BUILDING A NEW BETHLEHEM PRESCHOOL

On August 3rd our beloved Bethlehem Lutheran Church and Preschool held a voter's meeting to discuss the possibility of building a new preschool. After my opening prayer and initial thoughts about the importance of this project our church president, Gordon Gruhn, gave an important overview about the need and purpose of this project. The purpose of the presentation was simply to get the affirmation of the congregation to move forward with planning, selecting an architect, securing a general contractor, and preparing a budget to be presented for approval at a later congregational voter's meeting. The voters gave unanimous approval to move forward, and I am so grateful. I want to encourage you to prayerfully consider how God is leading Bethlehem in this endeavor. Your voice, participation, and support are crucial as we seek to move forward together in faith.

Please allow me to share with you a few personal thoughts on the importance of our school and this project. It's easy to think of preschool ministry as simply "babysitting," but I see a much bigger picture. I see a vision of little children worshipping freely and getting their first glimpses of what it means to know they are loved by Jesus . . . and what it means to follow Him. I see kids learning the foundational biblical truths that they will build on and plant seeds in their hearts for the rest of their lives. Some might say this is the parent's job, but the fact is that few parents teach (catechize) their children regarding the foundations of the Christian faith. Bethlehem has the wonderful privilege of doing just that – teaching about Jesus. This is our greatest mission field, and we don't have to go anywhere – the children come to us! Thank you, Lord, for this awesome opportunity.


Years ago, in a different church, I heard someone say that they had already raised and educated their children and didn't feel "compelled" to do that for other children. I don't recall the pastor's response to that statement, but I have one now: "Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again" (2 Corinthians 5:14-15). Indeed, we live for Jesus whose love extends from generation to generation, and who beckons the little children to come to him (Mt. 9:14).

What happens at BLC Preschool Chapel?

Every Wednesday, starting in September, Pastor Dana, Pastor Nate and our Vicar lead Chapel for our little scholars. The Pastors and Vicar begin with a warm welcome and Birthday Buddies. (The children with birthdays get a special small stuffie from the Pastors and Vicar.) They go over the Bible verse they will work on for the year as well as several songs the kids will share with their family and friends at the end of the year.

Then, Pastors Dana and Nate or Vicar will share a devotional lesson with the students that focuses on a lesson from the Gospel on Sunday. The kids engage with the lesson in a variety of ways from object lessons, skits, and props. The chapel closes with a song and lots of hugs! This sanctuary becomes a mission field where Pastor Dana, Pastor Nate, and Vicar share the love of Jesus with our BLC Preschool students. How awesome that every Wednesday we know these children are experiencing the Word of God! Please pray for our ministerial staff, Vicar, Preschool teachers and children this year; that the little children would come to know Jesus, who waits with open arms.



BACK TO SCHOOL: DON'T BE SPARRING!

"If we wish to have excellent and able persons both for civil and church leadership, we must spare no diligence, time, or cost in teaching and educating our children."

- The Large Catechism (written by Martin Luther), on the Fourth Commandment

There are areas in life where it's a good thing to be stingy, or as I prefer to call it, "resource aware." By nature, I'm quite cautious, not wanting to invest too much time, energy, or resources into certain endeavors. And there's nothing wrong with that, per se. God has made us all different for a reason.

However, my bias is not perfect for every scenario. Not everything in life is to be approached with a "least effort possible" mindset. While talking about the importance of children honoring their parents and other authorities in the fourth commandment, Luther reminds us of the inverse. Parents and others in authority are strongly commanded in Scripture to care for children, particularly by bringing them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. In other words, to care for them spiritually above all. And in doing this, Luther says, we should spare no effort, time-consideration, or financial cost. This is a top priority.

But it's not just "church stuff." Education of the young in general was a top priority for our favorite Reformer. He once preached a sermon titled, rather bluntly, a Sermon on Keeping Children in School. The temptation at the time, I think, would have been to pull your kids out of school so you could put them to work and make more money for yourself or your family unit. But some things are more important than money (or a sacrifice of time or effort.) And for Luther and the scriptures, education is one of those things. "How much better to get wisdom than gold! To get understanding is to be chosen rather than silver" (Prov. 16:16).

Why is this so? Because all truth ultimately comes only from The Truth. So yes, it is good to prioritize learning the truth of God's revelation in His written Word, the Scriptures. But any true knowledge on any topic ultimately connects back to the Giver of all truths. Really, we need Him from the start if we desire to attain any true wisdom, especially in matters of salvation. "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding" (Pov. 9:10). In the pursuit and development of this knowledge, wisdom, and truth, it is never to early to begin. And we do not want to be sparing in our efforts.

As Bethlehem considers the development of a new building for our Preschool - and how to better utilize the space God has blessed us with for our growing congregation - these thoughts shouldn't be far from our minds. Please join me in prayer during these exciting days of opportunity. Please pray for wisdom, prudence, insight, and the supply of all our needs. Please pray that we would value most highly what the Scriptures call us to value: Christ crucified for sinners, and the proclamation of that good news to all the world. Young and old alike.


Organ Concert ft. Our Own BLC Organist


