

Alliance for Black NICU Families[™] Launches Breast Pump Grant Program

Non-Profit seeks to "reduce barriers" for Black NICU Moms

Springfield, VA. April 12, 2022 - the Alliance for Black NICU Families[™], in honor of Black Maternal Health Week, is officially launching its breast pump grant program for African American NICU Mothers.

The program, funded by local and national grants as well as corporate product donations, is the first equalizing grant by the Alliance for Black NICU Families.

"This is a game changer," notes Alliance Director Ashley Randolph, who is also the President of aligned organization, GLO Preemies. "African American mothers in the NICU and post-NICU deserve the opportunity to provide their baby with an exclusive human milk diet just like everyone else."

The Alliance for Black NICU Families[™] hopes to provide at least 30 pumps to African American NICU Moms across the United States. This will also include bereaved mothers who wish to pump and donate their milk or have the ability to pump and stop the milk in a less harsh manner.
