The Two Kingdoms – Distinction Not Divorce

"Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. Therefore, whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed...."

Thus begins one of Paul's more famous passages in Romans chapter 13, where he goes on for six more verses describing the nature of the Christian's life under civil government. With so much recent civic chaos (like politically motivated murder and violence), I figured it would be a good time to rework this old newsletter article I wrote four years ago. Much more could be said, of course, but this is, at least, a very basic introduction to the Lutheran Doctrine of the Two Kingdoms.

Based largely on Romans 13, the basic idea of "The Two Kingdoms" is this: God is Lord over all. All! But He has two different ways of reigning: hence "two kingdoms" or "two realms." In the "kingdom of the left hand," the temporal, civic sphere, He rules by the power of the sword. He rules through earthly, governmental authorities. And He does this for the good of humanity. On the other hand (pardon the pun), in "the kingdom of the right hand," he also rules: this time, through the Church. Here, He rules not by threat of jail time or civic punishment, but by His Word. This "kingdom" or "realm" is characterized, first and foremost, by the Gospel. By grace. (But of course, the Law is preached, too.) God rules in this realm, like He does in the "left-hand kingdom", for the good of humanity. Indeed, for our ultimate good – our eternal salvation! (Your governor or senator can't deliver you that!) Anyway, the key, "must-take-this-away" concept for talking about the Two Kingdoms is this: Christians our citizens of both. At the same time.

Now, we want to be clear to distinguish these two kingdoms. Keeping them clearly distinguished prevents a lot of mischief. On the left hand, we don't want the civic government to be in the business of dispensing grace, forgiving and absolving murderers, thieves, and vandals. We want structure! Order. Accountability. And punishment for wrongdoers. On the right hand, though, we don't want the church to have a standing army. (It sure did in Luther's day!) We don't want to "spread the Gospel" at the point of the sword. We want to preach the word of Christ's forgiveness and the freedom found in a life lived His way!

But now it gets tricky. While we want to distinguish the two kingdoms, we don't want to divorce them. God is at work over and through both, after all! And it's not like these two kingdoms don't affect each other. Of course they do. And they should! The fire marshal enforces the rules about how many people our church building can safely hold. The city council determines the regulations behind our church parking lot. So clearly, there's a relationship. Conversely, the Church has a clear word (The Word of God!) to speak to whatever temporal authorities we find ourselves under. An understanding of the Two Kingdoms does not result in a constantly quiet church, but a selectively vocal one.

When the temporal government or its leaders go off the rails that God's Word provides, it is time for Christians to speak up. And while God's Word does not speak to many of our civic questions, it is exceedingly clear on several important ones! Innocent life matters. It's not ours to take. Holy marriage matters. It's not ours to toss out or redefine. God's created order of male and female matters. It's not ours to pervert. And how we treat one another in our civic life matters. More violence and hatred are not the answer to violence and hatred. God's Word is clear on these things, at least.

So, please don't think that your Lutheran tradition puts you into a quietistic corner. At the same time, please don't think that all your apples are in the basket of temporal politics or culture. Your identity as God's people, called into both Kingdoms, means that you have a different perspective. You don't have one citizenship on your mind. You've got two.

Did you know...?

The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod has had an active women's missionfocused ministry for over 83 years.



In October we celebrate the work of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) also known as Women In Mission. But who are these women in mission? If you are a woman, IT IS YOU! Now some of you will say: "I never joined the LWML. I have never even been to a meeting." If you are a member of an LCMS congregation and are a women 18 years old or older you are part of the LWML.

The LWML mission is to 'Serve the Lord with Gladness.' The LWML is not about the meetings attended, although they are necessary for planning. The LWML is about serving. How do you serve? Some women serve the Lord by working in the church. There are so many ways to serve at Bethlehem I will not try to list them all. But it is more than working in the church.
