## **BLC Usher Training Resource**

The usher is expected to be on duty in the narthex 15 – 20 minutes before the service. The duties include; directing congregants to the bulletins, greeting people as they enter the church and asking them to sign in. The usher then will help with communion by calling out people for communion row by row and maintaining the line on both sides of the main aisle. If it is a kneel down communion, nine people for each side is the proper number in order to fit the communion rail. The two ushers should be the last to take communion. After the service, the ushers are to check all pews for left over bulletins, books, trash, etc. This is to make the pews ready for the next service. The other services might operate somewhat different as to length of usher assignments.
