:22-23 KJV).

Meekness! Funny, isn't it? We'd probably get a lot farther down the road with our assignments on the job, our efforts in the church, or our goals in life, accomplish a great deal more of what we have been commissioned to do, if we practiced a little bit more of it. People may not always regard meekness highly or covet it much. Few have, most likely, prayed for it. But the Bible does regard meekness highly, and Jesus includes the blessing of being meek in His sermon on the mount. In the Bible it is an honored "fruit of the Spirit." Perhaps it is time to include this request in our prayers and be blessed by it.

Thankful for Fido

Last month I held the first ever "Blessing of the Animals" for our Preschool kids. It was a wonderful success, bringing a good number of parents and grandparents into our church courtyard, as well as the students. Maybe next year I'll hold it in the sanctuary and get them further "into church!" Anyway, as I mentioned, it went very well. It was endearing to see the little children receive a word of blessing over photos of their pets (turns out you can't really bring 60 dogs and cats into the school building). Others brought along their favorite stuffed animals to be prayed over. It made me appreciate God's good gift of creation more. He gives us so much. Even though it is fallen, the world around us is still so good and dear. I'm including the little devotion I put together below. I thought you might want to adapt it and share the experience with your kids or grandkids – and those members of God's creation who are dear to them.

FIRST: Sing the song "My God is So Big". (Google it if unfamiliar.)

NEXT: (Be seated.)

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

I want you to remember two things today. Jesus loves you and Jesus loves all the animals. Even elephants like in our song. Even the pets in your home, that He has placed in your care.

Did you know Jesus loves kids? Jesus loves everyone, but He especially loves young children like you. Not everyone loves to have children around all the time. Sometimes young children – not you, but other young children – can be noisy or too silly. But Jesus loves all the children of the world. Even noisy and silly and crazy ones! The Bible tells us that one time, "children were brought to Jesus so that He could lay His hands on them, to bless them and pray." But the disciples didn't like that, and they tried to keep the kids away! But Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me. Don't keep them away. Because the Kingdom of heaven is for people just like these kids here." And then can you guess what Jesus did? He laid His hands on the children and prayed. And we're going to do that here today – one by one. I'll pray for you.

But not just for you – for your pets, too! Or if you don't have any pets even a special stuffy maybe. Did you know that God loves all His creatures? Of course He does! He made everything. The Bible tells us that God knows and cares about every single bird way up in the sky. That means that He loves and cares about your pets, too. The things that are special to you are special to Him. Because you are special to God. And so sometimes He gives us special pets to take care of, or special stuffies to hug. And He teaches us important things with our special pets... Do we have to be gentle with our pets, or should we be rough with them?? Yeah, God teaches us gentleness with our pets. He teaches us how to love and take care of them.

Christ at the Center

It is officially November, which means you might already be thinking or looking ahead to Thanksgiving! I think after three months of being here on vicarage, I'm finally starting to get the swing of things around here. I'm starting to understand the flow of work around here, get a feel for Florida weather, and I'm just starting to get a sense of the daily schedule around here; what Mondays look like, what Tuesdays look like, etc. Every once in a while, there might be a curveball that's thrown into the mix, but I'm starting to get a sense of what life is like here, and I couldn't be any more excited to partake in it. Maybe you recall your own busy schedule, and you know how hard it can be to try to free up just a little more time. Yet, I was talking to one person recently, who was telling me about his daily schedule, and without knowing he would inspire the theme of this article, as he told me, "My day wouldn't be the same unless I start in the Bible."

This person really hit it right on the money. These simple words left a profound impact on me, as these words reiterate how much of a difference God's Word makes in our lives. A prayer we read, a promise God fulfills for His people, a significant character from the Bible, all these stories shape and form us even today. As God's Word and his story of salvation tells of His love and mercy for us, our lives are transformed. Even amidst our busy schedules, there's one thing that never changes, and that is the person who is at the center for our lives, Christ. Christ is our sure foundation that keeps us standing firm, even in the toughest and roughest moments of our lives. As we build our lives upon Christ and his promises, everything we do stems from Him. With our lives and our faith centered upon Christ and his promises, eternal life is secure, as our Heavenly Father speaks his Words of forgiveness, life, and salvation day in and day out. As Christians, our lives are centered upon His promises (Christ is even in our name – CHRISTian).

Did you know...?

The Altar Guild in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) plays a crucial role in preparing and maintaining the worship space.



Their responsibilities focus on enhancing the worship experience through careful attention to the altar and its elements.

The key responsibilities of the Altar Guild include the preparation for worship.

- **Setting Up Communion:** Prepare the vessels and elements for the Lord's Supper, ensuring everything is in place for each service.
- Care of Communion Vessels: Remove and properly store vessels and elements following the last worship service of the day.
- Linen Care: Launder and iron altar linens to maintain cleanliness and presentation.
- **Changing Paraments:** Regularly change altar paraments according to the church calendar and liturgical seasons.

Membership and Participation

The Altar Guild is open to all members of the congregation interested in learning about Lutheran worship practices. Training and guidance are provided to new members to help them fulfill their roles effectively. Members of the Altar Guild at Bethlehem Lutheran church (ideally) serve once a month *following* their preferred worship service or setting up the altar for worship on Saturdays or prior to special worship services. Altar Guild members may also assist in the changing of the altar paraments and decorating the sanctuary for the various church seasons.
