#### THANK GOD

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

Philippians 4:6

I can't believe it's time to write my November newsletter article already. Today is October 12th and it's ninety degrees outside. Where I grew up in Denver there was always a chill in the air by now and heaters were being turned on. Here I find myself lowering the air conditioner. Regardless of the weather, November is still the time of the year when we gather together as individuals and the church to give thanks to God for all the blessings He pours out on us.

Increasingly I hear people saying they don't have anything for which to be thankful because there are so many problems in the world and in their own lives. It really does seem like things are out of control. If there is one thing we don't seem to have much control over, it's this set of nerves which keeps assailing us on every side - morning, noon, and night, and at the most unwelcome moments in between! Health, finances, what other people think of us, unexpected personal and world events that can overwhelm us with grief and anxiety. Where does one end the list of things in day-to-day life which keep us on the raw edge of anxiety? Indeed, sometimes it feels like the list is endless.

The Apostle Paul gives us direction as we face struggles in our lives. "In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." There it is, the Christian way with every trouble in the world, our secret for serenity: bring God into it. Undergird it with the love of the Savior.

In no way does this simplify the pain, anxiety, or heart-ache of our lives. It does, however, give us direction . . . a place to go when we feel lost. It is that little phrase, "with thanksgiving," that gets my attention, and I'd like it to get hold of yours. When you are in the doldrums, when the world seems to be falling apart, when you are feeling fretful and unhappy, and people around are doing everything they can, it seems, to beat you down, then remember the other side of the ledger. The credit side has some entries, too. "Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits" (Psalm 103:2). I should say: health, if you still have it, friends, the beauty of so much of the world that shouts its praise to the Lord ((Isaiah 55:12). Don't forget that God is still forgiving you at Jesus' cross, at the very moment when anxiety has a stranglehold on you. The big thing is under control. You can still thank God for that!

Anxious about something? Take it to the Lord in prayer. And remember all the good things too. Take it to Him *''with thanksgiving.''* 

And remember, please join us for our *special service of thanksgiving on the eve of Thanksgiving, Wednesday, November 22, at 7:00 PM.* It is good to come together with thanksgiving and remember all His benefits to us.

#### Give Thanks

1 Tim. 4:4-5 Everything God created is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving, because it is consecrated by the word of God and prayer.

We will probably be hearing a lot about the importance of "giving thanks" in the days running up to Thursday, November 23rd. So, if having society preach at you about what kind of shape your attitude is in really ain't your thing... brace yourself. It's coming.

Of course, we should give thanks! As human beings, as Americans, and even more so as Christians, we have much to be thankful for. But one of the biggest challenges for us Christians in the season of "giving thanks," is that we understand the concept in a way that differs from the wider culture. Most of the time, in the midst of our very general "thanksgiving," an important truth is lost. Namely, that in order to "give thanks," one must have an actual person to express said thanks to! And that person must have actually given you something! Contrary to the impression you might receive this month, thanksgiving isn't simply a warm fuzzy in your tummy that makes you feel good. Rather, it is a specific response to a specific person for specific things that person has done.

Sometime this month, I would encourage you to take a sheet of paper, and just write. For 10 minutes, just write down things that you have, things you've been given - both "spiritual" and "material," both "holy" and "mundane." But don't stop there. The world does that much. Go one step further. Pray that list. Lift it up before the Triune God who gave you such things. As Paul wrote to young Timothy, even the most mundane things become holy things when we recall that they were given to us by a good and holy God. So make your list. Then pray it.

Luther had a list like this. In his Small Catechism, he describes the sorts of things, even mundane things, that are wrapped up in our petition for daily bread. "Daily bread" he says," includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like."

It's all good. And even the mundane can be holy. This month, be specific. Pray your own "daily bread thank-you list" to the One who died to give you all blessings. I'm not going to harp on whether your tummy is sufficiently fuzzy on November 23rd. I will however stress that there is nothing too small, too insignificant to thank God for specifically. Because even the smallest gifts of God are made holy through the Word of God and prayer. "Be thankful" = Pray.

It spoke of "leading us in praise to the Lord through music!" It was like the light after what seemed to be a very long darkness and it made me happy. The front message of the card reads "True worship freely flows from hearts who have heard the melody of God's amazing grace." It brought to mind many things. I asked Pastor recently to give me one word that would speak of The Reformation (besides 500 years!) and he replied "Grace Alone". (Be on the listen for the choirs' anthem at the Reformation Service). It also brought to mind the moment at the recent President's Equip Conference when 'true worship' was freely flowing from hearts as our proud and devoted choir backed up by our equally as devoted Praise Team stood on the raised platform, singing and clapping as 750 folks stood and joined them also singing and clapping - the melodies of God's amazing grace. I am also reminded of the older gentleman at one of the nursing homes where Richard and I play once a month, who is crippled and confined to a wheelchair. He can't really move by himself, although I see his feet kind of tapping as we play, but as soon as we sing "Amazing Grace", his melodic and strong bass voice joins in and sings all the words of all the verses: true worship freely flowing.

As we approach the upcoming seasons of Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas, I look forward to bringing the melodies of God's amazing grace and miraculous birth and life to our hearts, to keep 'true worship freely flowing'. Thank you for joining in our songs of praise and please, keep singing!


