



#### Highland Dance Competition & Demonstration


ighland Dancing has been part of Scottish culture for centuries, evolving from traditional folk dances into its modern competition form. We're honoured to have had many provincial, national, and international champion dancers join us over the years. Encouraging new dancers to grow their confidence is important, so we offer a demonstration opportunity for those ages three and older who don't yet compete to perform.

Our judge this year is Cheryl Rafter of Vancouver, BC. Cheryl's first competition was at the age of four in Edmonton; since then she has competed and won regional, national, and international championships and taught dancers who've done the same. She's a Life Member of the SDTA and a member of the RSOBHD Judges' Panel since 1980. Cheryl has served as President of ScotDance Canada since 2017, and is one of the core committee members bringing SDCCS 2026 to Moncton in July 2026, the 50th anniversary of the Canadian Championships. We are thrilled to have her with us and to watch the continued growth of this cultural sport.

- · Primary, Beginner, and Novice Registration at 8am.
- Primary dancing starts at 8:30am; Primary dancers will complete their dances before Beginner and Novice start. Awards for Primary are presented immediately following the Beginner and Novice Fling.
- Beginner and Novice dancing starts immediately following Primary dances.

- $\cdot$  Intermediate and Premier registration starts at 12pm. Dancing will start at approximately 12:30 pm (after completion of the morning awards).

The Greater Moncton Scottish Association presents two perpetual trophies for dance. The Ferris Leanne Tweedie Memorial Trophy is presented to the top pre-Premier Dancer of the Day and The Wallace and Corena Tweedie Memorial Trophy to the top Premier Dancer of the Day.

The music of the Great Highland bagpipes dates to at least the 1400s in Scotland, with today's military pipe band roots found in the 19th century. The Greater Moncton Highland Games is pleased to host solo drum and bagpipe competitions, as well as pipe band competitions. There are opportunities for beginner to advanced competition, with categories from practice chanter and drum pad up to Grade One Piobaireachd.

The Greater Moncton Scottish Association awards the Merrill Henderson Trophy to the Pipe Band of the Day.

Don't miss the Games' closing ceremonies, including the Massed Bands performance, on the Parade Square at the conclusion of Saturday's competitions (approximately 5:30pm).





## THE HEAVY EVENTS

hese events are considered to be one of the oldest continuing athletic traditions in the world, second only to Japanese Sumo wrestling. Scottish heavy athletics date

back centuries in Scotland, derived from both everyday farm life and military training. The heavy events at any Highland Games generally include several throws and tosses of varying objects and weights

**STONES:** Two styles: The "Open Stone" (where competitors are allowed to move their feet), and the "Braemar Stone" where the competitor must throw from a standing

The weight is held in one hand as the athlete spins around. The weight will build tremendous energy leading up to its release.

**WEIGHTS FOR DISTANCE:** 

**HAMMERS:** The hammer is a lead ball attached to a handle. Starting out slow, building speed as they go, the competitor swings the hammer around their head releasing it "blind" over the shoulder. Watch for some unique "footwear" in this event.

#### **WEIGHT OVER BAR (WOB):**

The weight is swung with one hand between legs and then thrown up and over a bar landing just behind the athlete.


**CABER TOSS:** There is nothing more awe inspiring than to watch a person pick up a twenty-foot log, settle it into their hands, then run and flip it end for end. Cabers all vary in size, generally from 17 to 21 feet in length and weighing from 100-180lbs.

**SHEAF TOSS:** The athlete must "pitch" stuffed burlap bag up and over a horizontal bar using a pitchfork.

he Greater Moncton Scottish Association is thrilled to have been chosen to host the Canadian Scottish Athletic Federation 2025 Women's Championships - for Youth (ages 13-16), Juniors (ages 17-19), Women (ages 20-39),

Masters (ages 40-59), and Masters (ages 60+). Participation in these championships is based on invitations issued by the CSAF. These divisions will be competing throughout the day, alongside our annual competition.


