## THE FORTY DAYS OF LENT: GUIDED TO THE CROSS

*"He (Jesus) was in the wilderness forty days"* Mark 1:13

The forty-day season of Lent represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. We use this time in a similar fashion – engaging in spiritual reflection in quiet places, resisting the devil's ploys and getting our hearts ready to spread the news of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection for our salvation.

In our noisy, busy culture, we are often afraid to simply sit in silence. But Lent calls us to be quiet to pray to Jesus and listen for his voice telling us which way to go in our lives of faith. Jesus set aside forty days for quiet reflection in the wilderness, and he gives us the strength to do the same.

The devil "prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8). But we don't have to be afraid. We have the Word of God at our disposal to defend ourselves against the devil's lies, and we have the knowledge that Jesus never fell for any of the devil's temptations. Lent reminds us that Jesus has the power to not only resist but defeat the devil by dying on the cross as the sinless Son of God for our sake.

Lent is a period of preparation. We confess our sins to God. We read the Passion narratives of the Gospels to remember the hardship and the triumph of Christ's sacrifice in our place. We consider those things that we can do in response to Christ's great love for us. We can show compassion to our neighbor these days. We can preach the Gospel message of forgiveness and everlasting life in the crucified and risen Savior. Lent is a season that brings us close to the heartbeat of God, who gave his Son to save us.

**THREE TEMPTATIONS:** Jesus was in the wilderness forty days. During those forty days he faced three temptations from Satan. First, Jesus was tempted to turn a stone into bread. Then he was tempted to throw himself from the top of the Temple to be saved by angels. Finally, Jesus was tempted to bow down to the devil in order to rule over all the kingdoms of the world. The three temptations remind us not to put physical needs over spiritual ones, not to seek fame for ourselves and not to want power over others. The temptations also show us that Jesus never fell to Satan's temptations. He was sinless and perfect in every way so that he could make a perfect sacrifice on the cross for the times when you and I have fallen to those temptations.

Traditionally the **ACTIVITIES** associated with Lent are penance, fasting and almsgiving. Penance means saying we are sorry for the times we have gone against God. Fasting involves giving up something we crave so that we can crave more from God. Almsgiving is about setting aside a portion of personal wealth for the benefit of the poor among us.

Lent is also known for **PRAYER**. Here are some of the Biblical prayers that can be included in our time of prayer during these forty days: - "God, be merciful to me a sinner!" (Luke 18:13). - "Your will be done" (Matthew 26:42). - "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10).

Lent is a time for special **WORSHIP**. Under the general theme of "Guided to the Cross" our weekly themes for this season of Lent are as follows:

**ASH WEDNESDAY:** Guided to Forgiveness. **WEEK ONE:** Guided to Hope. **WEEK TWO:** Guided to Love. **WEEK THREE:** Guided to Peace. **WEEK FOUR:** Guided to Trust. **WEEK FIVE:** Guided to Perseverance. **PALM SUNDAY:** Guided to Humility. **MAUNDY THURSDAY:** Guided to Service. **GOOD FRIDAY:** Guided to Sacrifice. **EASTER:** Guided to New Life. (Please note that all mid-week and Holy Week services, except for Maundy Thursday, are held at noon and 7:00 p.m. Maundy Thursday worship is at 7:00 p.m. only).

Lent is a season when we are **GUIDED TO THE CROSS**. Throughout this holy time, we are drawn to Calvary to live in forgiveness, hope, love, peace, trust, perseverance, humility, service, all through the sacrifice of Jesus who leads us to new life. Each week, the services in our series will reveal how Christ and his cross serve as examples for us of how to live our lives for and through our crucified Lord and Savior. I look forward to worshiping with you again this Lent as together we are Guided to the Cross.

## I HAVE WRITTEN WHAT I HAVE WRITTEN...

Last week I had a great idea about what I could say in this space. Trust me, it would have been a terrific newsletter article... It would have been so good... I should have written it down.

All the most important things are “written down” things. And thank goodness! Can you imagine the world of your personal finances without receipts and visible account balances there on the page or screen? That world would be chaos. Every Sunday we use liturgies that have been written down to properly orient our worship. When we’re struggling to pray, written prayers can be a tremendous aid. Even for this upcoming Valentines Day, it is my experience that our loved ones truly like somehow seeing those words, “I love you,” written down. Of course, they know it’s true regardless. But to write it down means you took a little effort. It makes it personal. It means more. It’s somehow more secure.

