"Even to your old age \ldots $I\ldots$ will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you" Isaiah 46:4



"I Saw the Light..."

We are limited only by our own imaginations. God has not put limitations on us. There are laws both from the Scriptures and that we have created for ourselves in order to make our lives civilized and safe. But there are no limitations for creativity. There are endless ways to express hope and joy and comfort and thanks and especially praise. Sometimes I get bogged down in the old tried and true ways of expressing these messages to God in our music. Sometimes people will say "well, I don't know that song, so let's sing something we know." Stuff you already know is good. There is strength and comfort in it. BUT, I am always on the lookout for something just a little different. Sometimes just a little difference can make you see, hear and subsequently think about things with just a new slant and: Bingo! I saw the light. I recently had a Bingo moment. It is such a great feeling; after the initial Bingo, it begins to grow and flower in your mind and you are charged with making it happen. My Bingo Moment: I was playing a little concert recently with Pete Reideler at the Proton Institute in downtown Jacksonville. It is a facility where people literally from all over the world come for a specialized treatment of cancer. Having survived cancer myself three times, I can offer the folks there music as well as hope for "yes-there-is-life-after-cancer". When we finished our performance a gentle man approached me to express appreciation for the music. In talking, he told me about members of his family who played piano and how it was generally a musical family. He then casually mentioned

that he played TheSaw. BINGO MOMENT! He then told me that he frequently played in his home church in Columbia, SC. Double bingo moment! So, of course I asked him if he would like to play at our church. He was excited to accept, but then told me that he had not brought his saw and bow (a violin bow) and rosin with him. No problem; Pete said I have a saw (just a regular ole Home Depot type saw) and I assured him that I would locate a bow and rosin. We spoke on the phone several times, mostly to reassure each other that we were both serious and we both were. When you are in treatment at the Proton center, you receive treatment every day, so he and his wife Alice were here for the duration (3 months), however they went home for Thanksgiving and he returned with his own saw, bow and rosin. During the course of our conversations we discussed specific songs and what keys would be most advantageous for the saw. I told a couple people about the plan and they thought that it perhaps was nothing more than a personal Bingo Moment for me, but not necessarily such a great idea for church. Clearly their imaginations needed some polishing up. The day arrived and John and Alice showed up, saw and bow in tow and a lot of joy. "Surely





It was a very special Sunday because following the saw, we had Rusty Huseman singing "Joseph's Song", another glorious offering of the season. In spite of recent back surgery, Rusty sang at all three services. We were certainly more than blessed as we always are everytime someone sings or plays music in praise. 

A New Year For Good Works

Happy New Year! Did you make a New Year's resolution this year? I must admit, I'm not particularly good at making these... or sticking to them. I've usually forgotten them by February. But that won't be you. Surely not.

Seriously though, the New Year is as good a time as any to take stock and evaluate our lifestyle, our actions and habits, you name it. This is an important thing for us Lutheran Christians to do, because we believe that what we do with our lives in the hereand-now actually does matter. Of course, as Lutherans we always want to emphasize that we are saved solely through the gift of faith in Christ Jesus. We place the credit for our salvation totally in Christ and not at all in our own efforts, resolutions, or good works. And all of that is indeed rightly emphasized, and we must never forget it. Still, Lutherans have a very strongly developed teaching on the great value that good works have in the life of a Christian. And in his Christian Dogmatics, Lutheran systematic theologian Francis Pieper outlined five reasons why we (along with Scripture!) praise good works so highly. Perhaps these will offer you some encouragement as you pursue those resolutions...

- 1. "Good works have such great value because they are done according to the norm of God's will." You can't get much better, much more "fulfilled," in life than following the design of the One who made you! God's will is good, and so anything that brings you into line with it is bound to be good, too!
- 2. "Good works are God's work." Because you are a baptized Christian with the Holy Spirit actively working in your life, any good work that you produce is truly and ultimately a result of God working through you. "Scripture expressly calls the good works of Christians God's work, Gods' operation." (Phil. 2:13, "It is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill His good purpose.)
- 3. Good works are the Holy Spirit's external evidence that you are, in fact, one of God's Christians. (1 John 3:14, "We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love each other. Anyone who does not love remains in death.")
- 4. Your good works last. "All the earthly possessions of men, of Christians too, will be consumed by the fire of Judgment Day, but the good works of Christians, also those performed by means of their perishable possessions, will not be consumed, but will follow them into eternity." (Rev. 14:13, "'Yes,' says the Spirit, 'they will rest from their labor, for their deeds will follow them."') What's more, God has heaped grace upon grace, and promised that your good works will be rewarded. (Matt. 10:42, "Anyone who gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones who is my disciple, truly I tell you, that person will certainly not lose their reward.")
- 5. Finally, doing good works is what you're here on this earth to do. It is your purpose in life. For all of the reasons enumerated above, "Christians are admonished to make the most of their short stay on earth by performing good works." (Eph. 5:15-16, "Be very careful, then, how you live not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity."

Our good works could never save us. Only Jesus does that. But they're nothing to sneeze at either. So actually, now that I've written all this... Perhaps I do need a resolution after all.