In the Bible, we see this idea of things being “written down” fit into all three of the articles in the Apostles Creed: Creation, Redemption, Sanctification.

Creation: “Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in Your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there were none of them.” (Psalm 193:16) This reminds us that your life (and lifespan) is not an accident, nor are its details. You may be very surprised by what your days bring to you, but God is not. All things, whether past or future, are clear and present before God. And in them all, He looks on you, His creation, with love.

Redemption: The Apostle John says that his Gospel had been “written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name.” (John 20:31) Ultimately, all of Scripture has been written down so that you might know Jesus - know who He is and what He has done to save you. He loved you enough to face the cross in your place and ensure that His acts and teachings of love were written down – so that we might hear and believe.

Sanctification: Romans 15:4 and 1 Corinthians 10:11 both remind us that the accounts in Scripture are not just stories for our amusement; they were “written for our instruction.” Or said another way, Jesus loves you far too much to create you, save you, and then leave you purposeless. He has designed good works for you to walk in and given instruction for a life well lived. It’s been written down. Of course, you will have many ups and downs and bumps and bruises as you try to live out that life. But eventually, the Spirit will finish His good (but maybe painful) work in you. And then! On the other side of that, you will walk in Paradise. Where there is nothing evil or unlovely. Just the endless joy of life with your Creator and with all “those who are written in the Lamb’s book of life.” (Revelation 21:27) Take comfort in that truth. Live in that truth. Your name is before the very eyes of God. Written down.

## FEBRUARY MESSAGE

Greetings fellow brothers and sisters in Christ!

It's February now so that means that Lent is right around the corner. Lent is a time where we usually reflect on ourselves and remember our own sins, but more importantly, we remember Jesus, the Anointed one of Israel, who took those sins upon Himself and took them to the cross. Lent is certainly a darker season than that of Advent, yet it is all necessary. It was necessary that Jesus had to die that we might be adopted and grafted into God's chosen people. As we near Lent, I want you to meditate on these words from the prophet Isaiah who tells of the LORD's coming salvation.

Isaiah 53

1 Who has believed what he has heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? 2 For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. 3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. 4 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—everyone—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. 7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. 8 By oppression and judgement he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people? 9 And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. 10 Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. 11 Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. 12 Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

I encourage you to read through this chapter with me at least once a week as we move through the Lenten Season!

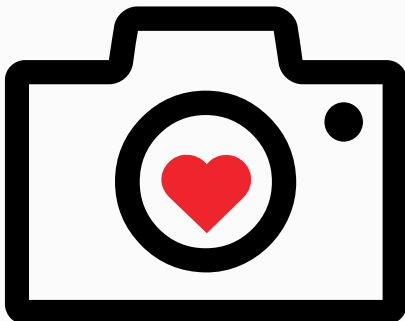


## SENIOR SHUFFLERS RAISE \$700+ FOR POSSABILITIES PLUS

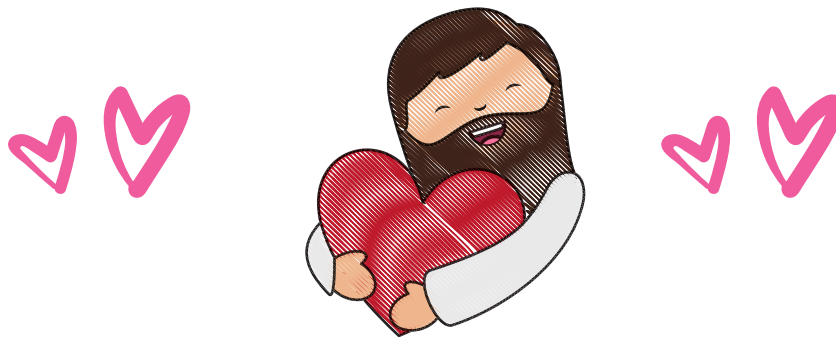

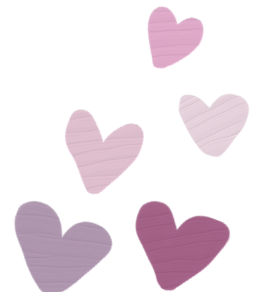
